“Tourism and Rural Development” World Tourism Day 2020; Bangladesh perspective

This year, World Tourism Day is being celebrated under the theme “Tourism and Rural Development”. Every year since 1980, September 27 has been celebrated as World Tourism Day under the auspices of the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO). In this year’s theme, emphasis has been laid on the socio-economic development of the rural people and the country by conducting tourism development activities while upholding its own culture and heritage without harming the environment and ecological balance. In 1971, we achieved an independent Bangladesh under the leadership of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. In 1972, immediately after independence, as an extraordinary leader, realizing the potential of the tourism industry and its contribution to economic development Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation. Considering the growing impact of global tourism, Hon’ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina established the Bangladesh Tourism Board in 2010 as a national tourism agency. Under the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism, Bangladesh parjatan Corporation and Bangladesh Tourism Board, along with other private stakeholders, are working to make Bangladesh one of the leading tourist destinations in South Asia. One of the growing sectors of the economy in the world today is the service sector and the tourism industry is the largest of it. Tourism is actually considered as an integrated and labor intensive sector of various industries, services and functions. Rural tourism has become quite important at present among the various categories of tourism. The concept of rural tourism can bring back the socio-economic and environmental well-being of the rural community by reviving the conventional notions of tourism and ensuring the sustainable development of a particular country. Over time, the issue has taken on a much wider scope, including the rural environment, water and land based activities, cultural activities, culture, traditional food, health. It provides a great opportunity for tourists to experience the carefully nurtured traditions, way of life and culture of the local people of a region which is not available in urban areas. In contrast to conventional tourism, rural tourism provides an ideal opportunity to get accustomed to the local heritage of a country in the vicinity of natural beauty. The heart of Bangladesh’s beauty lies in its villages. There are 6036 villages in the country, each with its own customs and traditions. The tourism sector can benefit greatly from the rich cultural heritage of these regions. Rural tourism is one of the most promising tourism sectors in Bangladesh. Improving rural tourism, increasing employment will directly affect our GDP sector. The development of this sector requires proper policy formulation, infrastructure development, human resource development, adequate investment for services and facilities in tourist destination areas, preparation of rural people for tourism in their areas, public-private partnership, guidelines for sustainable tourism development. We have to make each village a single tourist destination. These destinations are visited by tourists from urban areas of the country, so that employment is created along with financial activities in rural areas. One of the notable promises of the current Government’s election manifesto 2018 is “Villages will be cities” which is very much in line with the theme announced by the United Nations World Tourism Organization this year. The main objective of the government in transforming the village into a city is to bring the emergency facilities of the city to the village without destroying the agricultural land and rural heritage. And the services that will prevail are improved access to health care, education, electricity, potable water, employment, and communication for the rural people. And all these are but collective tourism activities. In other words, the rural tourism program is an important part of the government for the transformation of villages into cities. Rural tourism development can play a more effective role than micro-finance in boosting rural employment and rural economic conditions. Foreign tourists need to be attracted to keep the wheel of rural economy moving. Foreign tourists mainly come to see the people of our country and their diverse lifestyles. Foreigners are also attracted to our villages, our rivers, our history, traditions and culture. For this we have to present various rural traditions such as rural social system, traditional farming of agricultural land, pre-harvest and many pre-harvest rural ceremonies, finishing, boating, folk music, indigenous food etc. with aesthetics and professionalism. Tourism is an innate human instinct. People can learn about different cultures, civilizations, traditions and nature by visiting different places. Known as the green land of natural paradise, Bangladesh is a country with endless potential in terms of tourism. All the elements to attract any tourist in the world exist in this country of immense beauty At present Bangladesh is one of the fastest growing tourism markets in the world, The corona virus crisis has had a huge impact on the global tourism industry which will present a new picture of the future of the industry. At present, the tourism sector contributes about 11 percent to the world's GDP. In 2019, the number of tourists in the world was about 1.5 billion. The World Tourism Organization (WTO) predicted that the rate would increase by another 4 to 5 percent this year But the impact of the epidemic has hampered this puce Tourism industry is an emerging industry in Bangladesh. The tourism industry has seen tremendous improvement in the last few years. The tourism master plan was launched late last year to reshape the tourism sector, which stalled the Corona epidemic. The sector has already incurred a loss of around Tk 14,000 crore. Since tourism is not a productive industry, it is time to make up for this loss. Improving the quality of life has greatly increased the thirst for travel among the common man and is making a que contribution to socio-economic development and job creation In order to revive the shattered tourism sector, various countries of the world have started limited tourism activities in compliance with hygiene norms. In order to mobilize the ailing tourism sector of Bangladesh, the tourist centers are being opened in phases following a limited range of hygiene regulations Policies have been formulated with various guidelines on how to operate tourist centers in the presence of Covid-19. Instructions have been sent to various hotels, motels and tourist centers. The Bangladesh Tourism Board has been working with all stakeholders to determine the extent of the damage caused by the corona virus and the long-term impact of the tourism industry. The recommendations made by UNWTO in three phases to help revive the global tourism sector from the unprecedented challenges of COVID-19 as well as to bring it back to a "better state are coordinated by the Bangladesh Tourism Board with the tourism industry and the sector BTB working on various plans and its implementation to srve the 4 million manpower involved from the disaster The hardworking people of the village are the main driving force of the development of the country The potential future of the country lies in their tireless work In the current context of Bangladesh, rural tourism development is essential to alleviate poverty and create massive employment, accelerate the rural economy and make emergency and modern services available to the villagers. Therefore, the youth of the village should be developed as skilled human resources by providing necessary timing on tourism Therefore, in order to move the epidemic ridden tourism sector forward and to implement the socio-economic development of Bangladesh i.e Vision-2021 and 2041, the development of rural requires the concerted efforts of all government initiatives as well as private entrepreneurs.

