

# Bangladesh: On the Move to Better Health


Baseline Measurements for the Health, Population and Nutrition Sector Development Program (HPNSDP)  
Bangladesh Demographic and Health Survey (BDHS) 2011 • April 17, 2012

The 2011 BDHS collected data from almost 18,000 households. Interviews were conducted with over 17,800 ever-married women age 12-49 and almost 4,000 ever-married men age 15-54.


### Trends in Fertility

(Births per woman)




### Trends in Use of Contraception

Percentage of married women age 15-49 currently using a method of family planning




### Modern Contraceptive Prevalence Rate



■ 2004 BDHS ■ 2007 BDHS ■ 2011 BDHS



### Trends in Delivery in Health Facility by Wealth


Percentage of births delivered in health facilities in the three years before the survey

■ Lowest Wealth Quintile ■ Highest Wealth Quintile





Percent of children under age five



## Trends in Children's Nutritional Status



Percent of children under age five




## Trends in Exclusive Breastfeeding
