Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus called upon all television (TV) and online media to broadcast the July National Charter signing ceremony live today. The Chief Adviser said this in a message issued yesterday.

The much-awaited historic 'July National Charter-2025' to be signed at South Plaza of the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban today. Chief Adviser and Chairman of the seven-member National Consensus Commission Professor Muhammad Yunus will grace the signing occasion of the charter.

Education Adviser Prof. Dr Chowdhury Rafiqul Abrar said, they want the country's education system to portray its true picture. The Adviser said this in a press conference at his Ministry in Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday after publishing the HSC and equivalent examination results. The Adviser congratulated those who did well in the HSC examinations and expressed sympathy to those who did not succeed, calling upon them to do hard work.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Adviser Asif Mahmud Shojib Bhuyain yesterday pleaded for awarding exemplary punishment to those involved in committing crimes against humanity during the mass uprising in July and August, 2024. The Adviser made the plea in his testimony as a prosecution witness (PW)-19 in a case filed under the Crimes against Humanity over the killings of six innocent people in the capital's Chankharpul area on August 5, 2024. Asif Mahmud testified for the second day at the International Crimes Tribunal (ICT)-1 and was later cross-examined by the defence counsels.

Commerce Adviser Sk Bashir Uddin expressed hope that interest rates would reduce substantially early next year. The Adviser called upon the private sector to take collective responsibility and engage productively. The Adviser also urged businesses to come forward with three specific, actionable proposals -voluntary compliance, supervisory structures and regulatory changes. The Adviser made the remarks while speaking as the chief guest at the launching ceremony of the 4th edition of 'Bangladesh Business Climate Index (BBX-4) 2024-2025' at Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry, in the capital yesterday.

Cultural Affairs Adviser Mostofa Sarwar Farooki said, the country will begin its journey toward a festive election through the signing of the historic July National Charter 2025 today. The Adviser made the remarks at a press briefing on preparations for the July National Charter signing ceremony at the South Plaza of the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban yesterday. The Adviser also said, two tasks will proceed simultaneously: one is to demonstrate how the July Charter will change the nation's fate after its signing and to prepare communication materials, and the other is to ensure the journey toward a festive election.

Chief Prosecutor of the International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) Muhammad Tajul Islam yesterday said, the patriotic members of the Bangladesh Army had stood as a shield during the July Mass Uprising in 2024, when police were indiscriminately killing people. The Chief Prosecutor made the observation while presenting the concluding arguments for the prosecution in the crimes against humanity case against three, including the ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pranay Verma spoke about the enduring spiritual and cultural bond between India and Bangladesh, as reflected in the life and music of Fakir Lalon Shah. Speaking at a musical evening in Dhaka titled 'Lalon Sandhya' the High Commissioner noted that Lalon's philosophy of inclusion, harmony, compassion and humanity transcends national borders and continues to inspire both nations in their shared cultural journey.

Bangladesh Consulate General in Miami, USA has launched voter registration and National Identity (NID) services for Bangladeshi expatriates, enabling them to register as voters and receive NID-related services directly from the mission.
