Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Prof. Muhammad Yunus yesterday called upon all to make joint efforts to build a prosperous Bangladesh full of clean environment and conserving biodiversity for future generations. The Chief Adviser made the call in a message, issued on the occasion of World Environment Day to be observed today in Bangladesh. In the message the Chief Adviser also said, the World Environment Day is being celebrated in Bangladesh like other countries of the world to increase public awareness on environmental protection.

Ambassador of the Republic of Kosovo to Bangladesh Lulzim Pllana paid his maiden call on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the state guest house Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. Reflecting on the spirit of the 'July Uprising' in Bangladesh, the Chief Adviser commended the people of Kosovo for their steadfast commitment to freedom, peace and national sovereignty. In response, the Ambassador expressed his sincere gratitude to the government and people of Bangladesh for their unwavering support in recognising the Republic of Kosovo as an independent and sovereign state.

The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC) approved a total of 17 projects involving an overall estimated cost of Taka 8,974.28 crore. The approvals came at an ECNEC meeting with its Chairperson and Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus in the chair held at the NEC Conference Room on the Planning Commission premises in the capital's Sher-e-Bangla Nagar area yesterday.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Prof. Dr. Asif Nazrul said, the Commonwealth Charter is not just a declaration rather a moral guideline that binds Bangladesh beyond its borders. The Law Adviser said this at the closing ceremony of the Commonwealth Charter Workshop- 2025 at a hotel in Dhaka yesterday. The Law Adviser also said, they will reform the appointment of judges in the higher judiciary and ensure transparency and competence in appointments through the Judicial Service Commission.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd.) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, the Election Commission (EC) will present the nation a good election and the government will extend all cooperation in this connection. The Adviser said this while replying to a question after coming out of the 10th Advisory Council meeting on the law and order at his Ministry in the Secretariat yesterday.

Meanwhile, Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd.) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, law enforcers are ready to hold the next parliamentary election anytime. The Adviser said this at a view-exchange meeting with the government officials at Deputy Commissioner Office in Tangail yesterday.

Liberation War Affairs Adviser Faruk-e-Azam said, the 'July fighters' of the student-people uprising will receive allowances from next month. The Adviser said this in an exclusive interview with the Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha at the Secretariat the day before yesterday.

Fisheries and Livestock Advisor Farida Akhter said, Bangladesh is a highly vulnerable country due to the adverse impact of global carbon emission. The Adviser said this at a workshop at Krishibid Institute Bangladesh in the capital yesterday.

British High Commissioner to Bangladesh Sarah Cooke said that the United Kingdom's newly launched Industrial Strategy is expected to further deepen the already robust economic partnership between the UK and Bangladesh. The British High Commissioner said this marking the formal launch of the strategy in London, according to a press release issued by the British High Commission in Dhaka yesterday.

An Australian delegation led by Australian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Susan Ryle paid a courtesy call on Inspector General of Police (IGP) Baharul Alam. The Australian Envoy along with Australian Federal Police Representative Matthew Craft met with the IGP at the Police Headquarters yesterday. During the meeting, discussions were held on cooperation between Bangladesh and Australian Federal Police in preventing human trafficking, money laundering and other crimes, according to a press release of the Police Headquarters.


