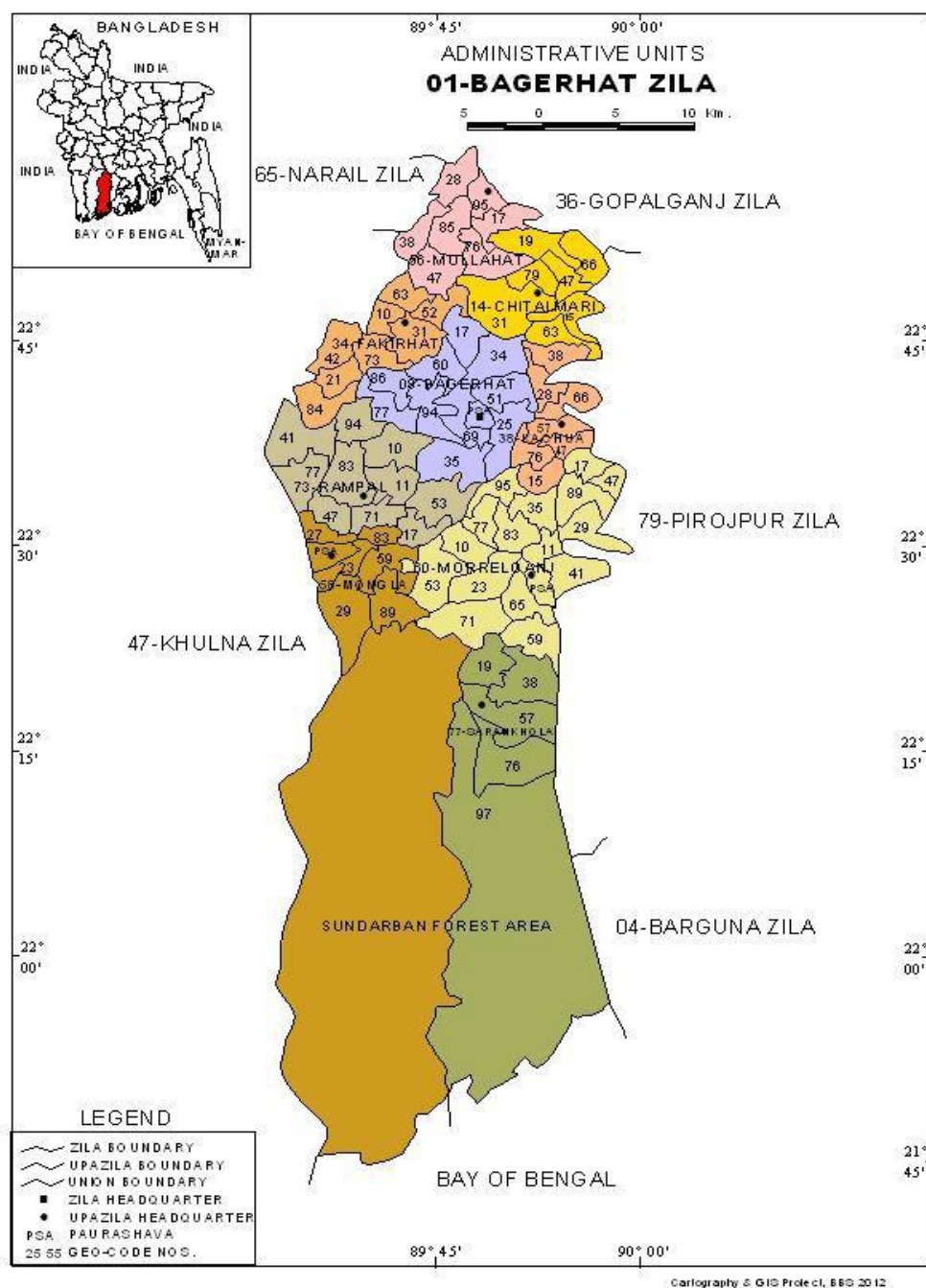

CHAPTER 1

Introduction

District at a Glance

Background: Bagerhat, the sanctuary of Hazrat Khan Jahan Ali, was formerly a part of Khilafatabad Pargana. It is situated at the fringe of the Bay of Bengal with the plentiful boundaries of Sundarbans. It became a Police Station under Khulna sub-division of Jessore zila in 1842. Bagerhat was raised into a sub-division under the same zila in 1863 with the recommendation of the then Deputy Magistrate poet Bankim Chandra Chattapadhyaya. Bagerhat sub-division was transferred to Khulna zila in 1882 and was upgraded to a separate district in February 23, 1984.

