Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus directed to keep the July Charter preparing process transparent and visible to the people. The Chief Adviser came up with the directives at a meeting of the National Consensus Commission held at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

The Council of Advisers gave final approval to the draft of the 'Voters' List (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025'. The final draft of the ordinance was approved at a meeting of the Council of Advisers held at the Chief Adviser's Office in Dhaka yesterday. Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus chaired it.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has been invited to the birth centenary ceremony of Tajuddin Ahmad, one of the organisers of the Great Liberation War and the first Prime Minister of Bangladesh. Tajuddin's eldest daughter Sharmin Ahmad and only son Tanzim Ahmad Sohel Taj handed over the invitation letter to the Chief Adviser at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury (Retd.) vowed to arrest all involved in the attack on the top leaders of the National Citizen Party (NCP) in Gopalganj. The Adviser said this while briefing newsmen on the Gopalganj incident at his Ministry yesterday.

Chinese Ambassador to Bangladesh Yao Wen paid a courtesy call on Commerce Adviser Sk. Bashir Uddin and discussed different issues with special focus on further strengthening bilateral trade and investment cooperation between the two countries the day before yesterday. During the meeting, both sides had in-depth exchanges of views on deepening the level of trade and investment cooperation, according to a message from Chinese embassy in Dhaka .

Health and Family Welfare Adviser Nurjahan Begum laid emphasis on research based medical education for the welfare of the people. The Adviser said this while exchanging views with the teachers and students of Mymensingh Medical College Hospital in Mymensingh the day before yesterday.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, the July fighters fought collectively to achieve democracy and fair rights and no one did anything individually. The Adviser told this at a function marking the 'July Uprising Anniversary Celebration' at the Ahsanullah University of Science and Technology in the capital yesterday.

The Election Commission (EC) has issued the Election Observation Guidelines 2025 for domestic observers ahead of the 13th National Parliamentary Elections. According to the new guidelines, observer organizations may deploy observers for three days -the day before the election, on the Election Day, and the day after the election. Director of Public Relations of EC revealed this to newsmen at the EC Secretariat yesterday.

Special Assistant to the Chief Adviser on Defence and National Integration Development Lieutenant General (retd) Abdul Hafiz said, the government is working to stop drug routes at the Cox's Bazar border. The comments were made in response to questions from journalists after a program organized to mark the export of two tugboats from Western Marine Shipyard to the Emirates at Patenga Boat Club in Chattogram yesterday.

Special Assistant to the Chief Adviser in charge of the Ministry of Railways Dr Sheik Moinuddin said, the country needs a long term and coordinated master plan integrated with road, rail and waterways to improve country's communication system and development of the railway as well. Dr Moinuddin said this as the chief guest at a meeting of views exchange with the officials of the Railway Ministry and Bangladesh railway at Rail Bhaban in Dhaka yesterday.

The interim government has formed a committee to investigate the acts of violence and deaths that occurred in Gopalganj on July 16, 2025. The committee will be chaired by Nasimul Ghani, Senior Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs. He will be joined by two additional secretaries, one from the Ministry of Public Administration and another from the Ministry of Law and Justice. This committee has been mandated to conduct a thorough inquiry and submit its findings to the Chief Adviser's Office within two weeks, according to a statement issued by the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

All scheduled banks across the country will remain closed on 5 August 2025, marking the observance of the government-declared holiday marking 'July Uprising Day.' The Central Bank issued a circular in this regard yesterday.

Police said that the law and order situation in Gopalganj district is now under control with deployment of a large number of Police, Army and Border Guard Bangladesh personnel, according to a police report on the Gopalganj violence yesterday.