PROFESSIONS OF VILLAGE PEOPLE

Rural people are hardworking. Mostly the village people are engaged in farming. As Bangladesh is an agricultural country, most of the people earn their livelihood by cultivating various crops. Besides people are also engaged in pottery, fishing, weaving and many other professions.



FISHING

Bangladesh is a riverine country and these rivers are full of hundreds of species of fish. The people living by the banks of these rivers make their livelihood by catching fish. Fishing is one of the most important professions of Bangladesh both commercially and culturally. Myriads of songs and poems and novels have been written about the fishermen of Bengal. 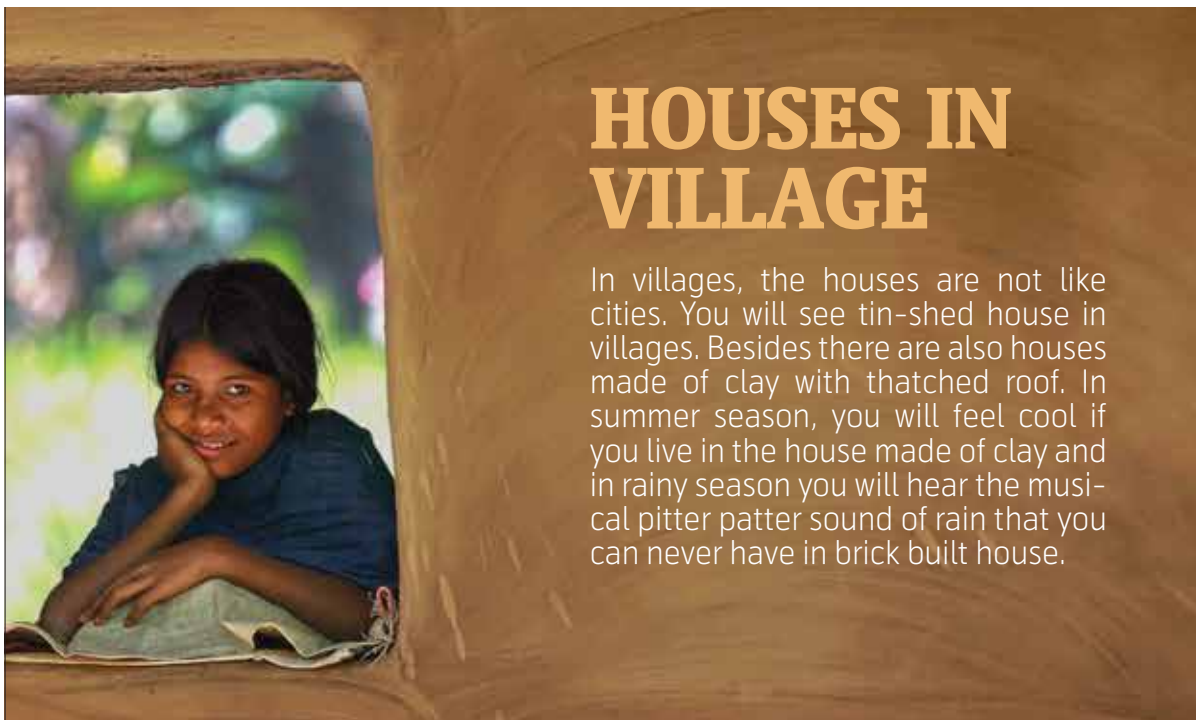
FARMING

