

BANGLADESH: FASTEST GROWING ECONOMIES IN THE WORLD

Your market is here



Bangladesh has emerged as one of the fastest-growing economies globally. This remarkable transformation is attributed to a combination of strategic economic reforms, robust industrial growth, a burgeoning service sector, and significant improvements in social indicators. Over the past decade, Bangladesh has consistently recorded impressive GDP growth rates, often surpassing 6-7% annually. In recent years, the country has even achieved growth rates above 8%, positioning itself among the fastest-growing economies worldwide. This sustained economic performance has significantly improved living standards and reduced poverty rates.

Bangladesh has transformed the country into a land of opportunities. It is now being considered as the next Asian Tiger. The economy of Bangladesh is a major developing market economy. As the second-largest economy in South Asia, Bangladesh's economy is the 35th largest in the world in nominal terms, and 25th largest by purchasing power parity. Bangladesh is seen by various financial institutions as one of the Next Eleven. It has been transitioning from being a frontier market into an emerging market. Bangladesh is a member of the South Asian Free Trade Area and the World Trade Organization. The country has made a stunning economic record, highly adaptive and competitive workforce and several potential industrial sectors with low cost and high return manufacturing regime in Asia.

To sustain its economic momentum, Bangladesh has embarked on several large-scale infrastructure projects. Notable among these are the Padma Bridge, the Dhaka Metro Rail, Elevated Expressway and the Payra Deep Sea Port. These projects are expected to enhance connectivity, reduce transportation costs, and attract further investment. The establishment of Special Economic Zones (SEZs) and improvements in the ease of doing business have bolstered FDI inflows, particularly in the manufacturing and energy sectors.

Bangladesh offers its large domestic markets, strategic location, high profitability, demographic dividend and attractive incentive policies and consistent reforms for better business climate that rendered the country as one of the best investment destinations in the world. Inspired by the vision of the

Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the government led by the Honorable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has built a solid foundation to support the growth of economic activities in Bangladesh. Under her strong leadership, Bangladesh is poised to diversify its economy and emerge as a developed country by 2041. Asian Development Bank has estimated Bangladesh's GDP growth by 5.2% in 2020 even amidst global pandemic and 6.8% in 2021. The country registered a 5.82 percent growth in Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2023-24, up from 5.78 percent in 2022-23, according to data released by the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS).

Bangladesh offers the most liberal FDI regime in South Asia, allowing 100% foreign equity ownership with unrestricted exit policy. Almost all the sectors are open for foreign investment without any quantitative restrictions. The country offers generous tax holiday, reduced tax rate for specific sectors, bond facility, export incentives, and other fiscal incentives. The country offers the most generous incentive Packages in the South Asian region which include the followings:

Corporate Tax Holiday from 5 to 10 years in certain areas and sectors, Accelerated Depreciation on cost of machinery for new industries in lieu of tax holiday, Bonded warehousing facility for export-oriented industries, Domestic market sales up to 20% allowed to export-oriented companies outside EPZ, Cash incentives and export subsidies granted on

the FOB values ranging from 5% to 20% on selected products, Tariff concessions on import of raw materials of the export-oriented industries, Duty free market access to EU & most developed countries, 100% foreign equity is allowed, Full repatriation of dividends and capital is allowed, Tax exemption of remittance of royalty, technical know-how and accordingly, in such circumstances, Bangladesh has created within itself an unparalleled investment climate in recent years compared to other South Asian economies. A good investment climate is of fundamental importance for the private sector to be able to contribute to the global sustainable development agenda in the support of the following facilities prevailing for the investors.



The Foreign Private Investment (Promotion and Protection) Act 1980 ensures full protection to foreign investors. The geographic location of the country is ideal for global trade with Strategic Location, Regional Connectivity and Worldwide Access. The One-Stop Service (OSS) puts all investment facilitation mechanisms under a single window. Highly adaptive and industrious workforce with the competitive wages and salaries are available in Bangladesh. About 57.3% of the population is under 25, providing a youthful group for engagement to meet global standards. No restrictions on issuance of work permits to project related foreign nationals and employees. Bangladesh is endowed with abundant supply of natural gas; water and its soil is very fertile. Bilateral investment treaties with 33 countries for promotion and protection of investment: Avoidance of Double Taxation Treaty (DTT) with 28 countries. Bangladesh has also signed multilateral and regional treaties such as MIGA, ICSID, WIPO, WAIPA, OPIC, APTA, BIMSTEC, IORA, SAPTA, SAFTA, SAFAS, COMCEC, TPS-OIC. In addition, Bangladesh has signed trade agreements with 45 countries for trade facilities among the countries.

