Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has given a message on the occasion of the '54th National Cooperative Day' to be observed today. The Chief Adviser extended his sincere greetings and congratulations to all cooperators and the people of the country marking the day. The Chief Adviser in his message yesterday said, ensuring social participation is essential for the successful implementation of any program undertaken for the development of the nation and its people. The Chief Adviser also wished every success to all programmes marking the 54th National Cooperative Day, 2025.

Foreign Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain called for collective international action to combat the rising threats of extremism and non-state armed groups, emphasizing intelligence sharing, border management, and financial oversight to disrupt transnational networks. The Adviser came up with the call while speaking at a special session titled 'Non-State Power and Influence: Regional and Transnational Challenges' during the 21st IISS Manama Dialogue in Bahrain, according to a Foreign Ministry's press in Dhaka yesterday. The Adviser said also that non-state actors exploit porous borders, illicit trade, displacement and digital platforms to advance radical agendas.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr A F M Khalid Hossain said, fifteen years of mismanagement cannot be cleaned up in fifteen months. The Adviser made the remarks while addressing as the chief guest at the 'Azimusshan Shan-e-Risalat Conference', organized by the Tawhidi Janata of Panchagarh district at the Darul Ulum Madinatul Islam Madrasa ground in Raushanbag area in Panchagarh yesterday.

Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam said that the national election will be held before February 15 regardless of the decision taken regarding the proposed referendum. The Press Secretary made the remarks while talking to reporters after attending the closing and prize-giving ceremony of an event organized by July Konnya Foundation at Noakhali Science and Technology University in Noakhali yesterday.

Election Commissioner Md. Anwarul Islam Sarker said, the schedule for the upcoming national election will be announced in the first week of December, while the polls will be held in February next year. The Election Commission told reporters at Patuakhali Circuit House in Patuakhali yesterday.

Attorney General Md. Asaduzzaman said that none would be allowed to deceive people in Bangladesh in the name of voting. The Attorney General said this while addressing a rally organized by BNP at Shailkupa of Jhenaidah district yesterday.

China said, Bangladesh's development vision and the Chinese Dream share deep similarities, reflecting shared aspirations for prosperity and offering broad prospects for enhanced cooperation between the two countries, especially between Guangzhou and Bangladesh. Director General of the Foreign Affairs Office of the Guangzhou Municipal People's Government Liu Liu made the remarks while hosting a dinner in honour of a visiting delegation of the Diplomatic Correspondents Association, Bangladesh at the Hilton Hotel in Guangzhou on Thursday.

Saint Martin's Island will reopen to tourists today after a nine-month closure, with a strict daily cap of 2,000 visitors to help preserve its fragile ecosystem and biodiversity. Additional Deputy Commissioner of Cox's Bazar Md. Shahidul Alam confirmed to the reporters at his office in Cox's Bazar yesterday saying the 12 government directives will be strictly implemented to safeguard the island's biodiversity.

A public notice was published on two widely circulated newspapers yesterday, terming 261 people including ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina fugitives in a sedition case, asking them to appear before the concerned court on November 11. The notice was published on daily Amar Desh and The Daily Star, with names and addresses of all the 261 fugitive accused.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police has arrested more than 3,000 leaders and activists of the banned Awami League and its affiliated organisations this year for participating in unauthorised flash processions across the capital. Law enforcement agencies have also begun efforts to bring the financiers of these processions under the purview of the law. The information was disclosed at a press briefing on yesterday.
