#### HOME (TRANSPORT) DEPARTMENT.

##### NOTIFICATIONS.

No. 2081H.T.—16th June 1952.—Captain A. W. ##### NOTIFICATIONS.

No. 2558J.—18th June 1952.—In exercise of the power conferred by section 14 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (Act V of 1898), the Governor is pleased to confer upon Maung Shwe Prue and Babu Hementa Prasad Talukdar, Welfare Officers of the Chittagong Hill-tracts, the powers of a Magistrate of the third class in the Chittagong Hill-tracts, for a period of three years, with effect from the 22nd June 1952, in respect to such criminal cases as may be made over to them by their respective Subdivisional Magistrates of the Chittagong Hill-tracts for disposal.

No. 2583J.—19th June 1952.—Whereas by a notification No. 2505J., dated the 15th July 1918, published in the *Calcutta Gazette* it was ordered, that on and after the 1st January 1919, the trial of certain offences under the Indian Penal Code (Act XLV of 1860) and the Indian Post Office Act, 1898 (VI of 1898), before any Court of Sessions in certain districts including the district of Faridpur shall be by jury;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that there is a lack of confidence in the fairness of trials by jury in
