Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus yesterday issued a message on the occasion of the 'Public Engineering Day 2025' and the 55th founding anniversary of the Institution of Diploma Engineers, Bangladesh (IDEB). Public Engineering Day is celebrated in Bangladesh on 8th November, coinciding with the founding anniversary of IDEB. This year's theme, 'Skilled manpower - the cornerstone of nation building,' is very time befitting, the Adviser added. The Chief Adviser also wished every success to all the programmes undertaken to mark Public Engineering Day and IDEB's founding anniversary.

Youth and Sports Adviser Asif Mahmud Shojib Bhuiyan said that the Sepoy-People's Revolution of 1975 and the July Uprising of 2024 emerged from the same socio-political context. The Adviser made the remarks while speaking at a roundtable discussion titled 'From November to July: From Revolution to Revolution' organized by the Anti-Discrimination Student Movement at the Tofazzal Hossain Manik Mia Hall of the National Press Club yesterday, marking the National Revolution and Solidarity Day.

Bangladesh will take all possible steps to help address Japan's projected shortage of 11 million workers by 2040, Senior Secretary of the Ministry of Expatriates Welfare and Overseas Employment Dr Neyamat Ullah Bhuiyan said yesterday. He said that both countries would benefit from joint efforts by Bangladeshi and Japanese recruiting organizations to meet Japan's growing labour demand while ensuring decent employment opportunities for skilled Bangladeshi workers. The Senior Secretary made the remarks at a seminar titled "Bangladesh: A Highly Potential Source Country of Skilled Human Resources for Japan", held at a conference centre in Nagoya, Japan, organized by the Bangladesh Embassy in Tokyo, according to a message yesterday.

Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam reiterated that the national polls will be held in February next, noting that those spreading confusion over the elections are 'cohorts of the fallen autocratic government'. The Press Secretary said this while exchanging views with journalists at Netrakona Circuit House in Netrakona yesterday.

Bangladesh has called for adequate and predictable financial resources, along with a strong international partnership, to ensure inclusive social development that leaves no one behind. Bangladesh made the call as an inter-ministerial delegation attended the three-day Second World Summit for Social Development, which concluded in Doha, Qatar, according to a release from the Ministry of Social Welfare yesterday.

The Election Commission (EC) has completed all necessary preparations to hold the 13th national Parliamentary elections in the first half of February next year. Election Commissioner Abdur Rahmani Masud said this in an exclusive interview with the national news agency BSS yesterday.

The National Consensus Commission has refuted claims that the commission spent Taka 83 crore on hospitality, stating that its total expenditure was Taka 1.71 crore, of which Taka 45 lakh was spent on hospitality. Chief Adviser's Press Wing said this in a statement yesterday.
