

Father-in-law's house of world famous poet Rabindranath Tagore is well-known among the places related to the poet in Khulna Division. Dakshindihli Roy Bari is well-known as Father-in-law's house of world famous poet Rabindranath Tagore. It is situated at village Dakshindihli of Fultala Upazilla, 19 kilometers away from the Khulna city. On 9 December, 1883 world famous poet Rabindranath Tagore married Vabolarni Devi who was the daughter of this house-owner, named Beni Madhob Roy Chowdhury. After marriage the name of Vabolarni was changed in to Minnalini Debi according to the custom of Tagore's family. At the time of marriage the poet was 22 years 7 months old and Vabolarni was 10 years 11 month old. Minnalini's father Beni Madhob Roy Chowdhury was the employee of Tagore's estate. Phulalata of Jessor (at present under Khulna District) was selected as bride searching place for Rabindranath and his family. Worth-mentioning that Roy family realized necessity of building a luxurious residence after the marriage of Minnalini with world famous poet Rabindranath Tagore. Accordingly, in 1890 Nagendranath Roy Chowdhury who is brother-in-law of the poet, started to build the house. From 1890 the construction work of the house had been run for a few years.

was built as like as the shape of the ground floor and has a verandah in its front part. There is a stair of 21 steps on the north part of the first floor to climb on the roof. Ironed railing and wood were used in the stairs. The roof of the house was built with wood rafter and iron. Total area of the house is 7.8 acres. In 1995 the local government able to setting free its illegal possession. After that on 27 July, 2010 total 0.40 acres land with the main building was declared as the protected monument by the Government of the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh. The Department of Archaeology Ministry of Cultural Affairs is the custodian of this house on behalf of the Government. Preservation and conservation works of the ruined house has been done by the Department of Archaeology and boundary wall, guard shed, ticket counter etc also constructed to develop the area as a cultural heritage site. From recent excavation for conservation ruins of some rooms with floor and Varandah also exposed at the western side of the house. A display also establishes here to exhibit the photographs of Tagore and Minnalini Devi. Cultural programme held every year at the time of birth and death anniversary of poet at the premises of the house.
