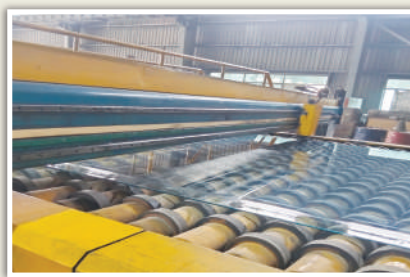

## Preface

The Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS), acting as the National Statistics Office (NSO), plays a crucial role in informing national economic, social, and environmental policies. The BBS is committed to the systematic collection, compilation, and dissemination of statistical data across various sectors. A key responsibility of the BBS includes the development and publication of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) and the Producer Price Index (PPI), both of which are released monthly under the designation Industrial Production Statistics (IPS). These indices have undergone revisions and re-basing, with 2015-16 designated as the reference base year. This reference period denotes a specific timeframe for which the index is standardized to a value of 100.

The Index of Industrial Production (IIP) serves as a crucial short-term indicator that reflects temporal variations in industrial production and the economy's overall performance. The IIP is defined by the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) of All Economic Activities, Rev. 4, which encompasses three primary sectors: i) Mining (including Gas), ii) Manufacturing, and iii) Electricity.

Conversely, the Producer Price Index (PPI) quantitatively assesses the proportional or percentage changes in the prices of domestically produced goods over time. The index should encompass an appropriate set of prices to be deemed applicable. Similar to the IIP, the ISIC Rev. 4 classification serves as the most relevant framework for the PPI, encompassing 24 major divisions and 143 classes at the four-digit level. Generally, goods are categorized within the PPI framework as consumer, capital, and intermediate goods based on their respective positions in the production chain.

This monthly publication aims to provide valuable indicators that reflect the country's short-term trends in industrial production and pricing. It is an essential resource for planners, policymakers, researchers, development partners and agencies, academics, and other stakeholders.

I sincerely appreciate the Director of the National Accounting Wing, BBS, along with the Joint Director, all Deputy Directors, and especially the Deputy Director of the Current Production Section and all the Officials of this Section for their steadfast dedication, exemplary efforts, and professionalism in preparing and executing this publication. I would like to note that such publications are not merely tools for information dissemination; they serve as pillars in national development endeavors and meet the demands of stakeholders. Moreover, it is imperative to recognize the invaluable contributions of officials from the field offices (Division/District/Upazila) of BBS and various departments, divisions, and ministries. # **Chapter 1**

## **Index of Industrial Production (IIP)**



**1.1 Introduction:** Index of Industrial Production (IIP) being a measure of short-term change in the value added, output measures have to be used as part of compilation of quarterly Gross Domestic Product (QGDP) and Annual Gross Domestic Product (AGDP). Measures of output (value of output, physical quantity of output) are preferred as variables to be used to approximate industrial production for IIP. It has a long history of collecting and publishing industrial Statistics and related information along with change in economic activity dated back to the base year 1969-70 (Source: Statistical Yearbook 1979). The subsequent indices were developed in mid -seventies and revised in 1973-74, 1981-82, 1988-89, 1995-96 and 2005-06. Very recently BBS has accomplished revision and rebasing of IIP to the base year 2015-16.

**1.2 International Recommendations and Guidelines used for the compilation of Index of Industrial Production (IIP):** The United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) has issued the following two related publications which address the international standard recommendations and guidelines which are followed for the compilation of Index of Industrial Production (IIP).

- i. The International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC) Rev.4 is used to define industries for international comparability. Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics has prepared industry classifications at detailed levels entitled Bangladesh Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (BSIC) which is designed with the ISIC and adapted this system of classification as national standard.
- ii. The International Recommendation for the Index of Industrial Production 2010 is used for the related fundamental concepts, definitions, principles, methods in great detail to obtain industrial production volume, sources of data, compilation procedure and additional compilations issues as like revision and shifting of base year.