Geographic Area and Location: Bagerhat is surrounded on the north by the Gopalganj district, on the east by the Pirojpur and Barguna districts, on the south by the Bay of Bengal and on the west by Khulna district. It lies between 21°49' and 22°59' north latitudes and between 89°32' and 89°98' east longitudes. The total area of the district is 3959.06 sq. km. of which 600.04 sq. km. is under reserve forest.

Temperature and Rainfall: Annual average temperature varies from maximum 24.2°C to minimum 12.0°C and annual average rainfall is 1947 mm.

Main Rivers: Panguchi, Daratana, Madhumati, Pasur, Haringhata, Mongla, Baleswar, Bangra and Goshairkhali are notable rivers of Bagerhat district.

Administration: Bagerhat sub-division was turned into a district in 1984. The district consists of 9 upazilas, 75 unions, 723 mauzas, 1031 villages, 3 paurashavas, 27 wards and 56 mahallas. The upazilas are Bagerhat Sadar, Chitalmari, Fakirhat, Kachua, Mollahat, Mongla, Morrelganj, Rampal and Sarankhola. Bagerhat municipality was established in 1958. It has an area of 7.50 sq. km.

Archaeological Heritage and Relics: Among the archaeological heritage and relics, Shatgumbad Mosque, Nine-dome Mosque, Sona Mosque, Khan Jahan's tomb Complex, Seven-domed Mosque, Ten-domed Mosque, One-domed Mosque, Pacha Dighee, Ghora Dighee, Kodla Math or Ayudha Math, Kuthibari, Durgapur Shiva Math, Shiva Temple are notable.

Historical Events: The name of Khan Jahan Ali is closely related to the history of Bagerhat. He migrated here in 1429 with a large number of soldiers. He established the Khalifabad Pargana covering areas including Bagerhat, Khulna, Satkhira, Jessore and Barisal districts. He ruled this pargana during the period from 1429 to 1449. After the death of Khan Jahan Ali in 1449, Raja Prajapaditya occupied the pargana. During the war of liberation in 1971, the Pak army entered into Bagerhat through the land way via Domerpool. They killed about 200 innocent people at Khalishakhali and Babuganj. Many people were killed and wounded in several encounters between the Pak army and the Freedom Fighters at Doyapara, Shakhariharihat, and at Chakulia of Mollahat. 35 persons were also killed in an encounter between the Freedom Fighters and the Razakars in Morrelganj.

Marks of War of Liberation: There are 9 mass graves, 8 memorial monuments, 4 mass killing sites in this district.

Religious Institutions: The numbers of Mosque 2775, Eid Gah 375, Temple 711 and Church 23 in this district.

Educational Institutions: The total numbers of educational institutions are Government college 2, Non-government college 38, Government high school 5, Non-government high school 287, Junior school 33, Mentally retarded school 1, Government primary school 603, Registered primary school 511, Madrasa 352, Satellite school 14 and Community school 9.

Locally Published Newspapers and Periodicals: The dailies are Dhakhin Kantha, Uttayal, Dut, Morrelganj Barta and Sundarbans. The weeklies are Mongla, Bananchal, Projanma (defunct), Royal Bengal (defunct) and Mazlum (periodical).

Cultural Organizations: The numbers of Public library 16, Rural club 255, Museum 1, Cinema hall 6, Theatre group 3, literary organisation 14, Women's organisation 65 and Playground 37 in this district.

Main Crops: Paddy, wheat, jute, sugar cane, potato, banana, onion, garlic etc. are main crops of this district.

Main Fruits: Sabeda, mango, jackfruit, banana, papaya etc. are main fruits of this district.

Traditional Transport: Horse carriage, bullock cart and boat are traditional transports found in this district.

Hats, Bazars and Fairs: Total numbers of hats and bazars are 188 and fairs 29.

Main Export Items: Fish (Shrimp), paddy, coconut, betel nut, betel leaf, honey are main export items in this district.

NGO Activities: Operationally important NGOs are BRAC, Proshika, ASA, Grameen Bank, Shaplaful, Dak Dia Jai, CRC, CSS and Rupantar.

Economic Situation

The economy of Bagerhat is predominantly agricultural. Its economy is also dependent on the Sundarbans and Mongla port. According to the Agriculture Census 2008, the total holdings of the district are 339 thousand of which 68.57% of holdings are farms that produce varieties of crops, namely local and HYV paddy, wheat, jute, vegetables, spices, pulses, oilseeds, sugarcane and others. Various fruits like mango, banana, Jackfruit guava, coconut and betel nut etc. are grown. Fish of different varieties abound in the district. Varieties of fishes caught from rivers, tributary, channels and creeks and even from paddy field during rainy seasons. Besides crops, livestock and fishery are main source of household income.

