Newsbrief

Chief Justice Syed Refaat Ahmed said, nearly 80 percent of the judicial reform programme announced earlier has already been implemented. The Chief Justice said this while speaking as the chief guest at a discussion titled 'July Uprising: Judicial Reforms' organized by the Supreme Court Bar Association at its auditorium yesterday. The Chief Justice stressed the need for completing the process of ensuring full institutional autonomy of the judiciary, enhancing transparency in its functions, maintaining discipline in the conduct of judicial officers and extending the reform process to every court across the country.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd.) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury urged all quarters to remain vigilant and united against any attempt to thwart the upcoming 13th parliamentary election. The Adviser made the remarks while responding to questions about possible conspiracy to foil the national election following a meeting of the core committee on law and order at his Ministry in the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. The Adviser also called upon all the political parties to remain united forgetting all the personal and party interest to begin the journey towards the democratic process.

Vietnamese Ambassador to Bangladesh Nguyen Manh Cuong said, aviation authorities of Bangladesh and Vietnam are working closely to launch the first direct flight between Dhaka and Hanoi within this year. The Ambassador said this while addressing a reception at a hotel of Dhaka yesterday marking the 80th Vietnamese National Day. Food and Land Adviser Ali Imam Majumder also spoke on the occasion, highlighting the growing relations between the two friendly countries.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan called upon the public to switch to affordable jute bags instead of banned polythene shopping bags. The Adviser made the call while addressing as the chief guest at the inauguration ceremony of the marketing initiative of affordable and eco-friendly jute bags among city consumers at Karwan Bazar in the capital yesterday.

Disaster Management and Relief Ministry Adviser Faruk E Azam said, despite being one of the most climate-vulnerable countries in the world, Bangladesh has made significant progress in disaster preparedness and response. The Adviser said this while speaking at a seminar titled 'Assessment of Disaster Management Capacity,' organized by the Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief at the CIRDAP Auditorium in Dhaka yesterday.

Health Adviser Nurjahan Begum inaugurated the robotic rehabilitation centre, where a dedicated team is supported by 57 cutting-edge robots, 22 of which are powered by artificial intelligence. Bangladesh's first ever robotic rehabilitation centre launched at Bangladesh Medical University has yesterday unveiled a new horizon of advanced medical care for persons with disabilities and patients suffering from paralysis. The pioneering facility opens up a new frontier in therapeutic innovation, offering state-of-the-art robotic assistance to enhance recovery and mobility for patients with long-term neurological conditions.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter stressed on giving lease of all water bodies to the genuine fishermen rather than others. The Adviser said this while exchanging views with the registered fishermen of Mithamoin, Itna and Astogram upazilas of Kishoreganj yesterday. In this connection, the Adviser revealed that more culverts would have to be constructed on 'all weather roads' for increasing reproduction of fish in haor areas and ensuing smooth breeding flow of water.

Newly appointed Pakistan High Commissioner in Bangladesh Imran Haider made a courtesy call on Religious Affairs Adviser A F M Khalid Hossain at his Secretariat office in yesterday. During the meeting, Dr AFM Khalid Hossain said, Bangladesh and Pakistan are the two largest Muslim-majority countries and there is a huge scope of mutual cooperation between the two countries in the fields of education, trade, information technology, human resource development and other areas.

National Consensus Commission Vice-Chairman Professor Ali Riaz said, it would be a big reform if the politicians uphold commitment to press freedom. He made the comment while participating in a view exchange meeting on the proposed report of the mass media reform commission at the Daily Star Bhaban in Dhaka yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at separate meetings with three political parties firmly reiterated that the national elections will be held within the first half of February in 2026 in a free, fair and festive manner. Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam said this at a press briefing in front of the State Guest House Jamuna yesterday after meetings with the political parties.

The Election Commission (EC) published a supplementary voter list ahead of the final one saying 12,63,07,504 people were listed as voters until August 31, 2025. EC's Senior Secretary Akhtar Ahmed said, out of the voters named in the list 6,41,00,455 are male and 6,22,05,819 are female voters. He told this to reporters yesterday.
