Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has returned home concluding his three-day state visit to Malaysia. Chief Adviser's Deputy Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad Majumder said this yesterday. Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim called the Chief Adviser by mobile phone when Prof Yunus and the Bangladesh delegation arrived at the Kuala Lumpur International Airport. Malaysian Home Minister Saifuddin Ismail was at the airport to say a hearty good bye to the Chief Adviser.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus urged Malaysia's leading conglomerates to invest in Bangladesh's affordable housing, ports, healthcare and education sectors. The call came during a series of meetings at Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia yesterday with some of Malaysia's most prominent business leaders. Chief Adviser said, it is time to invest in Bangladesh, highlighting the reforms undertaken by his government to create a more business-friendly environment.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the interim government is committed to strengthening democracy and giving power back to the people of Bangladesh. Chief Adviser made the remarks while delivering his speech at a special convocation ceremony of University Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) in Malaysia yesterday. Chief Adviser also said, the youth-led uprising in July and August 2024 has given new meaning to the national identity and hopes for the future. The ceremony was arranged on the university campus to confer an honorary doctorate on Prof. Yunus in recognition of his contribution to promotion of social business.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain said, maintaining a balance in international relations is always a challenge. This challenge has become even greater over the past year. Foreign Affairs Adviser told this in an article which was published in a national daily today. Foreign Affairs Adviser also said, they have said from the very beginning that they want a 'good working relationship' with India based on mutual interests and respect.

Primary and Mass Education Adviser Professor Dr Bidhan Ranjan Roy Podder said, the role of head teachers is crucial in improving the quality of education. The adviser made the remark while speaking as the chief guest at the inaugural ceremony of a training Programme at Cox's Bazar Leadership Training Centre in Cox's Bazar yesterday.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, the sacrifices of martyrs and the injured in the historic July Mass Uprising have given birth to a new Bangladesh. The Adviser made the remarks while speaking as the chief guest at a discussion held at Mirpur in Dhaka yesterday. Fisheries and Livestock Adviser also said, Bangladesh is a country where no one can survive for long by doing injustice.

Religious Affairs Adviser A F M Khalid Hossain said, the July Mass Uprising has opened the door wide for turning Bangladesh into a welfare state. The adviser made the remarks while speaking as the chief guest at a seminar at the IDEB council hall in Dhaka yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Adviser Md. Mahfuj Alam yesterday called upon the officials of the National Institute of Mass Communication (NIMC) to utilize the institutional opportunities for human resources development. The Adviser also called upon the Bangladesh Cinema and Television Institute officials to work on improving the quality of training programmes. He said, NIMC has many opportunities to work for human resource development. These opportunities should be utilized properly and urged the BCTI authority to modernize the training curriculum.

The two officials discussed recent developments in Myanmar, voicing serious concern over the worsening humanitarian situation in Rakhine State and the decline in international financial support for Rohingyas sheltered in Bangladesh.

Chief Adviser's Special Assistant for Economic Affairs Anisuzzaman Chowdhury said, Bangladesh's economy remains stable despite economic crises across the world and the recent political change in the country. Chief Adviser's Special Assistant for Economic Affairs said this while speaking at an event titled 'Foreign Investors Summit 2025' at a hotel in Dhaka yesterday. Anisuzzaman Chowdhury also said, the country's GDP has remained largely unaffected despite the recent political change.

A delegation from the U.S. Embassy in Dhaka met with Mahmud Hasan Khan, President of Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA), at BGMEA Complex in Dhaka yesterday. During the meeting, various issues of mutual interest were discussed, with a particular focus on strengthening bilateral trade relations between the United States and Bangladesh.

Bangladesh has categorically rejected the latest Chair's Draft of the proposed Global Plastics Treaty, demanding stronger measures against plastic pollution, and stating that it falls far short of the mandate set by United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA) Resolution 5/14 to establish an internationally legally binding instrument to end plastic pollution. The rejection was announced during the second part of the fifth session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee on Plastic Pollution (INC-5.2), held on August 13, 2025, at the Palais des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland.