The status of Non-agricultural activities is also significant in the district. The following table 1: shows broad types of non-farm economic activities and number of establishments along with persons engaged in those establishments are given below:

Flora and Fauna

Bagerhat district lies on the south western part of the country and falls under the Gangetic plain with fertile land is very rich in respect of flora and fauna. More than one third of the district southern part is covered by thick forest of mangroves, canes creepers and other trees thriving on muddy saline trees which is the most valuable and beautiful of all the trees in the forest. The district faces flood during the monsoon almost regularly. Its impact is however very much felt in the flora and fauna of the district.

Flora: The eastern boundary of the forest in the district extends upto the boundary line of Bagerhat district while the western one extends beyond the western boundary line of the district. The southern boundary of the forest is the Bay of Bengal and the northern boundary is the Sundarbans. The most important of the forest trees is the sundari (*Heritiera minor*). The colour of this wood is reddish which is very soothing to the eye. Because of its durability it has a great demand. It can tolerate saline water but attains full height on the bank of sweet water rivers like ‘Sela’ and ‘Passur (*Xylocarpus malucensis*)’ and are available in large quantity. Its timber is very durable and has great demand for posts and planks. The amur (*Amoor cucullata*) and dhundhul (*Xylocarpus granatum*) have a similarity with “pasur” but they are of inferior quality and as used sometimes for making house posts. small amoor trees are used for making “hookka” (*Local smoking pipes*) stems .One of the largest of the sundarban trees is “ bain(*Avicennia officinalis*) tree. Generally it attains 60 feet in height with large girth. The wood used for planking and as fuel. The flowers of the tree

are small yellow and sweet smelling and afford a distinctive quality of honey. Other important trees are garjan (*Dipterocarpus turbinatus*), goran (*Ceriops roxburghiana*) and kankra (*Brogucra gyomosniza*). There is a great possibility of utilizing them for tanning purposes. Of them only kankara attains sufficient size and has some value as timber. The gewa (*Excecaria agallocha*) tree thrives in the most saline areas near the sea. Its wood is white hard and produces good timber. It is very much suitable for making match sticks and boxes and paper pulp. The most striking tree is keora (*Sonneratia apetala*). Deer are specially fond of its leaves and fruits. They flock under its branches to eat its fruits and browse its leaves off as high as they can reach producing a uniform adrupt line along the grove where the foliage has been bitten off. The Singra tree supplies best fire wood. The karanj (*Pongamia glabra*) tree is large in size grows on high river banks.

The hental (*Rhoenix paludosa*) and the golpatta (*Nipa fruticans*) are found in muddy areas everywhere. The hental (*Rhoenix paludosa*) resembles a dwarf date-palm (*Phoenix sylvestris*) and rafters are made from it. The golpatta is regarded as one of the most important products and its leaves are used for thatching houses.

Except for the sundarbans the flora of the district is similar to those in the adjoining districts. Innumerable indigenons weeds grow in the beel area. Several types of palms and bamboo clumps grow almost all the villages. Mango and Jack fruits supply the commonest timber and are used for making doors, windows, boxes, etc.

Fauna

Mammals: Bagerhat district has a rich diversity of land invertebrate mamals, amphibians, birds, reptiles and fresh water animals, spider, multipedes and innumerable insects. Leeches, earth worm slugs, snails, silk moths and silk worm are commonly found in the district.

The Sundarban is rich in wild animals. The Royal Bengal Tiger (*Panthera tigris*) is famous for its large size, strength and colourful stripped body is the lord of the Sundarbans. The most important of other fauna of the forest is spotted or chitra deer. Flocks of deer are found in moonlit night grazing eating keora fruit dropped by monkeys. Monkeys literally rule over the trees. Several kinds of serpents including poisonous cobra, karait, rajshap and non-poisonous python, dhora, grass snake are seen everywhere creeping in the grass and from tree to tree and place to place. It is said that there were plenty of rhinoceros in the Sundarbans but now they are hardly seen. Animals which are common all over the district are jackal, wild hog, porcupine civet cat, wild cat, tree cat, etc.

