**Newsbrief**

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus greeted the newly appointed Prime Minister of Nepal Sushila Karki. The Chief Adviser said this in a congratulatory message yesterday. The Chief Adviser also said, he is looking forward to work closely with the new Nepalese Prime Minister to further strengthen the deep rooted ties of friendship, cooperation and mutual respect that exist between the two countries.

Finance, Science and Technology Adviser Dr Salehuddin Ahmed said that investment must be increased further in education and research in concerned sectors and thus promote adaptive technologies to secure agricultural future. The Adviser said this while addressing the inaugural session of the 3rd Youth Forum on Agricultural Biotechnology as the chief guest held at North South University yesterday.

The government unveiled the draft National Human Rights Commission Ordinance 2025 at a function in Cox's Bazar yesterday, marking a significant step forward in the country's commitment to human rights protection and alignment with international standards. The event, titled 'Stakeholder Consultation on the Reform of the National Human Rights Commission Act 2009', was organized by the Legislative and Parliamentary Affairs Division under the Ministry of Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs, in collaboration with the United Nations Development Programme through its Strengthening Institutions, Policies and Services (SIPS) Programme, with support from the Embassy of Switzerland. Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Dr Asif Nazrul said, a truly independent and accountable Human Rights Commission can only thrive when it is free from political influence and rooted in citizen participation.

Liberation War Affairs Adviser Faruk-e-Azam called for an impartial and merit-based evaluation of sports organizers and athletes, urging an end to politically motivated interference in the management of sports in the country. The Adviser made the call while speaking at a discussion with the CJKS Club Association in Chattogram yesterday. The Adviser stressed that sports organizations must be assessed based on performance, competence and dedication, not on their political leanings.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter called upon all concerned to stop the indiscriminate use of antibiotics in livestock, warning that such practices contribute to antimicrobial resistance in bacteria, which could pose a serious threat to human health in the future. The Adviser made the remarks while delivering her speech as chief guest at the formal inauguration and workshop-2025 of the Bangladesh Livestock Research Institute Regional Centre at Eco Heritage Hotel and Resort in Syedpur in Nilphamary yesterday.

Social Welfare Adviser Sharmin S Murshid said, the country will be built afresh through remembering all the kids who had sacrificed their lives like Farhan Faiyaz. The Adviser said this as the chief guest while attending a football match and doa mahfil marking the 18th birth anniversary of Martyred Farhan Faiyaz at Shahid Farhan Faiyaz playground in Dhaka the day before yesterday.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr AFM Khalid has sought cooperation of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) in the Halal certification activities in Bangladesh. The Adviser sought this cooperation while exchanging views with the officials after visiting the 'Standing Committee on Scientific and Technological Cooperation Centre' in Islamabad of Pakistan the day before yesterday.

Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) Affairs Adviser Supradip Chakma called for resolving longstanding land-related issues in the CHT through inclusive dialogue among all concerned parties. The Adviser made the observation while addressing a workshop as the chief guest on digitizing land management in the hill districts. The workshop, held at the Deputy Commissioner's Conference Room, was organized under the Land Management Automation Project of the Ministry of Land and facilitated by the District Administration.

Commerce Adviser Sheikh Bashir Uddin said, uninterrupted supply of goods is the key to market management. The Adviser also said, due to the government's comprehensive efforts during the last Ramadan, the supply chain remained stable, keeping the prices of essentials low. 


