Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus urged Meta which operates several social media and communication platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, Threads, Messenger and WhatsApp, to find an effective way to combat disinformation that disrupts social harmony and spreads hatred. The Chief Adviser made the urge when Simon Milner, VP, Public Policy, APAC at Meta and Ruzan Sarwar, Public Policy Manager, met him at the state guest house Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

Achim Tröster, Ambassador of the Federal Republic of Germany to Bangladesh, paid a farewell call on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the state guest house Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday marking the end of his four-year diplomatic tenure in Dhaka. During the meeting, the Chief Adviser congratulated the Ambassador on the successful completion of his assignment and expressed appreciation for his efforts in strengthening Bangladesh-Germany relations.

The UN International Day in Support of Victims of Torture is being observed in the country like elsewhere in the world today. On this solemn occasion, Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus issued a message yesterday. In the message, the Chief Adviser said, the Government of Bangladesh joins the international community in observing the United Nations International Day in Support of Victims of Torture. The Chief Adviser also said, torture is a grave violation of human rights and an affront to the dignity of a human being.

The International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking is being observed in the country like elsewhere in the world today to strengthen action and cooperation in achieving a world free of drug abuse. Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus issued a message on this occasion. Noting that drug trafficking and abuse is a multifaceted and complex problem, the Chief Adviser said, a significant part of the country's youth today is losing their talent and creativity due to drugs.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus urged all to avoid usages of plastic items to protect environment and planet. The Chief Adviser made the call at a function as the chief guest at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Centre in Dhaka yesterday marking the World Environment Day. The Chief Adviser also said, the humans are destroying nature but they could not realise that the nature also has a destructive mode.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd.) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, the government is trying to put the ring leaders of drug trading behind the bar to free the country from the menace. The Adviser said this to the journalists after distrusting cheques of donations among the private drug rehabilitation centres in the capital yesterday.

Education Adviser Professor Dr. Chowdhury Rafiqul Abrar said that the interim government remains alert to prevent the HSC question paper leaks as measures have already been taken to conduct the exams in a fair manner. The Adviser said this in an interview with BSS yesterday.

Education Adviser Prof. Dr. Chowdhury Rafiqul Abrar affirmed the government's commitment to delivering accurate and error-free textbooks to students on January 1, 2026, correcting past mistakes and ensuring improved content quality across all grades. The Adviser said this while speaking at a meeting on curriculum development and revision held at the National Curriculum and Textbook Board meeting room in Dhaka yesterday.

Youth and Sports Adviser Asif Mahmud Shojib Bhuiyan said, talent hunt is the only way in which athletes can be found in the future. The Adviser said this during the closing and certificate distribution ceremony of the U-16 talent hunt programme held at National Sports Council auditorium in Dhaka yesterday.

Relief and Disaster Management Adviser Faruk-e-Azam, Bir Protik, received a cheque of Taka 3 crore from Eco-Tex Limited for helping last year's flood affected people. The Adviser received the cheque on behalf of the Chief Adviser of the interim government, at his office of the Ministry yesterday.

Labour and Employment Adviser Brig. Gen. (Retd) Dr. M Sakhawat Hossain said, some garments factories experienced closures before last year's August 5 although it was often mentioned that these closures were taken place after August 5. The Adviser said this while talking to the journalists after attending a seminar at Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre in Dhaka yesterday.


National Consensus Commission Vice Chairman Professor Dr. Ali Riaz urged political parties to demonstrate flexibility and make necessary concessions in the greater national interest to accelerate the formulation of the upcoming 'July Charter.' He made the call at the outset of the discussion while delivering his introductory speech at the Foreign Service Academy in the capital yesterday.

The government has declared the August 5 as July 'Mass Uprising Day', July 16 as 'Martyr Abu Sayeed Day' and August 8 as the 'New Bangladesh Day'. These have been decided to include the date as a 'Ka' category day in the observance of national and international days to be observed as the 'July Mass Uprising Day' every year. All concerned Ministries, departments and organizations were asked to properly implement it. The Cabinet Division issued a circular regarding this yesterday.

Bangladesh Army arrested one person for his involvement with the mob-violence in front of the residence of former Chief Election Commissioner K M Nurul Huda on June 22 last. The arrested person was identified as Md. Hanif and he was handed over to police after his arrest on June 23, an ISPR press release said yesterday.

A total of 50,036 Bangladeshi hajj pilgrims returned home from Saudi Arabia after performing this year's holy Hajj held on June 5. As per yesterday's schedule, 768 pilgrims will arrive in Dhaka from Saudi Arabia through two flights. Director of Hajj office of the Religious Affairs Ministry M Lokman Hossain said yesterday.

Two dengue patients died and 326 were hospitalized across the country during the last 24 hours till this morning, according to a press release issued by the Directorate General of Health Services yesterday.