Carnivorous animals include fox (*Vulpes bengalensis*), dog, boar (*Sus scrofa*), pig, etc. domestic cow (*Bos pourus*), goat (*Catra lircus*), sheep, buffalo (*Bubalus bubalis*) and horses are quite common in the district. Bats (*Rousettus leschenaulti*), shrews, squirrels, rats (*Bandicota bengalensis*), mice, cats and wild cats (*Felis chaus*) are also found in the district.

Birds: The district affords a very lucrative place to game birds hunters. At the advent of winter season snipes, ducks, and geese begin to flock on beel and char areas. Other common birds are crow (*Corvus splendens*), vulture (*Gyps bengalensis*), sparrow (*Passer domesticus*), cuckoo

(*Cuculus micropterus*), king fisher (*Alcedo atthis*), bulbuli (*Picnonotus cafer*), parrot (*Psittacula krameri*), tailorbird and lark.

Many kinds of colourful and singing birds are seen in the district. These include the national bird robin magpie (*Copsychus saularis*), kokil of cuckoo (*Cuculus micropterus*) halde pakhi (*Oriolus xanthornus*), kingcrow (*Alcedo atthis*), mayna (*Sturnus malabarica*), shalik (*Acridotheres tris*), shama (*Copsychus malabaricus*), sparrow (*Passer domesticus*), several species of pheasants, quails, pigeons (*Columba livia*) and doves (*Streptopelia suratensis*), duck, geese, balihash (*Anas crecca*), cocks and hens, kingfisher (*Alcedo atthis*), lark, swallow, crow (*Corvus splendens*), crane, pelicans, woodpecker (*Picus myrmecophonus*) and many other varieties of small birds. Raptorial birds including king vulture (*Trogon calvus*), lanner falcon or baj (*Falco biarmicus*), gochila (*Circus aeruginosus*), Cheel (*Milvus migrans*), several species of stork. Some migratory birds like greenleg goshawk (*Anser anser*), rajhans (*Anser indicus*), pitail (*Anas acuta*), etc. are also seen during winter season.

Fish: With large water area the district is well stocked with fish. Some of the commonly available fishes are ruhi or salmon (*Labeo rohita*), mrigel (*Cirrhinus mrigala*), kala boush (*Labeo calbasu*), katla or carp (*Catla catla*), etc. shing (*Heteropneustes fossilis*) and magur or cat fish (*Clarias batrachus*) are also found in large quantity in beels and khals. Many other species of river and fresh water fishes are also found in the district. Of these the principal varieties are koral/vetki or sea bass (*Lates calcarifer*), tapashi (*Polynemus paradiseus*), dhain, chital (*Notopterus chitala*), ghona, airh (*Mystus aor*), bagar (*Bagarius bagarius*), pangas (*Pangasius pangasius*), boal or sheat fish (*Wallago attu*), rita (*Mystus aor*), bain or eel (*Mastacembelus armatus*) chapila (*Gudusia chapra*), bhagna (*Labeo boga*), nandail (*Labeo nandina*) bacha (*Eutropichthys vacha*), poa (*Poma poma*), golsa (*Mystus bleekeri*), tengra (*Mystus vittatus*), chanda (*Mene mukulata*), rupchanda (*Pomphos chinensis*), kachki, bele (*Glossogobius giuris*), bheda, batashai, ghausa, kakila, foli (*Notopterus notopterus*), tatkeni (*Crosscheilus latius*), pabda or butter fish (*Ompok pabda*), chela (*Chela cachius*), gangchela, gazar fish (*Channa marulius*), koi (*Anabas testudineus*), kholisha (*Calisa fasciata*), puti (*Barbus punti*), malandi, banshpata (*Danio devario*), tengra (*Mystus vittatus*), kakra (*Scylla serrata*), shrimps and prawn are found in the district. However, some of these varieties, specially those which inhabit in marshes and tank, are dwindling due to over catching and other reasons such as use of insecticides and pesticides for crop production, etc.

Exotic fishes like grass carp (*Cteopharyngodon idella*), silver carp (*Hypophthalmichthys molitrix*), tilapia (*Oreochromis mossambicus*), nilotica (*Oreochromis niloticus*), etc. have been introduced for commercial pisciculture in ponds and tanks. Bagerhat district is renowned for its shrimp culture in gher.

Reptiles and amphibians: Crocodiles and sharks swarm in the river beds, butterflies, moth, bees and wasps fly from flowers to flowers especially in the spring together honey. The reptiles include different species of snakes, lizard (*Hemidactylus prooki*) and tortoise (*Kachuga tecta*). Guinshap (*Varanus salvator*), python (*Python molurus*), cobra (*Naja naja*) and other varieties of poisonous snakes are found almost all over the district. There are also amphibians like toad, frogs and tree frogs.

