Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Prof Muhammad Yunus told the international community that Bangladesh is committed to building a balanced democratic order where no elected leader would be able to undermine democracy. The Chief Adviser also urged all to move forward with the dream of building a world of three zeros. The Chief Adviser made the remarks while speaking at the 80th United Nations General Assembly in New York yesterday in presence of global leaders and key political representatives from Bangladesh. The Chief Adviser stressed making the 'Loss and Damage Fund' fully operational to save the future generation from the adverse impacts of climate change.

Bhutanese Prime Minister Tshering Tobgay expressed strong interest in signing a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with Bangladesh and linking the two countries' economic zones to boost trade and investment. The Bhutanese Prime Minister showed his keenness at a meeting with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the United Nations headquarters in the USA yesterday on the sidelines of the 80th UN General Assembly. During the talks, The Bhutanese Prime Minister said, both countries could greatly benefit if Bhutan's Special Economic Zone, Gelephu Mindfulness City (GMC), is connected with the Special Economic Zone in Kurigram that Bangladesh has officially allocated for Bhutanese investors.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus yesterday reaffirmed the interim government's commitment to implementing key labour reforms—aligned with International Labour Organization (ILO) conventions—before the upcoming national elections in February. The Chief Adviser said this while attending as the chief guest a high-level dinner hosted at the Bangladesh Permanent Mission to the United Nations to convene diplomats, UN officials, and senior political figures from Bangladesh for a focused dialogue on labour laws, workers' rights, and ongoing reform efforts in the country.

Albania has expressed a strong interest in recruiting skilled and semi-skilled workers from Bangladesh to meet its expanding labour market needs. The proposal was conveyed by Albanian President Bajram Begaj during a meeting with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus on the sidelines of the 80th United Nations General Assembly in New York yesterday.

Bangladesh and Oman have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on cooperation in the field of diplomatic training and studies, aimed at strengthening capacity-building and enhancing professional expertise between the two countries' foreign services. The agreement was signed following a meeting between Bangladesh's Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain and Oman's Foreign Minister Sayyid Badr bin Hamad Albusaidi on the sidelines of the 80th Session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York this week, according to a press release yesterday. During the talks, both leaders expressed satisfaction at the warm and longstanding ties between Bangladesh and Oman and reaffirmed their commitment to deepening bilateral cooperation in areas of mutual interest.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus called upon the younger generation to come forward to ensure the proper growth of the tourism industry. In a message issued yesterday on the World Tourism Day-2025, the Chief Adviser said in line with the rest of the world, Bangladesh is celebrating World Tourism Day 2025 under the initiative of the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism. The Chief Adviser said, tourism is now recognized globally as one of the key drivers of sustainable development. The tourism industry is also playing a crucial role in socioeconomic development directly and indirectly in Bangladesh as well, the Chief Adviser added.

Disaster Management and Relief Adviser Faruk-e-Azam Bir Pratik said, the interim government is trying to bring Rohingya issue in the limelight at the global stage for its durable solution. The Adviser said this while speaking as the chief guest at a meeting on 'Rohingya crisis in the eyes of Chattogram: Humanity, security and future' organized by Chattogram Forum at July Biplob Smriti Hall at Chattogram Press Club yesterday. The Adviser also said, Rohingya crisis is also a political issue and should be resolved from political point of view. Otherwise, the solution will not be sustainable.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, cooperation with China is essential for economic transformation. The Chief Adviser said this while addressing Dhaka-China Day 2025 at North South University the day before yesterday, according to a press release yesterday.

Election Commissioner Md. Anwarul Islam Sarker said that the demand for the Proportional Representation system and complications regarding a political party's symbol will not affect organizing the election. The Election Commissioner said while speaking to reporters after inaugurating a workshop at Shaheed Satu Auditorium in Chapainawabganj yesterday.

Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam said that Transparency International Bangladesh's recent statement regarding the Bangladesh delegation to the 80th United Nations General Assembly 'unfortunately relies on inaccurate information'. The Press Secretary wrote this in a post on his verified Facebook account yesterday.

Non-Resident Bangladeshis will have to go for Hajj from Bangladesh. The Ministry of Religious Affairs issued a notification in this regard recently. According to the notification, Bangladeshis residing or located abroad are strictly prohibited from traveling directly to Saudi Arabia to perform the holy Hajj.
