**Newsbrief**

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus announced that the referendum on July National Charter-2025 and the national polls would be held on the same day in the first half of February next. The Chief Adviser said this in a televised address to the nation yesterday following a meeting of the Council of Advisers at his office. The Chief Adviser said, the Council of Advisers approved the July National Charter (Constitutional Reform) Implementation Order, 2025, marking a historic step towards realizing the reform commitments made under the July National Charter, which was signed by major political parties. The Chief Adviser also called upon all pro-July Uprising political parties to remain united for holding a free, fair and credible national polls in February next.

The Council of Advisers approved a proposal from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to establish two new embassies — one in Dublin, the capital of Ireland and another in Buenos Aires, the capital of Argentina. The decision was made at the 48th meeting of the Council of Advisers at the Chief Adviser's Office with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus in the chair, according to Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Adviser Professor Asif Nazrul sought expanded employment opportunities for Bangladeshi workers in South Korea, praising Seoul's EPS and Seasonal Worker schemes while urging diversification into agriculture, livestock, caregiving and service sectors to strengthen manpower co-operation. Speaking at a reception at South Korean embassy in Dhaka marking the National Foundation Day of the Republic of Korea yesterday, the Adviser said, Bangladesh highly values Korea's role as a trusted partner in investment, employment and development.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Dr Asif Nazrul strongly condemned the brutal attack at the residence of Rajshahi Metropolitan Sessions Judge Mohammad Abdur Rahman, which left his son, Taosif Rahman (Suman), dead and his wife, Tasmin Nahar, seriously injured. Following the incident, instructions were given to the police to arrest all those involved and ensure a thorough investigation at the earliest possible time, an official release said yesterday. In line with the directive, the concerned law enforcement agencies have already taken immediate steps.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (ret'd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, the law and order in the country is stable. The Adviser told journalists at the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. The Home Adviser reiterated that there is nothing to be worried around the activities of a political party which activities are now banned.

Agriculture and Home Affairs Adviser Lieutenant General (Ret'd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury has expressed optimism about achieving a bumper yield of Aman paddy this seasons. The Adviser said this while speaking to journalists at the Bangladesh Secretariat yestrday.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) AMM Nasir Uddin yesterday said, the Election Commission will be able to give its opinion on holding a referendum on the July National Charter 2025 only after receiving the matters formally from the government. The CEC said this while replying to a question sent by reporters, seeking the Commission's opinion over the announcement of Chief Adviser to hold the referendum and the national election simultaneously in a single day.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus appointed Professor Ali Riaz as his Special Assistant. The Cabinet Division issued a gazette notification in this regard yesterday.
