### Newsbrief

Abdul Samad Dawood, CEO of Engro Holdings of Pakistan, called on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna yesterday to discuss investment opportunities in Bangladesh. During the meeting, the Engro CEO expressed a strong interest in expanding the company's footprint in Bangladesh, particularly in telecommunications and energy sectors. The Chief Adviser emphasised the importance of sustainable and forward-looking collaboration. The Chief Adviser also encouraged Engro's leadership to visit Bangladesh again and see the scope for collaboration across sectors.

Home Affairs Adviser Lieutenant General Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury (Retd.) called upon all not take law into own hands, warning to take tougher action against organized mob. The Adviser said this while speaking to newsmen after visiting the Airport Police Station in Sylhet yesterday.

UK trade envoy to Bangladesh, Rt. Hon. the Baroness Rosie Winterton met Commerce Adviser Sk. Bashir Uddin at his office at Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. During the meeting, they discussed issues related to bilateral interests, improvement in trade, commerce and investment. He urged the UK trade envoy to involve the private sector to further expand the bilateral trade. She also expressed her interest to support in trade negotiation capacity building and framing trade policy as part of the supporting the Ministry of Commerce.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan reaffirmed Bangladesh's readiness to lead in sustainable development and trade-driven green growth. She expressed interest in exploring comprehensive economic partnership agreements with developed countries. The Adviser made these observations during a meeting with Ratnakar Adhikari, Executive Director of the Enhanced Integrated Framework at the World Trade Organization at Pani Bhaban of the capital yesterday.

Education Adviser Professor Dr. C R Abrar visited several SSC and equivalent examination centres in the capital yesterday. After visiting Motijheel Government Boys' High School, he told reporters that the examinations had begun in a peaceful atmosphere. The Adviser also urged all to refrain from spreading rumours about the exams.

Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Adviser Dr. Asif Nazrul said, they have taken measures to generate employment for Bangladeshis in developed countries including Japan. The Adviser said this while speaking as the chief guest at a signing ceremony of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between his Ministry and Japan's Onodera User Ran Incorporate on training and certification of Bangladeshi workers in the Specified Skill Workers category at the conference room of the Ministry yesterday.

Bangladesh and Algeria put emphasis on the prospects and enhanced cooperation in the energy sector, including establishment of a joint working group and possibility of high-level Ministerial visits. The discussion took place when Algerian Ambassador to Bangladesh Dr. Abdelouhab Saidani paid a courtesy call on Foreign Secretary Md. Jashim Uddin at the Foreign Ministry in Dhaka yesterday.

A specific roadmap would be framed with a timeframe of 18 months to 24 months to make the Bangladesh Investment Summit 2025 fully successful. Head of Business Development of Bangladesh Investment Development Authority (BIDA) Nahian Rahman Rochi said this at Hotel Intercontinental Dhaka yesterday on the final day of the investment summit.

Kiak Sung, founder of Korean EPZ said that with the right strategies and reforms, Bangladesh is poised to climb to the number one spot in global apparel exports. He said this while speaking as the keynote speaker at a session of the Bangladesh Investment Summit 2025. He delivered a presentation on 'Bangladesh moving forward: through an investor's lens' at the session on 'Textile and Apparel' at a hotel in the capital yesterday.

The investigation agency of the International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) is all set to submit probe reports in four crimes against humanity cases filed over the monstrous crimes committed during the July-August mass uprising, said ICT Chief Prosecutor Muhammad Tajul Islam. The Chief Prosecutor said these while addressing a views exchange with the reporters covering the regular activities of the tribunal yesterday.

Ministry of Public Administration yesterday issued a warning regarding the circulation of fake government notifications with forged signatures related to appointments and postings. The Ministry also said, all official orders related to recruitment, posting or transfer are published only on the Ministry's official website and through the Government Employee Management System.

The two-day 21st Inter-sessional Meeting on Counterterrorism and Transnational Crime of ASEAN Regional Forum concluded in the capital yesterday. The Inter-sessional Meeting discussed five priority areas including illicit drug, Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear Matters, Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism, Trafficking in Persons and Border Security Management. Foreign Ministry issued a press release in this regard yesterday.
