### Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus asked for creating a 'command centre' for monitoring intensively the country's law and order situation. The Chief Adviser gave the directives while reviewing the law-and-order situation of the country in a high-level meeting of the Chiefs of law enforcing agencies. Home Adviser Lieutenant General (retired) Jahangir Alam Chowdhury, Special Assistant to Chief Adviser Khuda Baksh Chiowdhury, Home Secretary Nasimul Gani and Chiefs of Police, BGB, RAB, DMP, Coast Guard and Special Branch attended the meeting at state guesthouse Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

Planning Adviser Dr. Wahiduddin Mahmud termed Biman Bangladesh Airlines a frail organisation which incurred losses year after year. The Adviser said this while speaking at the press briefing on the recently submitted report of a task-force to develop strategies to boost the economy and mobilise resources for equitable and sustainable development at the NEC conference room in the planning Ministry. The Adviser also said that the Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus asked to find a way to make Biman a profitable organisation.

Home Affairs Adviser Lt. Gen. Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury (Retd.) called upon Kuwait to recruit more manpower from Bangladesh. The Adviser said this when Ambassador of Kuwait to Bangladesh Ali Tunyan Abdul Wahab Hamadah paid a courtesy call on him at Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. The Adviser also said, Kuwait is interested in taking more female domestic workers from Bangladesh. The Envoy promised to increase import of manpower from Bangladesh, saying, "Kuwait has always been by Bangladesh's side as a Muslim and Asian ally and will continue to be in future."

Home Adviser Lt. Gen. Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury (retd) called upon the media to publish the names involved behind the road blockades in the name of movements. The Adviser said this while replying to a question after coming out of a meeting on measures to ensure peaceful observance of the National Shaheed Day and International Mother Language Day on February 21 next. The Adviser also called upon the students to hold their demonstrations on their campuses and open spaces instead of blocking the roads which create immense public sufferings.

Foreign Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain stressed that the protracted Rohingya crisis is not solely Bangladesh's burden but a global issue that could threaten the entire region if left unaddressed. The Adviser said this at a seminar at the Foreign Service Academy (FSA) in the capital yesterday. The Adviser urged the international community to step up its support for the Rohingyas, warning that potential funding cuts by the new US administration could worsen the humanitarian crisis.

Information and Broadcasting Adviser Md. Nahid Islam said that the interim government is working relentlessly to bring a sustainable solution to the ongoing seven college issue. The Adviser said this while speaking to journalists after visiting the puja mandap at the Jagannath Hall playground of Dhaka University yesterday.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives and Youth and Sports Adviser Asif Mahmud Sojib Bhuiyan said, the people of Bangladesh do not want the return of Awami League in any way after conducting massive atrocities across the country. The Adviser told journalists after visiting the puja mandap at Dhaka University's Jagannath Hall playground yesterday.

Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam warned that the cohorts of the fallen fascist, who would disseminate leaflets undermining the interim government and law and order, would be arrested. The Chief Adviser's Press Secretary told a press briefing, held at Foreign Service Academy in the capital yesterday. Killings of 23 minority people, mentioned in the recent report of Bangladesh Hindu Buddha Christian Unity Council, was not found any connection with communal violence, Chief Adviser's Deputy Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad Majumder said this at the same press briefing.

Election Commissioner (EC) Brig Gen (Retd) Abul Fazal Md. Sanaulah said that everyone is eagerly waiting for the upcoming election, as they have been deprived of the opportunity to vote for a long time. The EC made these remarks while addressing a view-sharing meeting on updating the voter list and the next parliamentary election with administrative and Election Commission officials at the conference hall of the Regional Election Office in Rajshahi yesterday.

The Human Rights Watch (HRW) yesterday found involvement of ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and some top military and civil officers in overseeing the enforced disappearances of the individuals. The US based Human Rights watchdog said this in its recently released 50-page report titled, "After the Monsoon Revolution: A Roadmap to Lasting Security Sector Reform in Bangladesh."

Bangladesh approved Pakistan's private airline, Fly Jinnah, to operate direct flights on the Karachi-Dhaka-Karachi route, resuming air connectivity between the two cities after nearly a decade. Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) Chairman Air Vice Marshal Md. Monjur Kabir Bhuiyan told BSS yesterday.

Rumor Scanner, a fact-checking body, detected 271 misinformation cases circulated online in January as it also published two statistical reports and a fact file during this period. According to data compiled from fact-check reports on Rumor Scanner's website, politics was the most affected category, with 114 cases, making up 42 percent of all misinformation detected. This was followed by 67 cases on national issues, 29 on international affairs, 18 on religion, 15 on entertainment and literature, 9 on education, 6 on fraud, and 5 on sports.

Four platoons of the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) were deployed in the capital's Mohakhali area to maintain law and order as the students of the Government Titumir College took to the street demanding upgradation of the college to a university. The Paramilitary force in a short message service confirmed their deployment at Mohakhali area yesterday.

The prime index of the Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE), DSEX, increased 19.70 points to settle at 5,145.84 points yesterday.