Concepts and Definitions

1. Population and Housing Census 2011

The population and housing census is the unique source of reliable and comprehensive data about the size of the population of the country, major socio-economic and socio-demographic characteristics.

It is the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing or otherwise disseminating demographic, economic and social data pertaining, at a specified time, to all persons in a country. The essential features of a population census are individual enumeration, universality within a defined territory, simultaneity and defined periodicity.

The population and housing census provides information on the geographic and administrative distribution of the population and household in addition to the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of all the people in the country. The data from the census are classified, tabulated and disseminated so that political leaders, election officials, planners, national organizations including NGOs and civil society, regional and international organizations can use the data in decision-making.

The purpose of community report is to disseminate census data by communities (ward/mahalla in urban area and union/mauza/village in rural area). Data on all key variables namely area, household, population by sex and age group, ethnic population, literacy rate, marital status, school attendance, employment status and religion as well as physical facilities such as source of drinking water, sanitation, electricity and dwelling units have been presented in this report. The planners, researchers and policy makers as well as development partners and community administrators will find this report as a valuable reference for use in advising plans and programs for advancing welfare and well-being of the common people, in particular and the community in general.

Household

Persons, either related or unrelated, living together and taking food from the same kitchen constitute a household. A single person living and eating alone forms one-person household.

Literacy

It denotes ability to write a letter in any language. Literacy status assessment is made for population 7 years and over.

Community

It refers to the following five lower geographic, administrative or revenue units:

- i) **Union:** Smallest administrative rural geographic unit comprising of mauzas and villages and having union parishad institution.
- ii) **Mauza:** Mauza is the lowest administrative unit having a separate jurisdiction list number (J.L. No.) in revenue records. Every mauza has its well-demarcated cadastral map. Mauza should be distinguished from local village since a mauza may consist of one or more villages.

- iii) **Village:** Lowest rural geographic unit either equivalent to a mauza or part of a mauza.
- iv) **Ward:** Smallest administrative urban geographic unit comprising of mahallas and having ward council institution.
- v) **Mahalla:** Lowest urban geographic unit having identifiable boundaries.

Urban Area

It corresponds with area developed around a central place having such amenities as metalled roads, improved communication, electricity, gas, water supply, sewerage, sanitation and also having comparatively higher density of population with majority population in non-agricultural occupations.

i) **City Corporation:** It includes city corporation area declared by the Ministry of Local Government.

ii) **Paurashava/Municipality Area:** It includes paurashavas incorporated and administered by local government under Paurashava Ordinance, 1977.

2. Agriculture Census year and reference period

The census year extends over twelve consecutive months having for different census items the different reference periods or days of data collections. Some items have a year or week reference period. Some others have a specific reference day.

The census year covered twelve months from 1 Baishak to 30 Choitra, 1414 Bangla Shal (BS). The year was the reference period for such census items as operated land use, crops, agriculture employment, livestock & poultry deaths and agriculture loan. A single reference day was used for items like holdings, farm size, land tenure, farm population, livestock & poultry inventories and agriculture implements.

The different census items by their reference periods or days are shown below:

Agriculture holding

An agriculture holding is a techno-economic unit of agricultural production under single management comprising all livestock kept and all land used wholly or partly for agricultural production purposes without regard to title, legal form or size. Single management may be exercised by either an individual holder or jointly by two or more individuals or holders or by a judicial person such as a corporation, co-operative or government agency. A holding may consist of one or more parcels (fragments of land) located in one or more areas or mauzas or in more than one administrative unit or division provided that all separate parcels of fragments form parts of same technical unit under operational control of same management.

The definition covers practically all holdings/households engaged in agricultural production of both crops and livestock. Some agriculture holdings may have no significant agricultural land, e.g. holdings keeping livestock, poultry and hatcheries for which land is not an indispensable input for production.

Farm holding

A farm holding is defined as being an agricultural production unit having cultivated land equal to or more than 0.05 acres. Farm holdings are classified into following three broad groups:

- (a) **small:** Farm holdings having minimum cultivated land 0.05 acre but operated land more than this minimum but upto 2.49 acres.
- (b) **medium:** Farm holdings having operated land in between 2.50 to 7.49 acres.
- (c) **large:** Farm holdings having operated land 7.50 acres and above.

