Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the people of the country need to be made election-centric as they must be made aware that no one can snatch the ballot box. The Chief Adviser will open the second round of talks with political parties on reform work in the first week of June. The decision to hold the second round of talks was made at a meeting of the National Consensus Commission held at the State Guest House Jamuna last night, according to a statement of the Chief Adviser's press wing.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus will leave Dhaka tomorrow on a four-day official visit to Japan to attend the 30th Nikkei Forum and hold talks with Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba to boost bilateral cooperation. Acting Foreign Secretary Md. Ruhul Alam Siddique disclosed the details of the visit at a press briefing at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Dhaka yesterday.

With the aim of reaching various government services at the doorsteps of the commoners, 'Nagorik Sheba Bangladesh' has started its journey online with the slogan 'All Citizen Services at One Address'. Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus formally inaugurated the pilot project of this programme at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. Trained Nagorik Sheba entrepreneurs will provide these services to the general citizens from Nagorik Sheba Kendras.

Stephen Schneck, Chair of the US Commission on International Religious Freedom, met Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. Their discussions encompassed the state of religious freedom in Bangladesh, the July 2024 uprising, the Interim Government's reform agenda, proposed constitutional amendments, and the ongoing Rohingya crisis. During the meeting, the Chief Adviser also underscored the significant role of religion in Bangladesh and reaffirmed the government's dedication to ensuring religious harmony in the country of 171 million people.

Finance Adviser Dr Salehuddin Ahmed yesterday said, the interim government, headed by Professor Muhammad Yunus, wants to turn Bangladesh into a welfare-oriented state through improving the lives and livelihood of common people of the country. Talking at his office ahead of announcing the national budget for FY26 on June 2, the Finance Adviser highlighted the vision and objectives to be reflected in the forthcoming budget which would also be the first of its kind of the interim government.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Dr Asif Nazrul said that they are committed to hold the trial of the mass killing during July and August in 2024. The Adviser wrote this in his verified Facebook account yesterday. There has been a demand in the society of making the trial visible. The government made it visible eight months ago with reconstituting the International Crimes Tribunal, the Adviser added.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan said, the government is working to mitigate human-elephant conflicts. She said this while addressing a cheque distribution ceremony at Madhutilla Ecopark in Sherpur yesterday, where compensation was handed over to victims of human-elephant conflicts. The Environment Adviser also said, humans are occupying the elephants' natural habitats, leading to a decrease in their food sources.

Adviser for Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Asif Mahmud Sajib Bhuiyan said, all the wastages of sacrificial animals will be removed within 12 after and all preparations in this regard have been taken. The Adviser said this in a Facebook post yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Adviser Md. Mahfuj Alam said that the people of Bangladesh are enjoying the highest level of religious freedom. He made the remark during a meeting with a delegation from the US Commission on International Religious Freedom at the Industries Ministry yesterday. The Adviser also said, the government is extending full support to ensure the smooth celebration of religious festivals across different communities.

Adviser to the Ministries of Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Sharmeen S Murshid said, ensuring children's postnatal care and development is a collective duty for their holistic growth, as they form the very foundation of a nation's future. The Adviser made the remarks while addressing the opening ceremony of the two-day National ECD Conference 2025 at BRAC University in the capital yesterday.


Chittagong Hill Tracts Affairs (CHT) Affairs Adviser Supradip Chakma said, the hill communities should engage with the mainstream population keeping their distinct cultural identity. The Adviser made the remarks while addressing a workshop titled 'Localization and Acceleration of SDGs in the CHT' in the CHT Complex Auditorium on Bailey Road in the capital yesterday.

National Consensus Commission (NCC) Vice-Chairman Ali Riaz said, all political parties are in unanimous agreement on reinstating the caretaker government, while most have also voiced support for establishing a bicameral parliament. The NCC Vice-Chairman revealed this at a press conference held at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban, following the end of the first phase of the National Consensus Commission's discussions with political parties yesterday.

Bangladesh army's operations director Brigadier General M Nazim-ud-Daula said, the military has been working together with the government abiding by the government directives. He told a press conference responding to a question over military relations with the government at the Army Headquarters in Dhaka yesterday.

The government has officially issued the Government Service (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025, amending the Government Service Act, 2018. The ordinance was promulgated the day before yesterday following the Interim Government's Advisory Council meeting held last Thursday. In the meeting, the draft of the amendment was reviewed and approved.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) requested all to abide by its directives relating to imposing a ban on holding all kind of rallies, meetings, processions and mass gatherings at Bangladesh Secretariat, the government office of the Chief Adviser, Jamuna and its adjoining areas. The DMP said this in a statement yesterday.


