### Newsbrief

The Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the July Uprising will be observed to resist reemergence of autocracy in the country. He also urged the countrymen to observe the July Uprising as a month of renaissance and unity. The Chief Adviser said this while inaugurating a month-long programme to commemorate the July Uprising at his office in Dhaka yesterday. After inaugurating the month-long programme, the Chief Adviser handed over the scholarship's cheques among three NU students.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) A M M Nasir Uddin said, the Election Commission would be capable of conducting a free and fair election with the support of the people. The CEC said this while talking to journalists at the Election Building in the capital's Agargaon yesterday.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan said that 'Degraded Airsheds' will soon be declared to control air pollution in Dhaka city. A scientific expert committee will be formed to provide recommendations on this matter. The Adviser made the remarks while presiding over a high-level meeting held at the Department of Environment in Agargaon yesterday to determine effective measures to tackle Dhaka's worsening air quality.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan emphasised the urgent need for accountability, coordination and youth involvement in climate adaptation efforts across Bangladesh. The Adviser made these remarks during a meeting with a high-level UNICEF Bangladesh delegation, led by Country Representative Rana Flowers at the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday.

The Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) is going to run the New Mooring Container Terminal (NCT) as the government has already taken final decision to take over the terminal from private operator Saif Powertec Ltd. Shipping Adviser Brigadier General (Retd) Dr M Sakhawat Hossain, Planning Adviser Wahiduddin Mahmud, and Special Envoy to the Chief Adviser for International Affairs Lutfey Siddiqi visited the port on Saturday and gave directions for the management of NCT after meeting with the officials concerned and stakeholders. CPA Secretary Omar Farooq said this to reporters yesterday.

Primary and Mass Education Adviser Professor Dr Bidhan Ranjan Roy Podder said that the elimination of discrimination in society is only possible through the establishment of true democracy. The Adviser made the remark while speaking as the chief guest at a discussion and prayer meeting held at the Dhakeshwari National Temple in the capital yesterday marking the anniversary of the historic July Uprising.

Social Welfare, Women and Children Affairs Adviser Sharmeen S Murshid said that the July uprising was a milestone for justice and struggle for establishing democracy in Bangladesh. She said this while taking part a discussion in memory of July revolution at her Ministry conference room yesterday.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr A F M Khalid Hossain said that July uprising martyrs had shown the path of freedom in the country. The Adviser said this while addressing a discussion and doa mahfil organized in memory of the July martyrs at the North Kutubkhali Central Jame Masjid at Jatrabari area in the capital yesterday. The event was organized by the Ministry of Religious Affairs.