### **1.3 Concept and Definitions:**

- i. **Industrial Production:** The System of National Accounts describes production as an activity carried out under the responsibility, control and management of an institutional unit that uses inputs of labor, capital and goods and services to generate output of goods and services.  
(Source: UNSD Manual)
- ii. **Manufacturing:** It is the physical or chemical transformation of materials, substances or components into new products.
- iii. **Gross Value Added (GVA):** Gross Value Added is the value of output less the value of intermediate consumption (materials and purchases services).
- iv. **Index of Industrial Production (IIP):** IIP describes the change of the volume of goods and services produced over time. Its main purposes are to provide a measure of the short-term changes in the value added over a given reference period It is not influenced by price fluctuation (Source: UNSD Manual)

## 1.4 Methodology

- i. **Base Year:** The production of goods produced in the economy is changed in positive or negative over time. It is urgent to change the base year for IIP to reflect the changing structure of the economic activities. BBS has accomplished the task of shifting the base year from 2005-06 to 2015-16. IIP is compiled on monthly basis.
- ii. **Classification:** In the revised IIP the index has been compiled for three categories considering the total person engaged in the establishment.
  - 1. IIP-Large Industries (TPE: 250 and above)
  - 2. IIP-Small, Medium and Micro Enterprise -SMME (TPE: 10-249)
  - 3. IIP-Cottage Industries (TPE: 1-9)
- iii. **Derivation of Weight:).** Gross Value Added (GVA) is preferred as the weight variable to compile IIP for the class level of ISIC Structure. The weight for IIP-Large scale and IIP-SMMI is determined at 4-digit level class on the basis of GVA using updated survey of Manufacturing Industries (SMI) 2019 and the weight for IIP-Cottage is derived from Cottage industry survey 2011.

$$\text{Weight (contribution of a group)} = \frac{\text{Value Added of the group}}{\text{Total Value Added of All group}} \times 100$$

- iv. **Updating Sample Frame:** A business register is an essential tool for the source of sampling frame. But the establishment may merge; split up, or go out of business, change production activities, move location, birth of new establishment and death of existing establishment. So, it should be updated to coincide with the current information as representative as possible. In this respect the existing Business Register has been updated through the field office to develop the sampling frame of IIP.
- v. **Selection of Sample:** At the first stage all manufacturing units are stratified into 3 categories. At the second stage each of the three categories is stratified at 4-digit level class of ISIC, Rev-4. Then the sample for IIP-Large scale and IIP-SMME is selected using two stages stratified random Sampling method from business Register 2018 and the sample for IIP-Cottage scale from Economic Census 2013.

### Sample Size for each category

- 1. IIP- Large Industries: 526
- 2. IIP- Small, Medium and Micro Enterprise: 650
- 3. IIP- Cottage Industries: 731

- vi. **Aggregation:** The index of industrial production covers 1) Mining and Quarrying, 2) Manufacturing 3) Electricity, Gas, Steam and Air Conditioning supply outlined in the ISIC Rev.4. Manufacturing is further disaggregated by 74 classes at 4-digit level.
- vii. **Data Collection:** Prior to data collection, in-depth training was imparted for data collectors and supervisors of the field level and head quarter of BBS. There were about 200 data collectors and 93 supervisors from 64 District Statistical Offices, 8 Divisional Statistical Offices and Head Quarter of BBS. The district wise data collection team was formed with about 2-10 persons depending on the number of establishments of each district.
- viii. **Data Entry, Processing and Validation:** After completing data collection, the filled-in-questionnaires were sent to the BBS Headquarter. Then the transferred data were promptly examined, verified for calculation of Index.
- ix. **Index Calculation:** It is a weighted average of the relative changes in the quantities of a specified set of goods and services produced between two periods of time. The weights of some fixed base period are used for the Laspeyre's index and it can be expressed as:

