Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the ultimate goal of the interim government is to make the July Charter by reaching a consensus over reforms with political parties. The Adviser said this while delivering his closing remarks at the first meeting of the National Consensus Commission with the political parties at Foreign Service Academy in Dhaka yesterday. The Chief Adviser observed that there was no limit of misdeeds while no institution was running properly and no law was operational fully. If reforms could not be brought in the state structure, all efforts of the interim government will fall in flat, the Chief Adviser added.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus urged the political parties to reach a consensus in implementing the proposals placed by six reform commissions. The Chief Adviser made the remarks in his opening speech at the first meeting of the National Consensus Commission with the political parties at Foreign Service Academy in Dhaka yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus will inaugurate a three-day Deputy Commissioners' (DC) Conference in Dhaka today. The conference is scheduled to be inaugurated by the Chief Adviser in the Shapla Hall of the Chief Adviser's Office (CAO) in Tejgaon. After the inauguration, an open discussion between the Chief Adviser and the DCs will be held, according to a press release yesterday.

Adviser to the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change and Water Resources Syeda Rizwana Hasan said, cultural practice was crucial for sustainable environmental development. The Adviser stated that culture and the environment are interconnected, and a healthy cultural practice can contribute positively to environmental conservation. The Adviser made these remarks while inaugurating a performing art styled 'Ananda Academy for Performing Arts' as the chief guest at Baridhara in the capital yesterday.

In its fact-finding report, The UN Rights Office (OHCHR) said, the ousted Bangladesh regime appeared to have made coordinated efforts to suppress truths about rights violations during the July August Uprising instead of taking even minimal steps to ensure accountability of people concerned. The UN organ last week released the report titled Human Rights Violations and Abuses related to the Protests of July and August 2024 in Bangladesh. According to the report OHCHR also received information about police and RAB units being given unrecorded allotments of ammunitions, so that their extensive volume of shooting would not be picked up in ammunition expenditure accounts.

BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir hoped that national elections will be held soon on the basis of consensus on reforms after joining a meeting with the National Consensus Commission at the Foreign Service Academy auditorium in Dhaka. Representatives of 26 political parties, including BNP and Jamaat, participated in the meeting with Chief Adviser Professor Dr Muhammad Yunus in the chair. BNP Secretary said, Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus in the meeting informed the political parties that each of the reports submitted by the reform commissions will be discussed with political parties and an attempt will be made to reach a consensus.

The Public Administration Reform Commission in its report recommended the formation of an independent training commission to develop skills and capacity in public administration. Public Administration Reform Commission head Abdul Mueyed Chowdhury handed over the commission's report to Chief Advisor Professor Muhammad Yunus on February 5.

Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh greeted the United Nations High Commission for Human Rights to unearth the truth behind the killings of July-August uprising. The Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami Dr. Shafiqur Rahman in a press statement said, the probe report released recently by the UN body recognized that fascist Sheikh Hasina had launched inhuman and brutal killing mission across the country.

A book on Islamic rules and regulations named 'Islami Bidhi Bidhan', authored by Religious Affairs Adviser Dr. AFM Khalid Hossain, was unveiled yesterday. Published by renowned Bishokollan Publication, the book consists of four chapters covering essential aspects of Iman (faith), Ibadat (worship), Muamalat (Islamic commercial transactions) and Muasharat (social conduct) in light with the Quran and Hadith. The book launching ceremony was held at the rooftop of DR Tower at Purana Paltan in the capital yesterday.

Due to subservient policy of fascist Sheikh Hasina towards India, the Teesta Mega Plan was not implemented. As a result, the aspirations of nearly two crore people remained unfulfilled. Chief Coordinator of the Teesta River Protection Movement and Organizing Secretary (Rangpur division) of the BNP central executive committee Principal Asadul Habib Dulu said yesterday. He said this while addressing a press conference organised by the Teesta River Protection Movement at a local hotel in Rangpur yesterday before observing a 48-hour sit-in programme on February 17 and 18 to demand fair share of Teesta water and implementation of Teesta Master Plan.
