Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus assured the leaders of National Citizen Party (NCP) and Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami that the interim government would take all necessary steps to ensure free, fair and impartial national elections in February next. The Chief Adviser said that they have already taken several measures to hold a free, fair and credible election and everyone will soon see many more initiatives. The Chief Adviser came up with the assurance at separate meetings with delegations from the both political parties at the State Guest House Jamuna yesterday. During the meeting, the Chief Adviser sought cooperation from all active political parties, including Jamaat and the NCP, to make the election peaceful and festive one.

Since the interim government ratified three conventions of the International Labour Organization (ILO), Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus described the day as memorable one in the history of realizing the rights of working people in Bangladesh. In his message, the Chief Adviser said that he was very happy to know that the 52nd Summer National Sports Competition of the Bangladesh National School, Madrasa and Technical Education Sports Association is being held with the theme 'Building a country through sports skills, Bangladesh without discrimination. The Chief Adviser said education and sports complement each other, adding that regular sports practice is essential for physical and mental well-being.

Newly appointed German Ambassador to Bangladesh Dr Rudiger Lotz paid a courtesy call on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna yesterday. During the meeting, The Chief Adviser extended his warmest greetings to the German ambassador on assuming his duties in Bangladesh and expressed hope that the friendly relations between Bangladesh and Germany would reach new heights during his stay here. During the meeting, the ambassador showed support for the interim government and enquired about the preparation for the national election in February 2026.