Where,

IIP = Index of Industrial Production

$q_{ti}$  = Quantity of  $i^{th}$  Commodity Produced in the Current Year

$q_{oi}$  = Quantity of  $i^{th}$  Commodity Produced in the Base Year

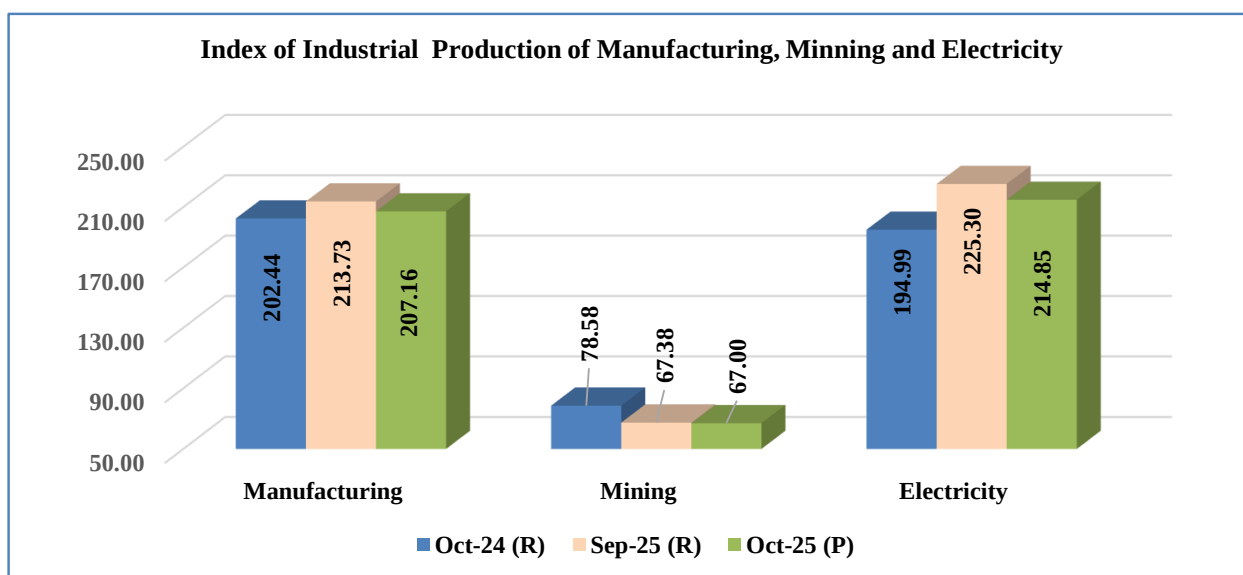
$w_{oi}$  = Weight of  $i^{th}$  Commodity in the Base Year