It is observed that Bangladesh offers significant competitive cost in case of skilled labour, industrial estate rent, and low-cost energy, in terms of doing business, which is more than the other major countries like China, Bangkok, Vietnam, Indonesia and India. But business insiders say that establishing and running a business in Bangladesh require overcoming numerous challenges. There is no denying that successive governments have taken several reform measures, but more needs to be done to create a congenial business environment to achieve higher economic growth. If our policymakers are serious about improving Bangladesh's position in the global marketplace as an attractive business and investment destination, it has to remove the deterrents that are responsible for the high cost of investment.

PLASTIC INDUSTRIES OF BANGLADESH

Plastic Industries of Bangladesh are mainly engaged in manufacturing of different products like PVC Pipe, Garments accessories, Hanger, Poly Bag, Polythene Bag, Plastic Household products, Jute and Textile Spares, Toys, Crockery items, Plastic Waste Recycling, Computer Accessories, Plastic Furniture, Poly Propylene Woven, Flexible Packaging and many others. Total Plastic Raw Materials import is now about 21,58,091.8 MT (Inbond+Nonbond import) per annum and per capita plastic consumption is 9/10 kgs. Import of Plastic resin is increasing by 10% per annum and the domestic demand is also growing at the rate of 20%. This confirms that plastic is a material of choice and is used in all sectors of the economy such as infrastructure, construction, agriculture, consumer goods and telecom as well as in packaging.

For export government provides duty free import of raw materials. At present plastic products worth over 40,000 crores taka are being produced and marketed locally. On the other hand, plastic industries have been successfully exporting many products to many countries in the form of Direct and Deemed. Exports (direct and indirect) amounted to US\$ 337.42 million in FY 2010-2011, rising to US\$ 1.2 billion in FY

2022-2023 within a decade. In the last fiscal year 2022-2023, the plastic sector's direct export target was 200.00 MUS\$, Performance 209.86 MUS\$. This financial year 2023-2024 July-May, export target was 249.76 MUS\$, while export performance is 222.25 MUS\$. At the same time 2022-2023 (July-April) performance was 170.6 MUS\$. According to the data, export increased 17.87%. EPB Source said that plastic items are exported to Asia, America, Europe, Africa and Australia including 126 countries. Despite the slowdown in exports of all other sectors, exports of plastics are increasing. The plastics industrialists think that if the market and products are diversified, the export of plastic products will increase several times. Plastics are also a growing industry among the various industrial sectors of the country.

Plastic Sector in Bangladesh is rapidly growing with its current domestic market & foreign export. There are more about 6000 small, medium and large plastic manufacturing units located in different clusters across Bangladesh. Growth rate has averaged more than 20% each year for the last consecutive years. Approximately 1.2 million people are involved in plastic industries. Nearly all the plastic goods for household use in Bangladesh that were imported in the past, are now being made in the country. Our per capita usage of plastic per year is around 9 kg compared to more than 100kg per year in many developed countries. The use of plastic is expected to increase as the country becomes more developed. Plastic Industry earns 10% of its earning from RMG export. Application of plastic in agricultural sector is booming. The agricultural sector is also becoming a major consumer of plastic products as plastic pipes are used extensively for irrigation purposes. About 2000 crores taka is added as revenue per annum to the national exchequer from this sector.

Industrialization in the plastics sector is developing rapidly and is gradually expanding into large industrial sectors. It is playing a role in the economic development of the country. In the present context, there is a good possibility to increase the use of plastic in Bangladesh. Almost every year membership and investment in plastic sector is increasing significantly.

The growth of the plastic industry has a multiplying effect on numerous important sectors of Bangladesh's economy. So Govt. of Bangladesh has given immense priority to this industry. The government is conducting activities for the export development of the plastic sector through the EC4J project under the Ministry of Commerce, giving priority to the plastic industry.

This mega event was jointly organized by Bangladesh Plastic Goods Manufacturers & Exporters Association (BPGMEA) & Yorkers Trade & Marketing Co., Ltd., Hongkong.

In the 16th Plastic Fair, 494 companies from 21 countries including Bangladesh participated in the fair with 750 stalls/booths. Now it is one of the biggest events in the Asia. The 16th International Plastics Fair 2024 was held with great success. This year, a total of 21 countries such as Bangladesh, China, India, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Pakistan, Egypt, Singapore, South Korea, Malaysia, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, Oman. Saudi Arabia, Austria, United Kingdom, United States and Vietnam have introduced their new products, participated in the fair with resources and this fair has gained international recognition.

Most of the participants were satisfied with the performance and fruitful outcome of the exposition. The venue was crowded with business visitors showing their interests to get state-of-the-arts industrial technologies as well as onsite order.

IPF 2024 not only creates the opportunity for an excellent gathering of the international suppliers and buyers but also brought foreign investment and economic growth to Bangladesh.
