Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus asked the Deputy Commissioners (DCs) to strictly maintain law and order and strengthen market monitoring in the country. The Chief Adviser said this while inaugurating three-day DCs Conference in Shapla Hall of his office in this capital yesterday. Running a government is a team work, the Chief Adviser said. He added that the Bangladesh government should be a team where no one should do any mistake that makes the whole team deprived of success.

Education and Planning Adviser Wahiduddin Mahmud said that no establishment will be named after the members of interim government. The Adviser told reporters after the working session of the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Planning on the first day of the District Commissioners' Conference at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium yesterday. The interim government's main task is to transition to a well-governed democratic system, not to fulfil everyone's demands, the Adviser added.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain and Indian External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar acknowledged the challenges facing bilateral relations and stressed the need for joint efforts to address them. The discussion took place during a bilateral meeting on the sidelines of the 8th Indian Ocean Conference (IOC) in Muscat, Oman, according to a press release issued by the Foreign Ministry yesterday.

Earlier, the Foreign Affairs Adviser laid emphasis on facilitating maritime connectivity and reducing trade barrier to ensure a brighter, more prosperous future for all nations of the Indian Ocean and beyond. The Adviser said this while speaking at a plenary session titled "Strengthening Maritime Supply Chains: Overcoming Disruptions and Enhancing Resilience" at the 8th Indian Ocean Conference being held in Muscat, the capital of Oman. Yesterday.

Water Resources Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan sought international support in restoration of the country's rivers. The Adviser urged the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and other international partners to help Bangladesh create a successful example of river restoration. The Adviser highlighted the importance of taking a comprehensive approach to restoration of the rivers. Speaking as the chief guest at a Knowledge Sharing Seminar on "River Restoration: Lessons for Bangladesh," at Pani Bhaban in Dhaka yesterday, the Adviser expressed optimism about the potential to transform even polluted rivers like the Buriganga into sources of fresh water.

Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam said, a group of journalists for the personal gains collaborated with fascist regime, manipulated the facts and crafted false narratives to legitimize the killings. CA's Press Secretary said this while addressing a discussion titled 'Fascist Media Narratives: A Retrospective on July 1-36' organized by a platform named 'We Want a Fascist-Free Mass Media', at Zahur Hossain Chowdhury Hall of the National Press Club yesterday.

Bangladesh and Bhutan expressed optimism that they would be able to maximize the potential of Preferential Trade Agreement, signed between the two neighbours. This was observed when Bhutanese Ambassador to Bangladesh Rinchen Kuentsyl made a farewell call on Foreign Secretary Md. Jashim Uddin at the State Guest House Padma yesterday.

Dhaka called for the inclusion of the Rohingya repatriation issue in the OIC's Ten-Year Plan of Action (2026-2035), emphasizing the need for the organization's continued advocacy for the sustainable return of the Rohingyas to their homeland in Myanmar. The call was made when OIC Secretary General's Special Envoy on Myanmar Ambassador Ibrahim Khairat paid a courtesy call on Foreign Secretary Md. Jashim Uddin at the Foreign Ministry in Dhaka, according to a Ministry's press release yesterday. During the meeting, the Special Envoy conveyed that the OIC is willing to work with the Bangladesh government to organize the High-Level Conference on the Situation of Rohingya Muslims and other minorities in Myanmar.

The UN Rights office said, armed Awami League leaders incited their armed activists including now disbanded Chhatra League to resort to violent means to suppress the July August protestors. Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) said this in its report released last week at Geneva Headquarters.

BNP's Acting Chairman Tarique Rahman has said BNP wants to rebuild the country from the havoc carried out by the fascist Awami League (AL) through implementing the 31-point charter. The Bangladesh Vegetable Oil Refiners and Banaspati Manufacturers Association assured the public that there will be no shortage of cooking oil during Ramadan. In a statement yesterday, the Association said that more oil is being supplied to the market than usual to ensure its availability throughout the holy month. To allay concerns over possible shortages, the Association urged consumers and traders not to panic or stockpile oil.
