Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has focused on the importance of SAARC to enhance regional cooperation, saying SAARC is a family of very close family members. The whole idea of SAARC was born in Bangladesh, which promoted this idea in all the South Asian countries, the Chief Adviser said this while speaking at an event hosted by Asia Society in New York of USA the day before yesterday. The event titled 'A Conversation with Bangladesh's Chief Adviser Dr Muhammad Yunus' was moderated by Kyung wha Kang, President and Chief Executive Officer of Asia Society.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the young people are recognised as agents of change around the world, suggesting creating employment opportunities for them. The Chief Adviser made the remarks while addressing the High-Level Meeting on the 30th Anniversary of World Program of Action for Youth at the UN headquarters in New York yesterday on the sidelines of the 80th UN General Assembly.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, healthcare should not be left to money makers. The Chief Adviser mentioned that there was a tremendous opportunity for money making in the name of healthcare. The Chief Adviser made the remarks while speaking at the 'UNGA High Level Working Session: Transforming Primary Healthcare-Bangladesh's Blueprint' in New York of USA the day before yesterday.

President of Kosovo, Vjosa Osmani, met Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly in New York of USA the day before yesterday. The meeting, held at a hotel of New York, covered a range of issues of mutual interest, including migration, trade, commerce and people-to-people exchanges. President Osmani expressed her gratitude to Bangladesh for its early and continued support for Kosovo, noting that Bangladesh was among the first countries to recognize the Southeast European nation.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus called on the US companies to invest more in Bangladesh as he spoke at the US-Bangladesh Executive Business Roundtable, titled 'Advancing Reform, Resilience and Growth' in New York of USA the day before yesterday. The US-Bangladesh Business Council organized the event at a hotel in New York in the USA.

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif met Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly at the UN Headquarters in New York the day before yesterday. During the meeting, the two leaders discussed a wide range of issues, including Bangladesh's upcoming general elections, reforms introduced by the interim government, the recent devastating floods in Pakistan, trade and investment and prospects for regional cooperation.

President of the Club de Madrid and former President of Slovenia, Danilo Türk, met Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at his hotel in New York the day before yesterday. During the meeting, Danilo Türk extended an invitation to the Chief Adviser to become a member of the organization. He commended Prof Yunus's pioneering work in microcredit, noting its global impact. Referring to the recent July Uprising in Bangladesh, Türk remarked that the movement had astonished the world and emphasised the importance for global leaders to better understand such transformations.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus sought Dutch support for establishing cold storage facilities in Bangladeshi villages to help preserve perishable agricultural products during harvesting season. The Chief Adviser made the formal request during a meeting with Dutch Prime Minister Dick Schoof on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly at the UN headquarters in the USA yesterday.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change and Water Resources Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan has emphasized that a just transition is not possible without ensuring workers' dignity and adopting worker-centred policies. The Adviser made these remarks while addressing the closing ceremony of 'Just Transition Convention Bangladesh 2025' at a hotel of Dhaka yesterday. The Adviser further stressed the need for timely payment of wages, fair and respectful treatment of workers and ensuring safe working environments.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, cooperation with China is essential for economic transformation. The Adviser said this while addressing Dhaka-China Day 2025 at North South University in the capital yesterday.

Labour and Employment Adviser Brigadier General (Retd) Dr M Sakhawat Hossain made a call to Azerbaijan to recruit more skilled workers from Bangladesh. The Adviser made a call while meeting with the country's Minister of Labor and Social Security Anar Aliyev in Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan yesterday.

Chief Justice Dr. Syed Refaat Ahmed vowed to implement cent percent the roadmap announced for bringing reform to the judiciary. The Chief Justice was addressing a regional seminar on Judicial Independence and Efficiency as the chief guest at Grand Park Hotel in Barishal district yesterday.

Chief Adviser's Special Envoy Lutfey Siddiqi has warned of the potential perils of artificial intelligence (AI) despite having enormous benefits. The Special Envoy told the Security Council High-Level Open Debate on 'Artificial Intelligence and International Peace and Security' held at the UN Headquarters in New York the day before yesterday.
