Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus sought support from the armed forces, police and other law enforcement agencies to hold the upcoming national elections in a peaceful and festive manner in the first half of February next. The Chief Adviser said this while addressing the Defence Services Command and Staff College (DSCSC) Course-2025 certificate distribution ceremony at a function at the DSCSC Complex in Mirpur Cantonment yesterday. Speaking about Bangladesh's student-people's bloody uprising last year, which ended the past regime, the Chief Adviser said, new hopes and aspirations have been created among the country's people.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus congratulated the Bangladesh National Football Team for their impressive 1-0 victory against India in the AFC Asian Cup Qualifiers. The victory, achieved in a packed stadium in the capital, marks Bangladesh's first competitive win over India in 22 years. The Chief Adviser said this in a message yesterday.

Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Adviser Dr Asif Nazrul urged the recruiting agencies, training centres and oversee employers to apply the Overseas Employment Platform (OEP) to ensure safe and dignified labour migration. The Adviser said the Bangladeshi migrant workers are the pride of the nation and their contribution to the country's economy is invaluable. The Adviser said this while speaking at the OEP launching ceremony at a hotel of Dhaka yesterday. The Adviser also said, the government's responsibility is to ensure the journey and overseas employment of the migrant workers are dignified, protected and well-supported.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said, there is no unrest in the country over the death penalty of Sheikh Hasina handed down by International Crime Tribunal. The Home Adviser said this while briefing journalists after a meeting on celebration of this year's Victory Day at his office at Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. The Home Adviser said there is no security threat surrounding the national celebration of the Victory Day. The Home Adviser expressed optimism that people across the country would celebrate Victory Day in a festive mood.

Land Adviser Ali Imam Majumder said, land acquisition is essential for the implementation of any major development project like construction of roads, bridges, sluice gates, dams, railway lines, hospitals, educational institutions, power projects or industrialization for national development. The Adviser said these while presiding over the 152nd meeting of the Central Land Allocation Committee held at the meeting room of the Ministry of Land yesterday.

Pakistan High Commissioner to Bangladesh Imran Haider paid a courtesy call on Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives and Youth and Sports Adviser Asif Mahmud Shojib Bhuyain at the latter's office at the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. During the meeting, various priority issues, including youth and cultural exchange programmes, youth development training, agricultural research, employment, sports, youth leadership and personality development activities were discussed.

Women and Children Affairs Adviser Sharmeen S Murshid asked the officers and employees of her Ministry to work efficiently from their respective positions upholding the spirit of July mass uprising. The Adviser gave the directives while speaking at a views-exchange meeting with officers and employees at the Department of Women Affairs in the capital yesterday. Earlier, the Adviser inspected the premises of the Department of Women Affairs and gave necessary directives to the officials and employees.

Bangladesh delegation to the Seventh NSA-level meeting of the Colombo Security Conclave (CSC), led by the national Security Adviser Dr Khalilur Rahman met with Indian national security Adviser Ajit Doval and his team in New Delhi yesterday. They discussed work of the CSC and key bilateral issues, read a press release issued by the Bangladesh high commission in New Delhi. Dr Rahman invited Doval to visit Bangladesh at his convenience, according to the press release.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) AMM Nasir Uddin said that it is necessary to formulate a clear law for conducting the referendum. The CEC said this while addressing the second session on the fourth-day of the dialogue with political parties marking the 13th parliament elections at the Nirbachan Bhaban in capital's Agargaon yesterday.

The government will block all cloned, illegally imported and smuggled mobile phones, said Chief Adviser's Special Assistant for the Ministry of Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology Faiz Ahmad Taiyeb yesterday. He said, illegal phones are linked to crimes including wrong SIM registration, online scams, bulk SMS fraud, tax and customs evasion, border smuggling and obstruction to local handset production, according to a press release of the Ministry of Posts, Telecommunications, and Information Technology.

Indian High Commissioner to Dhaka Pranay Verma underscored the strategic importance of the pharmaceutical sector in the Bangladesh-India economic partnership, stressing India's role as a trusted partner in APIs, process technologies and pharmaceutical machinery to support accessible healthcare across the region. The High Commissioner made the remark while speaking at the event titled 'PharmaConnect', hosted by the High Commission of India in Dhaka yesterday.

European Union has welcomed the interim government's revision of the Bangladesh Labour Act, calling it a crucial step toward stronger labour rights and essential for sustaining Bangladesh's long-term preferential access to the EU market. The reform carries significant importance as Bangladesh prepares for national elections in early 2026, stressing the need for effective implementation and policy continuity. The EU Mission in Dhaka said this in statement yesterday.

Bangladesh has strengthened its education diplomacy with the Maldives by expanding medical internship opportunities and reserving fresh MBBS and BDS seats for Maldivian students under the government's foreign scholarship programme, the Bangladesh High Commission in Male, said yesterday. The Mission also said, it has facilitated the second batch of medical internship placements for Maldivian students across several medical colleges in Bangladesh. Bangladesh High Commissioner to the Maldives Dr Md Nazmul Islam received a group of Maldivian students ahead of their travel to Bangladesh for clinical training.

Six more deaths were reported from dengue and 788 more patients were hospitalized in the past 24 hours till Wednesday morning, according to the Directorate General of Health Services said yesterday.
