Newsbrief

The World Radio Day-2025, a day to celebrate radio as a vital source of local news, will be observed in the country as elsewhere across the globe today. On the day, Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus yesterday issued a message greeting all concerned, including officers, employees, technicians and audience of the Bangladesh Betar and wishing all programmes of the day a success.

Describing the Aynaghar as horrific, Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the deposed Awami League government had established the age of brutality in all sectors and the Aynaghar was the sample of it. The Chief Adviser told this after visiting three spots of Aynaghar in Dhaka yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus called upon the international community to engage with the 'new Bangladesh' that emanated from the uprising led by the students and youth folk against an oppressive regime and discrimination. The Chief Adviser made the call in his keynote speech at the 48th Session of the Governing Council of International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD). The prerecorded video speech of the Chief Adviser was broadcast in the event at IFAD Headquarters in Rome, according to a message yesterday.

Reiterating the interim government's pledge to uphold the rule of law, Chief Adviser yesterday called upon all stakeholders of Bangladesh's justice system, including police, prosecutors and judges to work in line with that. The Chief Adviser said this in a statement following the publication a report of the UN's Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus left Dhaka for Dubai to attend the "World Governments Summit-2025" being held in the United Arab Emirates. Chief Adviser's Deputy Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad Majumder told BSS yesterday.

Home Adviser Lt. Gen. (Retd.) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury reiterated that the nationwide 'Operation Devil Hunt' carried by joint forces will continue as long as the devils exist. The Adviser said replying to a question after coming out of the 45th National Assembly of Bangladesh Ansar and VDP at Ansar-VDP Academy at Safipur in Gazipur yesterday. Ansar and VDP has been playing a crucial role in ensuring security and development of the country to build a discrimination-free country, the Adviser added.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain said, there is significant potential for further collaboration with Bhutan particularly in the areas of power and trade. The Adviser made the remarks when outgoing Bhutanese Ambassador to Bangladesh Rinchen Kuentzyl paid a farewell call on him at Foreign Ministry in Dhaka yesterday.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan yesterday called for taking collective efforts to preserve environment in St. Martin, a coral island in the Bay of Bengal. The Adviser made the call during a cleanliness drive conducted by the local administration to protect environment and bio-diversity of the island.

Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Adviser Sharmin S. Murshid said, women were at the forefront of both in 1971 Liberation War and the July 2024 Revolution, but over time, their achievements are often erased from the history.
