Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the interim government is committed to making the judiciary independent and efficient. The Chief Adviser also said, the faith of this crucial aspiration and initiative depends entirely on their collective efforts. The Chief Adviser told the national seminar on Judicial Independence and Efficiency at the InterContinental Hotel in Dhaka yesterday.

The interim government's Advisory Council (AC) gave its final approval to Tk 7,90,000 crore national budget for the fiscal year 2025–26 (FY26) which was placed on June 2 in a pre-recorded broadcast. The budget got final clearance at the AC meeting with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus in the chair at his office in Dhaka yesterday.

Chief Justice Syed Refaat Ahmed emphasized the urgent need for a separate judicial secretariat to ensure administrative autonomy and drive structural reforms within the judiciary. Speaking at the national seminar on judicial independence and efficiency at the InterContinental Hotel in Dhaka yesterday, the Chief Justice declared that the judiciary is fulfilling its role as a fully-fledged constitutional organ of the state.

Finance Adviser Dr Salehuddin Ahmed said, the budget for the coming fiscal eyed a 5.5 percent GDP growth while containing the inflation within 6.50 percent. The Adviser said this while speaking at a press conference at his ministry yesterday.

Foreign Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain urged the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) to assume a stronger and more coordinated role to ensure justice for persecuted Rohingyas, as Bangladesh faces growing humanitarian and security pressures from millions of displaced Myanmar nationals. The Foreign Adviser made the urges while addressing the OIC Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee meeting on accountability for human rights violations against Rohingyas, held in Istanbul yesterday.

Bangladesh expressed deep concern over the recent attacks targeting nuclear facilities in the Islamic Republic of Iran. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a statement in this regard yesterday. Bangladesh called upon the United Nations and the international community to engage proactively in efforts to de-escalate the situation and promote peace and stability in the Middle East. Bangladesh firmly believed that constructive engagement, mutual respect and adherence to international norms remain the only sustainable path to enduring peace, the statement added.

Foreign Ministry said, the first group of Bangladeshi nationals willing to return from conflict-hit Iran is expected to arrive home next week, as the government has initiated a coordinated repatriation process in cooperation with neighboring countries. The Foreign Ministry said this in a statement yesterday.

The government has issued a rejoinder to an article titled 'The truth will out: How press freedom is suppressed in Bangladesh' published on the website of Commonwealth Journalists Association on June 20, 2025. The article was written by William Horsley, an Executive Committee member of the Commonwealth Journalists Association. The rejoinder was posted on the Facebook page of the Chief Adviser's Press Wing - CA Press Wing Facts-yesterday.

Army Chief General Waker-Uz-Zaman said, Bangladesh Navy has become a modern, technology-based and three-dimensional force to meet the challenges of the 21st century. The Army Chief made the remarks while addressing as the chief guest at the Bangladesh Navy's summer presidential parade, held at Chattogram Naval Academy yesterday.

Police yesterday arrested former Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) KM Nurul Huda from his residence in the capital's Uttara area. A case was lodged by the BNP against him and 23 others. Deputy Commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police Muhammad Talebur Tahman confirmed this.

One more death and 329 fresh cases were reported from dengue in the last 24 hours till Sunday morning, according to the Directorate General of Health Services said yesterday.




