Dr. Md Sajjad Hossain Bhuiyan, a dedicated academician and former high-ranking tax official, is a seasoned expert in finance, taxation, and governance, with over three decades of experience across both academic and public sectors. On May 4, 2025, the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh appointed him as the Chairman of the Financial Reporting Council (FRC).

Dr. Bhuiyan holds a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree in Business Administration. He previously earned both his M.Com (First Class First, 1985) and B.Com (Hons) (First Class, 1984) from the Department of Finance, University of Dhaka, following earlier studies in commerce at Kabi Nazrul Government College, Dhaka (HSC, 1981) and Batakandi SSAAHM High School, Cumilla (SSC, 1979).

He began his professional career at ICB, Dhaka as a Senior Officer in 1987 and later joined AB Bank PLC as a Probationary Officer in 1988. From 1989 to 1990 he served as a Lecturer in the Department of Finance, University of Dhaka, before joining the Bangladesh Civil Service (BCS) Tax Cadre in 1991. He retired in 2022 as a Member, National Board of Revenue (NBR).

Dr. Bhuiyan possesses deep expertise in cash flow analysis, currency movement, under-invoicing, over-invoicing, transfer pricing, mergers and acquisitions, asset formation, and audit report examination. He has expertise on ACC law, company law, Tax law, and Tax policy, which he leverages to detect and prevent corruption, Tax evasion, and money laundering—critical to enhancing national revenue and ensuring fiscal transparency.

In addition to his public service, Dr. Bhuiyan has made lasting contributions to higher education. He continues to serve as an adjunct faculty member at several renowned institutions, including the Institute of Business Administration (IBA), University of Dhaka; Finance Department, University of Dhaka; East West University; Independent University Bangladesh (IUB); Stamford University; University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh (ULAB); and the University of Asia Pacific, among others.