$n$  = Number of  $i^{th}$  Commodity included in the index

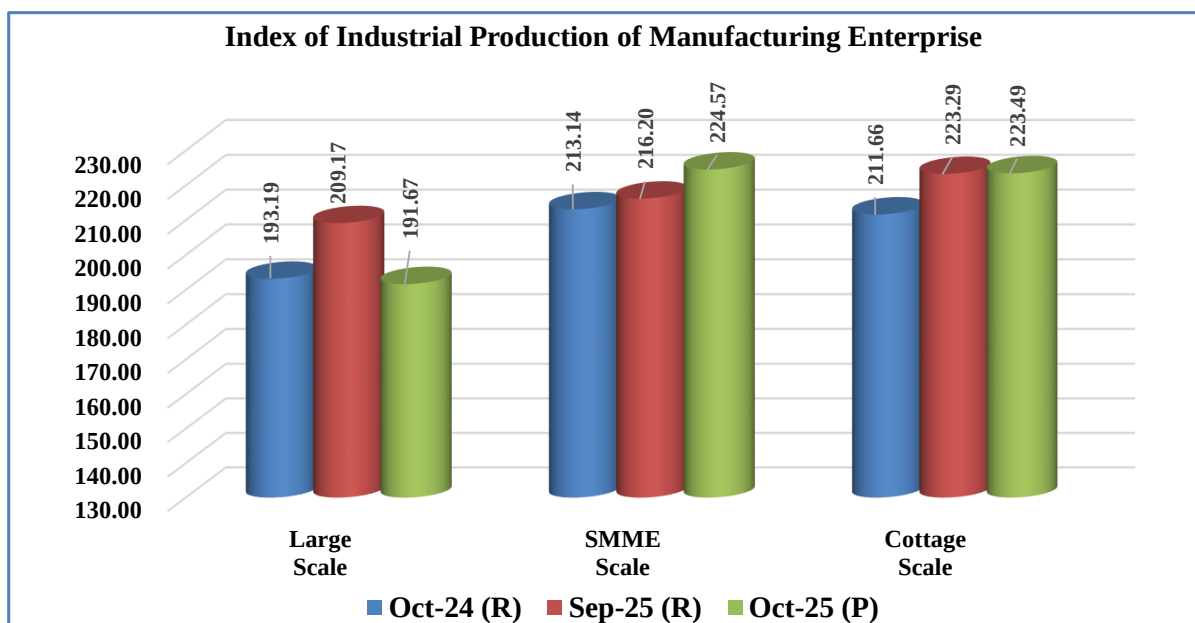

## **Chapter 2**

### **Producer Price Index (PPI)**



**2.1 Introduction:** Producer Price Index (PPI) is a short-term indicator in most country. It is used for a variety of different purposes such as inflationary trends, deflators, wage adjustment, contract escalation, economic monitoring and comparison. There is a general public interest in knowing the extent to which the prices of goods and services has risen. PPI is usually compiled monthly. Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) has been producing and publishing PPI since 1980 on regular basis with 1973-74 as base year. The subsequent indices were developed in mid -seventies and revised in 1973- 74, 1981-82, 1988-89, 1995-96 and 2005-06. Very recently BBS has accomplished revision and rebasing of IIP to the base year 2015-16. The index covered of 75 Classes contained in Industrial Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) rev.4. it is mainly a deflator to be used to achieved volume estimates from Value data.

**2.2 International Recommendations and Guidelines used for the compilation Producer Price Index (PPI):** The following two related publications issued by United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) and International Monetary Fund (IMF) which address the international standard recommendations and guidelines which are followed for the compilation of Producer Price Index (PPI).

- i. The International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC) Rev.4 is used to define industries for international comparability. Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics has prepared industry classifications at detailed levels entitled Bangladesh Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (BSIC) which is designed with the ISIC and adapted this system of classification as national standard.
- ii. The International Recommendation for Producer Price Index Manual 2004 is used for the related fundamental concepts, definitions, principles, methods in great detail to obtain industrial Product Price, sources of data, compilation procedure and additional compilations issues as like revision and shifting of base year.

**2.3 Concept and Definitions:**

- i. **Price Index:** A price index is a measure of the proportionate or percentage changes in a set of prices over time. *(Source: IMF Producer Price Index Manual)*
- ii. **Price Relative:** The ratio of the price of an individual product in one period of the price of that same product in some other period. *(Source: IMF Producer Price Index Manual)*
- iii. **Gross Value Added (GVA):** Gross Value Added is the value of output less the value of intermediate consumption (materials and purchases services). *(Source: IMF Producer Price Index Manual)*
- iv. **Producer Price:** The producer price is the amount receivable by the producer from the purchaser for a unit of a good or service produced as output minus ant VAT or similar deductible tax invoiced to the purchaser. It excludes any

transport charge invoiced separately by the producer. *(Source: IMF Producer Price Index Manual)*

*Producer Price = Basic price + Taxes on products excluding invoiced VAT - subsidies on products*  
*(Source: SNA)*

- v. **Producer Price Index (PPI):** A measure of the change in the prices of goods and services either as they leave their place of production. The pricing point is generally where the product leaves its place of production—farm gate or factory gate price. PPIs is to have the best measure of the *current rate* of factory gate inflation. It measures the change in the prices of domestic producer goods and services. *(Source: IMF Producer Price Index Manual)*

## 2.4 Methodology:

- i. **Base Year:** Rebasing may mean
- Changing the weights in an index,
  - Changing the price reference period of an index number series, or
  - Changing the index reference period of an index number series

The price of goods produced in the economy is changed in positive or negative over time. It is urgent to change the base year for PPI to reflect the changing structure of the economic activities. BBS has done this gigantic work as like shifting the base year from 2005-06 to 2015-16. PPI is compiled on monthly basis.

- ii. **Classification:** Industrial classifications group producer units according to their major kind of activity, based mainly on the principal class of goods or services produced at the most detailed four-digit International Standard Industrial Code (ISIC) industry level, categories.
- iii. **Derivation of Weight:** The weight for Producer price Index is determined at 4- digit level class on the basis of GVA using survey of Manufacturing Industries (SMI) 2019 and Cottage Industry Survey 2011.

$$\text{Weight (ontribution of a group)} = \frac{\text{Value Added of the group}}{\text{Total Value Added of All group}} \times 100$$

- iv. **Updating Sample Frame:** A business register Economic Census is an essential tool for the source of sampling frame. But the establishment may merge; split up, or go out of business, change production activities, move location, birth of new establishment and death of existing establishment. So, it should be updated to coincide with the current information as representative as possible. In this respect the existing Business Register and Economic Census have been updated through the field office to develop the sampling frame of IIP.

