Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus ordered preparing a list of those killed in attacks by terrorists of Bangladesh Chhatra League and other affiliated bodies of Awami League, and also by state forces on the orders of the then government in the 15 years before the July mass uprising in 2024. The Chief Adviser made the order when Mohammad Barkat Ullah, father of brutally killed BUET student Abrar Fahad, Fahad's younger brother Abrar Fayyaz and maternal uncle Mohammad Mofazzal Hossain met him at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. Earlier, Gawhar Nayeem Wara, founding member Secretary of the Foundation for Disaster Forum, also paid a courtesy call on the Chief Adviser.

The Council of Advisers approved in principle the 'Code of Criminal Procedure (Second Amendment) Ordinance, 2025'. The Council made the approval at its meeting held at the Chief Adviser's Office yesterday with Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus in the chair.

Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim said that in this hour of grief, they stand with Bangladesh and mourn every life lost and every family devastated in this week's air force fighter jet crash on Milestone School and College in the capital's Uttara. The Malaysian Prime said this in a message posted on his verified Facebook account yesterday.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain said, the establishment of the United Nations Human Rights Office in Dhaka was done in Bangladesh's own interest, noting that the government retains the option to withdraw the office with six months' notice if necessary. The Adviser told this to journalists at his Ministry yesterday.

Industries Adviser Adilur Rahman Khan said that an environment-friendly tannery system, use of modern machinery and technology, skilled human resources and coordination between the public and private sectors would play a vital role in leather industry development. The Adviser made these remarks while inaugurating the 9th Bangladesh Leather & Footwear Expo (BLF) -2025 at the International Convention City Bashundhara in the capital yesterday.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr A F M Khalid Hossain underscored the need for taking initiatives to ensure that the prisoners who are part of society do not get involved in crime again after being released from prisons. The Adviser told reporters after visiting Dhaka Central Jail yesterday.

Commerce Secretary Mahbubur Rahman said, the United States Trade Representative (USTR), the chief trade negotiation body for the American government, has invited Bangladesh to resume the third and final round of tariff negotiations on July 29. The Commerce Secretary told this to BSS over the phone yesterday.

The evidences obtained by Al Jazeera have revealed that ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina ordered police to use 'lethal weapons' against protesters during the July mass uprising last year. The Al Jazeera revealed this reports yesterday.

China and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations held discussions on enhancing agricultural cooperation and strengthening food security in Bangladesh through trilateral initiatives. The discussion took place when Chinese Ambassador to Bangladesh Yao Wen met with Ye Anping, Director of FAO's South-South and Triangular Cooperation Division, at the Chinese Embassy in Dhaka yesterday.

Australia has expressed its keen interest to further strengthen trade and investment cooperation with Bangladesh, particularly in food processing, agriculture, recycling, and circular economy sectors. Australian Trade and Investment Commissioner Ben Carson, along with his Austrade team, undertook a visit to Chattogram last week to explore opportunities for deepening economic engagement between the two countries, according to a press release issued by the Australian High Commission in Dhaka yesterday.

The government yesterday published the names of the deaths and injured in the Bangladesh Air Force (BAF) fighter plane crash at the Milestone School and College in the capital's Uttara area. Names of 22 deceased and 57 injured who are now undergoing treatment at different city hospitals were published by the press wing of the Chief Adviser yesterday. According to the updated information provided by Directorate General of Health Services, the death toll in the aircraft has stood at 31 while 51 injured are undergoing treatment at different hospitals in the capital.

The government formed a new Pay Commission for employees and officials who are under the National Pay Scale. The Chief Adviser's Press Wing issued a statement in this regard yesterday.

An emergency Chinese medical team will arrive in Dhaka today to support treatment for the injured of Monday's tragic Airforce fighter crash in the capital. A Chinese embassy said this in a press release yesterday.

The health condition of six out of the 42 injured in the Milestone jet crash is critical, according to Director of the National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery (NIBPS) Professor Dr Nasir Uddin. NIBPS Director said this at a briefing at the institute yesterday.
