Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus returned home this evening wrapping up his brief UAE visit to attend the World Governments Summit (WGS) and other side events in Dubai. CA's Deputy Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad Majumder told BSS yesterday.

Earlier, the Chief Adviser vowed that he would not allow key figures from the ousted Sheikh Hasina regime to escape punishment, noting that the people of Bangladesh will not forgive his administration if they fail to bring them to justice. The Chief Adviser told UAE state-owned English daily The National, mentioning that deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina and her senior officials would be sought out and returned home to face the full force of the law.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus's tour to Dubai helped Bangladesh strengthen its relations with the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam said. The Chief Adviser's Press Secretary told a press conference in Dubai yesterday.

Bangladesh Ambassador to Italy Rokebul Haque sought cooperation from Mayor of Rome for the wellbeing of Bangladeshi community residing in the capital of Italy. The Envoy made the urge when he met the Mayor of Rome Roberto Gualtieri at Mayor's office at Via del Campidoglio on Thursday. During the meeting, the Ambassador expressed his keenness to work with the Rome City Administration to facilitate the social integration and welfare of the Bangladeshi community, living and contributing to the Italian society as well as enhancing cooperation between city authorities of Bangladesh and Italy.

The first meeting of the National Consensus Commission with the political parties begins today. Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus, also the Chairman of the commission will preside over the meeting. The meeting will begin at Foreign Service Academy, according to the Chief Adviser's Press Wing. the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday. The interim government continues talks with foreign agencies to set up skill development centres in Bangladesh, the Chief Adviser's Press Wing added.

Indian Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said that Bangladesh was a topic of discussion between Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump. The Indian Foreign Secretary said, PM Modi shared his views and concerns regarding recent developments in Bangladesh and how India perceives the situation. The Indian Foreign Secretary made the remarks during a briefing in Washington yesterday as PM Modi's visit to the USA continues.

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) standing committee member Mirza Abbassaid there will be no room for Awami League or opportunists in BNP. The BNP Standing Committee Member said this while addressing a membership renewal ceremony of the Dhaka City South BNP at the party's central office in Naya Paltan yesterday.

UNICEF yesterday said, it seeks a justice system fit for children that ends their criminalisation. UNICEF Representative in Bangladesh Rana Flowers said this in a statement in response to the OHCHR fact-finding report "Human Rights Violations and Abuses related to the Protests of July and August 2024 in Bangladesh. For Children who are found by

the courts to have committed a crime, she called for expanding the alternatives to detention—diversion programs, probation, and restorative justice that replaces punitive approaches that inflict lasting harm. Flowers said Bangladesh is at a moment of great hope, change, and transformation.

Necessary reforms to the country's overall structure must be carried out first, followed by a free and fair election, said the Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami. The Party Ameer, Shafiqur Rahman, made the remarks while speaking as the chief guest at a public rally organised by Narsingdi District Jamaat at the grounds of Satirpara Kali Kumar Institution School and College yesterday.

Biman Bangladesh Airlines reduced ticket prices for workers travelling to Saudi Arabia and Malaysia. The Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism introduced the initiative, according to a press release issued on Thursday.

The second phase of the 58th Bishwa Ijtema, the second largest congregation of the Muslims, began on the bank of the Turag River at Tongi in the early hours of yesterday, Mohammad Sayem, Media Coordinator for Saad followers confirmed yesterday.