Small cultivated land 0.04 acre or less is generally used for kitchen garden growing mainly vegetables. Often seeds of white gourd, water gourd, pumpkin and other strains are sown on households; but these creepers spread out around house roofs and other structures. As such, the minimum cultivated land considered for qualifying to be a farm holding is 0.05 acres.

Non-farm holdings

A non-farm holding is defined as being the one which has neither cultivated nor operated land or has cultivated land less than 0.05 acre.

Tenancy

Owner holdings are those having and operating their owned land and who may or may not be leasing out land.

Tenant holdings are those having no owned land but operating land taken from others on share cropping basis or on other terms.

Owner-cum-tenant holdings are those having owned land and who may or may not be leasing out their own land to others and who may be taking land from others on share cropping basis or on other terms.

Agriculture work

Agriculture work signifies all activities of holder and his/her labour force doing planning, management, and operation of a holding. It includes land preparation, sowing, weeding, harvesting, feeding and tending livestock & poultry, kitchen gardening, supervising agricultural workers, keeping farm records & accounts, preparing agriculture products for marketing (including packaging), repairing farm equipment, constructing farm buildings & fences, and engaging in land reclamation and improvement and other related activities. It excludes home and other family domestic chores.

Area under pond

The pond area remains under water almost through out the year. Normally, households use pond water for various domestic and sometimes agriculture purposes. Ponds are also generally used for fish culture.

In the census the pond area data were collected separately for both single ownership and joint ownership of households.

Area under temporary crops

It is the land area planted to crops having growing cycle or length of life less than one year. These are the temporary crops such as paddy, wheat, jute, cotton, tobacco, sugarcane, pulses, oil seeds, potato, vegetables and other seasonal crops. A list of temporary crops for which data were collected separately was given in back page of “Tally Sheet”. The minimum area recorded for a temporary crop was 0.01 acre. Area under temporary crops and temporary-crops net area are equivalents.

Area under permanent crops

It is the land area planted to crops which remain standing for a long period of time and do not need to be replanted after a seasonal harvest. Mango, jackfruit, coconut, guava, lemon, and other fruit varieties are all permanent crops.

Current fallow

It is land brought into cultivation but left out uncultivated in census year for fertility regaining and improvement or for other reasons.

Net cultivated area

This is land area actually cropped during the census year regardless of number of crops grown plus current fallow. It includes areas under temporary and permanent crops and also current fallow.

Permanent fallow

It is land not available for cultivation due to coming into residence and commercial & other uses. Play ground, graveyard, wild shrubs and jungles, marshy land, and the like fall in this category.

Irrigated area

This is area of total land brought under irrigation coverage for growing crops with irrigations done through mechanical or manual means. Irrigated area classifications fall into two categories: (1) surface water irrigation with main water sources being rivers, canals, beels, ponds, and other water bodies; and (2) underground water irrigation with water lifted by shallow tube-wells, deep tube-wells, and country traditional devices. The irrigation equipments are run by electricity, diesel or petrol, or manual labour.

Cattle and Buffalo

Cattle and buffalo heads owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Goats and Sheep

Goats and sheep owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Fowls, Ducks and Pigeons

Fowls, ducks and pigeons owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Temporary crops gross area

Areas aggregated for all temporary crops grown in the census year have made **temporary crops gross area** greater than **temporary crops net area** since the latter has within it the same land cropped more than once in different seasons of a year.

Intensity of cropping

It is percentage of temporary crops gross area in comparison with temporary crops net area. It is expressed as follows:

$$\text{Intensity of cropping} = \frac{\text{Temporary crops gross area}}{\text{Temporary crops net area}} \times 100$$

Cereals

Main cereals are rice and then wheat. Other cereals are jab, barley, cheena, maize, kaun, bajra and joar.

Pulses

Main and common pulses are gram, mung, lentil, arhar, gari kalai, khesari and pea.

Oil seeds

Main oil seeds are rape and mustard, sesamum, linseed, groundnut, soybean, sunflower and castor.

Vegetables

Farmers grow both summer and winter vegetables. Main vegetables are potato, brinjal, raddish, arum, lady's finger, cauliflower, cabbage, bean, tomato, patal, gourd, cucumber, pumpkin, knoll-kal-turnip, dhundal, barbati, khirai, chichinga, carrot, kakrol and sak.

Cash crop

Main cash crops are jute, mesta, sunhemp, cotton, sugarcane and tobacco.

Spices

The main spices include turmeric, ginger, chillies, onion, garlic, corriander, black cumin and ani seed.

Fuel crops

Dhaincha and other smaller plants used as cooking-fuel are included in the group.
