Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus yesterday said that the talent and hard work of workers and owners remain behind the progress of each sector in the country. The Chief Adviser said this in a message on the 'Great May Day-2025' and the 'National Occupational Health and Safety Day'. To rebuild this country, all must strengthen the atmosphere of unity, mutual respect and trust, said Professor Yunus. If the trend of unity and cooperation continue, then building a new discrimination-free Bangladesh, dreamt by students-workers- people in July-August movement, will not remain as a mere dream but a reality, the Chief Adviser added.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus directed the authorities concerned to quickly conclude talks with potential foreign investors aiming to increase the capacity of the Chattogram port and ensure world-class services to port users. He came up with the directives at a high-level meeting with officials of the Ministry of Shipping, Bangladesh Investment Development Authority, Bangladesh Economic Zone Authority, Chittagong Port Authority and other relevant entities at the state guest house Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the government's efforts will continue to build a modern air force, ready to face any challenge to the country's sovereignty and independence. He made the remarks while addressing a function marking the exercise of Bangladesh Air Force at BAF Base Bir Uttam AK Khandker in the capital yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, Bangladesh Army has set an example by building houses for flood victims maintaining standard and transparency. The Chief Adviser was virtually addressing the houses handover function in the four districts from his Office in the capital's Tejgaon yesterday. Noting that quality of the houses and proper utilisation of allocation were ensured in the project implemented by the Bangladesh Army, the Chief Adviser said even the project was done with half of the 50-crore budget allocated for building houses.

Home Affairs Adviser Lieutenant General Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury (Retd) said that reciprocal visa exemption agreement between Bangladesh and Algeria will be signed soon for diplomatic and official passport holders. He made the remarks as Algerian Ambassador to Bangladesh Dr. Abdelouahab Saidani paid a courtesy call on him at his office at the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday.

Agriculture Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, the partnership with Japan will be further intensified for agricultural development. He made the remarks during a meeting with Japanese Ambassador to Bangladesh Saida Shinichi at his office at Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. Describing Japan as one of the main partners and a tested friend in the development of Bangladesh, the Adviser said that through the Japan International Cooperation Agency, the country has been extensively supporting the development of Bangladesh's agricultural sector.

Turkish Ambassador to Bangladesh Ramis Sen called on Information and Broadcasting Adviser Md. Mahfuj Alam at his office in the Secretariat yesterday. During the meeting, discussions were held on developing relations between Bangladesh Betar, Bangladesh Television and Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha and Turkish Radio, Television and Anadolu Agency. At the meeting, Ambassador Ramis Sen expressed his interest in developing economic and commercial relations between Bangladesh and Turkiye.

Industries Adviser Adilur Rahman Khan put emphasis on enriching the list of Geographical Indication status of Bangladeshi products commercially. The Adviser said the participation of all concerned, including the government, is essential while local entrepreneurs or producers will be empowered subsequently. He said this while speaking at the 'World Intellectual Property Day 2025' discussion, organized by the 'Department of Patents, Industrial Designs and Trademarks of the Ministry of Industries at the Foreign Service Academy in the capital yesterday.

Fisheries and Livestock Advisor Farida Akter said that the fisheries and livestock sectors have been deprived of its desired benefits following the separation of the sectors from the agriculture sector. The Adviser made the observation while speaking as chief guest at the closing ceremony of the two-day 'CVASU Fish Festival-2025' organized jointly by Faculty of Fisheries of Chattogram Veterinary and Animal Sciences University (CVASU) and Bangladesh Shrimp and Fish Foundation held at CVASU in Chattogram the day before yesterday.

The Election Commission (EC) adopted a zero-tolerance policy against the inclusion of Rohingyas in the national voter list, announcing that any person to be identified as Rohingya will be removed immediately. Election Commissioner Abul Fazal Md. Sanaullah told reporters after a meeting of the commission yesterday.

Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam said, Bangladesh respects the sovereignty and independence of all nations. He wrote this in a statement posted on his verified Facebook account the day before yesterday. He said the comments made by Major General (Retd) ALM Fazlur Rahman, the Head of the BDR commission, in his social media account was made in his capacity.

The Chief Adviser's Press Wing said, the statements by Tania Amir over the 2009 Bangladesh Rifles mutiny are misleading, claiming these remarks reflect her own political agenda as a supporter of the deposed Awami League regime. The press wing said this in a statement yesterday. The press wing's statement was posted on its verified Facebook page CA Press Wing Facts.

Petrobangla paid all external outstanding LNG payments worth US\$ 3,739.95 million ahead of two months of its payment schedule fixed on June 30. Of the total amounts, the ousted Awami League government left US\$737.46 million in arrears. After assuming the office, the interim government took steps to clear all external overdues as part of its plan to regularize the payment of energy bills. Petrobangla said this in a statement yesterday.