- v. **Selection of Sample:** At the first stage all manufacturing unit is stratified into 3 categories. At the second stage each of the three categories is stratified at 4- digit level class of ISIC, Rev-4. Then the sample for large industries, SMME is selected using two stages stratified random Sampling method from business Register 2018 and the sample for Cottage industries from Economic Census 2013.
- vi. **Aggregation:** Producer Price Index (PPI) covers only domestically produced manufacturing goods included 143 classes outlined in the ISIC Rev. 4. Consumer goods, capital goods and intermediate goods are included in manufacturing. Capital goods is further disaggregated by 4 (Four) categories such as machinery other than electric and transport, Machinery electric, transport equipment and other capital goods.
- vii. **Data Collection:** Prior to data collection, in-depth training was imparted for data collectors and supervisors of the field level and head quarter of BBS. There were about 200 data collectors and 93 supervisors from 64 District Statistical Offices, 8 Divisional Statistical Offices and Head Quarter of BBS. The district wise data collection team was formed about 2-10 persons depending on the number of establishments of each district along with Index of Industrial Production (IIP).
- viii. **Data Entry, Processing and Validation:** After the completing data collection, the filled-in- questionnaires were sent to the BBS Headquarter. Then the transfer data were promptly examined, verified and calculation of Index.
- ix. **Index Calculation:** It is a weighted average of the relative changes in the quantities of a specified set of goods and services between two periods of time. The weights of some fixed base period are used for the Laspeyres's index and it can be expressed as:

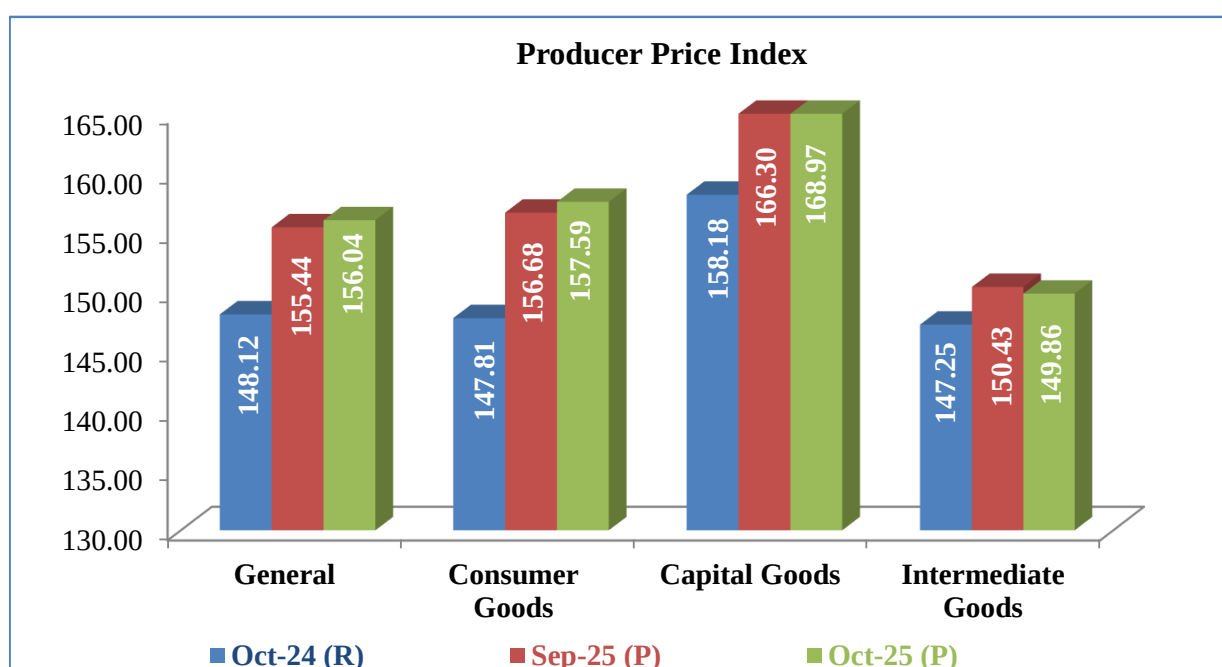
