This is however, not enough in achieving our SDG targets, particularly in ensuring poverty and hunger free country and facing graduation challenges. We therefore, need more trade opportunities for sustainable graduation and fulfilling the SDG goals.

Distinguished Delegates

Given the present momentum of graduation of a number of LDCs, I urge upon the WTO Members to develop a time bound action plan with special emphasis on preferential market access and continuation of other exemptions that they are currently enjoying in ensuring sustainable graduation. We look forward to receive meaningful cooperation from the Members and the developed partners.
