Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the interim government is sincere in developing country's telecommunication and information technology sectors and it has ensured transparency and accountability in all the activities of these sectors. The Chief Adviser made the comments in his message given on the World Telecommunication and Information Society Day, which is to be celebrated in the country today with the theme 'Gender Equality in Digital Transformation'. The Chief Adviser added that the interim government is committed to ensure equal opportunities and rights for men and women in all the segments of digital transformation by upholding the spirit of July mass uprising.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Adviser Asif Mahmud Shojib Bhuiyan said that Malaysia decided to recruit a large number of Bangladeshi workers in the days to come. The Adviser said this in a post on his verified Facebook account yesterday. In another post, the Adviser said, electric bus will ply on the roads of the capital. The Adviser added that the Farakka Long March called by Maulana Bhashani is the inspiration for the people of this region to fight for a fair share of water. This march marks the historic Farakka Day on May 16, he said.

Detective Branch (DB) of police yesterday released a student, Mohammad Hossain, after interrogating him over the incident of throwing a plastic water bottle towards Information and Broadcasting Adviser Md. Mahfuj Alam in the capital's Kakrail area on Wednesday. The Adviser extended a personal invitation to Mohammad Hossain to visit at his residence after the movement ends, according to the Adviser's Facebook posted yesterday.

There is no shortage of sacrificial animals for the upcoming Eid-ul-Azha which is scheduled to be held in the first week of next month as the country has over 20.68 lakh surplus livestock against Eid demand. Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said at a recent press conference.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, mobile veterinary clinics will remain operative in each of the cattle markets for sacrificial animals. District level offices of the Department of Livestock Services will set up the clinics, where veterinary surgeons will remain and provide necessary treatment. The Adviser revealed this while sharing views with the divisional and district level officials of the Department of Livestock Services at Circuit House conference hall in Rajshahi yesterday.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, Bangladesh wants due share of Ganges water but not favour from anyone. The Adviser said this while speaking at a discussion meeting to mark the 49th anniversary of historic Farakka Long March at Rajshahi College auditorium in Rajshahi yesterday.


Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) Affairs Adviser Supradip Chakma highlighted the immense potential of the CHT as a fertile ground for scientific research, urging the young scientists to play a vital role in advancing the progress of this potential region. A Dhaka-bound Biman Bangladesh Airlines flight with 71 passengers on board made a safe emergency landing at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport (HSIA) yesterday after losing a rear landing gear shortly after takeoff from Cox's Bazar. Biman's General Manager ABM Roushan Kabir told this to media.

The government accepted the demands of the protesting Jagannath University students, said University Grants Commission Chairman Prof SMA Faiz. Students and teachers of Jagannath University called off their protest last night after receiving assurances from the government that their demands would be met. Prof, Rais Uddin, General Secretary of JnU Teachers' Association, made the announcement at Kakrail intersection.

A total of 23 new dengue patients were admitted to hospitals across the country in the last 24 hours, according to a press release from the Directorate General of Health Services said yesterday.