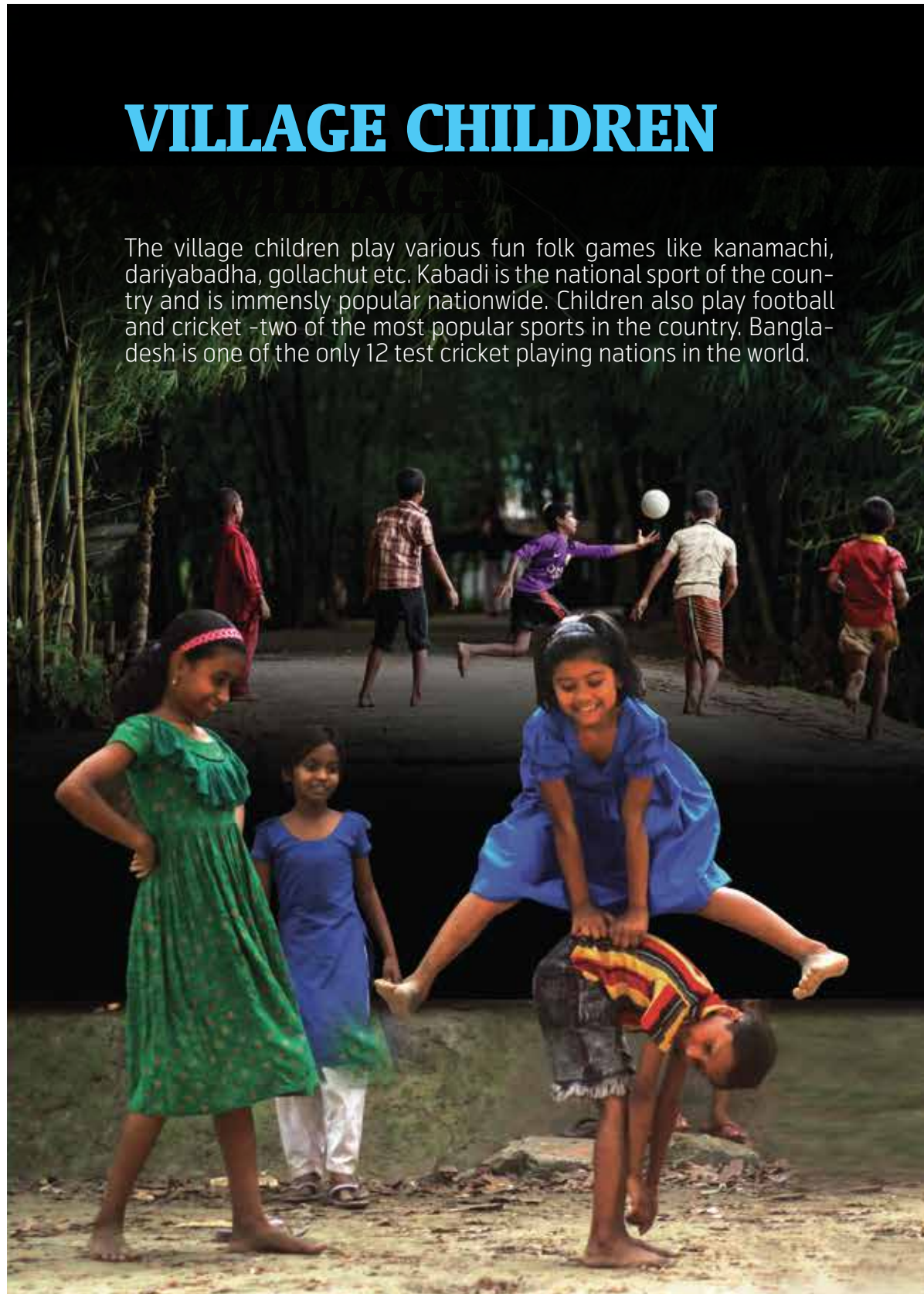


HOUSES IN VILLAGE

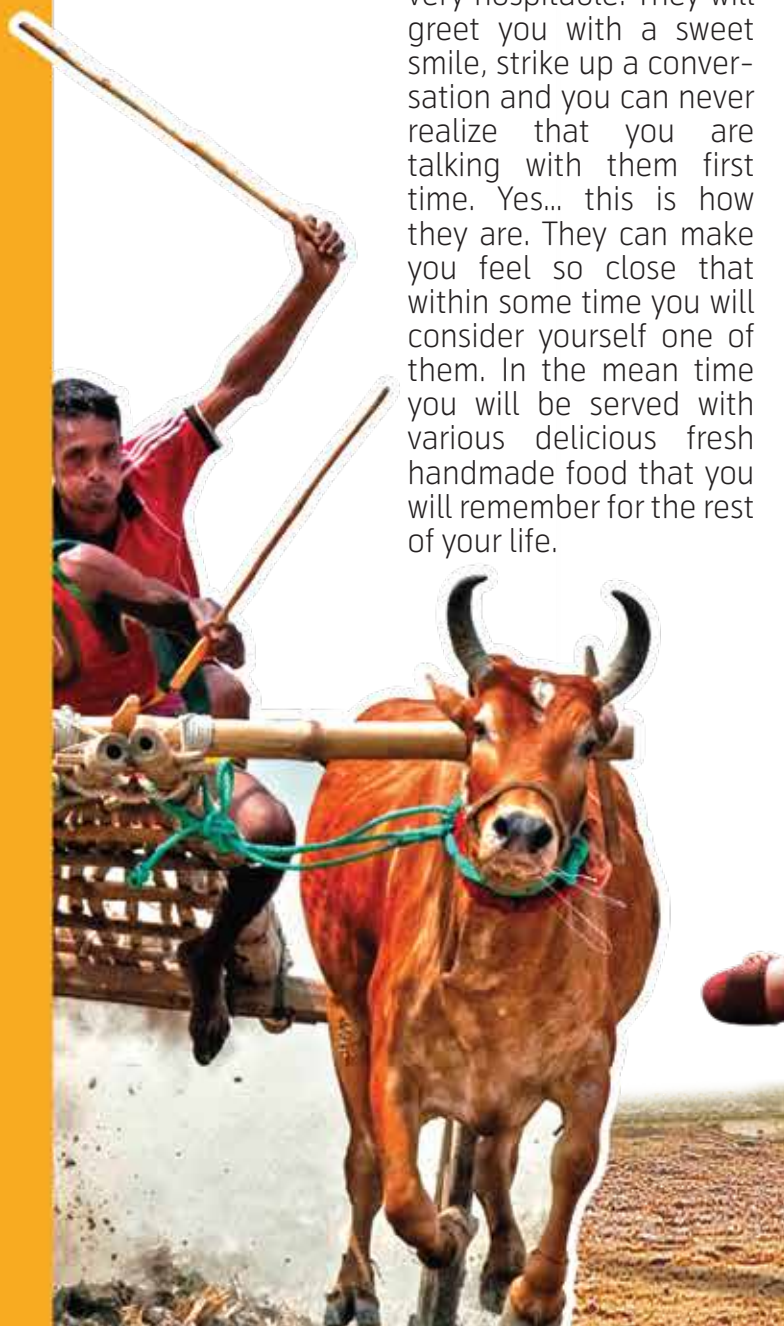
Nobanno Utshob

Nobanno Utshob is one of the popular cultural and traditional festivals in this country. This festival is also known as New Harvest Festival. The Bengali terms Nobanno means 'New Rice' or 'New Crop'. From the ancient times, the Bengali people celebrate this festival with joys and hopes. The Bengali people generally celebrate this Harvest Festival with food, music, and dance and on this day they also wear traditional costumes.

