Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has called for publishing a book with a simplified version of the National Consensus Commission report to make it easily understandable and accessible to the country's people. The Chief Adviser said this while the Consensus Commission members handing over the eight-volume report to him at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday, according to a press release of the Chief Adviser's Press Wing. The report included detailed recommendations, meeting minutes and records of discussions of the Commission.

Chief Advisor Professor Muhammad Yunus stressed on comprehensive preparations to tackle any inside or outside attempt to foil the upcoming national elections. The Chief Adviser was quoted by his Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam as he told a high level meeting on election preparations at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. Following the meeting, the Press Secretary was addressing a press briefing at the foreign Service Academy in the capital.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus yesterday issued a message marking the Robe Offering Ceremony (Kathin Chibar Dana), one of the most sacred religious festivals of Buddhist community, at Rajban Vihara in Rangamati. The Chief Adviser said, he extend his greetings and congratulations to the Buddhists and other communities of Vihara on the occasion of the Kathira Chibar Dana Festival of Rajban Vihar in Rangamati. The Chief Adviser said, the offering of the Robe of the Rangamati Rajban Vihar is a shining example of the tradition of Buddhists. The Chief Adviser also wished the overall success of all the events organized on the occasion of 'Rajvan Vihara's Kathin Chibar Dana-2025.



Shipping Affairs Adviser Brigadier General (Retd.) Dr M Sakhawat Hussain said, the Ministry of Shipping and the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock will work jointly to protect the country's waterways and fish resources. The Adviser made the remarks while chairing a meeting on the protection of waterways and aquatic resources at the Ministry of Shipping at the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. Fisheries and Livestock Affairs Adviser Farida Akhter also attended the meeting.

Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Adviser Sharmeen S Murshid said, the youth of 2024 are the successors of the martyrs of 1971, transforming the nation's trajectory. The Adviser said this while addressing the unveiling ceremony of the 'July Self-Sacrifice of the Media' commemorative volume and the July Dialogue event, organized by Mukto Ganamadhyan Manch, at the Bishwo Sahitya Kendra auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr AFM Khalid Hossain said, the government is assisting destitute and vulnerable individuals across the country through the Social Services Office. He noted that the government allocates Tk 24 crore annually to purchase medicines for needy patients in medical facilities nationwide. The Adviser said this while speaking as the chief guest at an event held at the Chattogram Circuit House yesterday.



Germany has reaffirmed its unwavering commitment to Bangladesh's development and humanitarian priorities. German's State Secretary economic cooperation and development Johann Saathoff made the commitment during his 2-day Dhaka visit concluded on October 28, according to a German Embassy press release said yesterday.

The Ministry of Liberation War Affairs has cancelled the gazettes of 128 people from different parts across the country after discrepancies were found during verification of the lists published as injured participants in the July Uprising. A notification in this regard was issued by the Ministry yesterday.

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has expressed satisfaction with Bangladesh's performance in controlling inflation and maintaining foreign currency reserves. These observations followed the first round of meetings held in the in Dhaka yesterday as part of the IMF's 5th Review Mission to Bangladesh.

Fiji's Minister for Multicultural Affairs, Sugarcane and Industry, Charan Jeath Singh, paid solemn floral tributes to the heroic martyrs at the National Memorial in Savar yesterday. The Minister, referred to in reports as Fiji's Industry Minister, honoured the martyrs at the National Memorial.

Kosovo yesterday extended its support to improve educational opportunities for Rohingya children in Cox's Bazar through a Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC) signed with a local NGO in Dhaka. Kosovo Ambassador to Bangladesh Lulzim Pllana signed the MoC with Executive Director of the Association for Socio-Economic Advancement of Bangladesh (ASEAB) Mahfuja Khanam, in the presence of Md. Kamruzzaman, Director General of the Myanmar Wing at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Chinese Ambassador to Bangladesh Yao Wen said that China sincerely wishes Bangladesh a smooth general election, social stability and improved livelihoods for its people, reaffirming Beijing's readiness to work closely with Dhaka in advancing shared development and modernization goals. The Envoy said this while speaking at a seminar hosted by the Association of Former Ambassadors at the Foreign Service Academy in Dhaka yesterday.

The government has created new opportunities for Bangladeshi recruiting agencies to send workers to Malaysia, aiming to ensure fair access and parity with other labour-sending countries. Ministry of Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment said this in a press release yesterday.

A total of 174 irregular Bangladeshi nationals yesterday repatriated from Libya through a chartered flight of Burak Air under a coordinated initiative supported by the Government of Libya and the International Organization for Migration (IOM). According to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the voluntary repatriation was facilitated jointly by the Bangladesh Embassy in Tripoli, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment.


