**Newsbrief**

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus held a meeting with the Chiefs of Reform Commissions formed to expedite the state reform initiatives. The meeting was held at the Chief Adviser's Office in Tejgaon area yesterday. During the meeting, the Chiefs of Reform Commissions informed the Chief Adviser of the progress of the reform works taken by their Commissions.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus urged South Korea to come up with more investment in Bangladesh and recruit more Bangladeshi workers, especially in shipbuilding industry. The Chief Adviser made the call when South Korean Ambassador in Dhaka Park Young-sik called on him at his office in Tejgaon area yesterday.

Finance and Commerce Adviser Dr. Salehuddin Ahmed laid emphasis on using modern and automated technologies to increase productivity of shrimp for earning foreign currencies. The Adviser came up with observation while exchanging views with the leaders of the Bangladesh Frozen Foods Exporters Association at the Finance Ministry conference room in the capital yesterday.

Foreign Adviser Md. Touhid Hossin called upon nations with advanced technology to share expertise for fostering a globally coordinated approach to combating terrorism. The Adviser said this while addressing the Ministerial Session of the High-Level Conference on "Strengthening International Counter-Terrorism Cooperation and Building Agile Border Security Mechanisms" in Kuwait yesterday.

Home Adviser Lt. Gen. Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury (Retd.) said, they have always supported the independence and sovereignty of Palestine. The Adviser made the remarks when Palestinian Ambassador to Bangladesh Yousef SY Ramadan paid a courtesy call on him at his Secretariat office in Dhaka yesterday.

Earlier, the Home Adviser called for maintaining strict vigilance and the highest security in the bordering areas saying no negligence should be shown to prevent smuggling for national interest. The Adviser said this while speaking at a view exchange meeting with Border Guard Bangladesh officers at its Headquarters in Dhaka yesterday.

Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology Adviser Md. Nahid Islam said, general election will be held on the basis of national unity after all necessary reforms. The Adviser said this while Norway Ambassador Hakon Arald Gulbrandsen made a call on him at his office at ICT division in Dhaka yesterday. The Adviser sought advices and cooperation of Norway to rebuild the country. The Ambassador assures the adviser to extend all out cooperation to the interim government to rebuild the country.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan today said 10 streets in Dhaka city will be declared horn-free in January next. The Adviser made the remark while speaking at the Grand Finale of the "Shahid Selim BUFT National Debate Competition - 2024" held at BGMEA University of Fashion & Technology in Uttara of Dhaka yesterday.

Health and Family Welfare Adviser Nurjahan Begum underscored the need for ensuring proper treatment for patients at union-upazila level to reduce pressure on district level hospitals in the country. The Adviser said this while talking to journalists after visiting the Chittagong Medical College Hospital yesterday.

Shipping, Textiles and Jute Adviser Brigadier General (Retired) M Sakhawat Hossain gave directives for delivery of the goods at the Pangaon river port in the shortest possible time to make the port more efficient and profitable. The Adviser said this after visiting Pangaon River Port, Ananda Shipyards, Dockyard and Engineering Works and Deck and Engine Personnel Training Center to review the ongoing projects and activities of the port in Dhaka yesterday.

A group of 70 stranded Bangladeshi expatriates from war-torn Lebanon arrived safely in Dhaka last Monday on an Emirates Airlines flight (EK-584), fully funded by the Bangladeshi government, according to a press release issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs yesterday.

At least six patients died of dengue in the last 24 hours while 1297 were hospitalized till Monday morning, according to the Directorate General of Health Services yesterday.