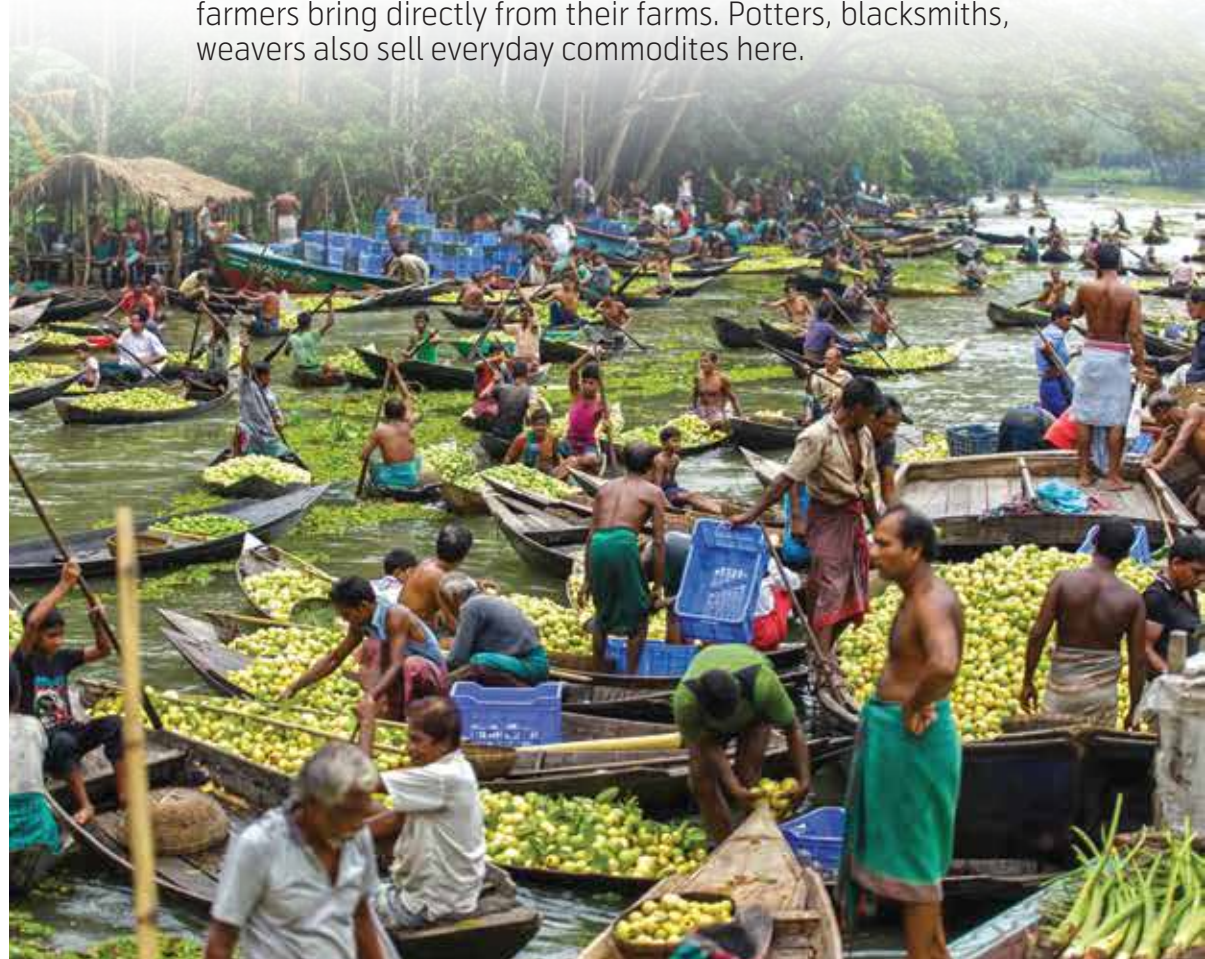

VILLAGE BAZAAR

In villages a market place where people get all the commodities are called haat. In every village there is a 'haat' that sits once in a week and you will find fresh produces here which farmers bring directly from their farms. Potters, blacksmiths, weavers also sell everyday commodities here.



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
