Newsbrief

The July Memorial Museum will present the full account of Sheikh Hasina's 16 years of misrule, including the Pilkhana massacre, enforced disappearances and killings, 'Aynaghar', the Shapla massacre and election rigging, in the form of historical records. The museum building authorities revealed the information at a meeting with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna in the capital yesterday, according to a press release issued by the Chief Adviser's Press Wing. During the meeting, Cultural Affairs Adviser Mostofa Sarwar Farooki informed the Chief Adviser that the construction of the museum will be completed by October 31 this year.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd.) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, the anti-July Uprising forces will never come to power again. The Adviser was replying to a question from journalists after inaugurating the graffiti of 'July Bravery' and 'July Sacrifice' painted in memory of the martyrs of the July 2024 student movement at Mural Square, Mawa end of Padma Bridge, Munshiganj yesterday. The Home Adviser added that the next government who will come to the power will show respect the July Uprising.

Industries Adviser Adilur Rahman Khan said that the automobile, agro-machinery and light engineering sectors have projected the possibilities and sustainability of the industries sector of the country. The Adviser said this while inaugurating a two-day 'Automobile and Agro-machineries Fair-2025-Road to Made in Bangladesh' at Tejgaon area in the capital yesterday.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan stressed stronger enforcement, institutional capacity, transparency and accountability in environmental regulation, along with an end to faulty clearances. Speaking at a seminar in Gazipur, the Adviser urged officials of the Department of Environment to act creatively and fearlessly. The Adviser also emphasized transparency in clearance processes, asking the DoE to publish Environmental Impact Assessment reports of all red-category industries on its website and to make public objections part of the decision-making process.



The Shipping Adviser made this remark while speaking at a workshop on 'Customs and Port Management: Problems, Prospects, and Way Forward' held at the Chittagong Port Authority Auditorium in Chattogram yesterday.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr A F M Khalid Hossain encouraged worshippers to celebrate Durga Puja with great enthusiasm terming Bangladesh as a global role model for communal harmony. The Adviser also mentioned that a nationwide hotline will be launched this year, enabling individuals to report crime-related concerns. The Adviser made these remarks as the chief guest at the preparatory meeting for the upcoming Sharadiya Durga Puja 2025 celebration, organized by the Nalapara Sarvajanan Durgotsav Udjapan Parishad in Chattogram yesterday.


