Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus urged political parties to make their unity against fascism more visible and stronger in a bid to foil the conspiracies of the defeated forces. The chief adviser asked the political leaders to make more visible their unity against fascism despite differences and rivalries. The Chief Adviser said this while addressing a meeting with leaders of 13 political parties and alliances on the recent situation in the country at his official residence Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. Later, Chief of Air Staff Air Chief Marshal Hasan Mahmood Khan also called on Chief Adviser.

The Milestone School and College has formed a seven-member committee to determine the actual number of students and others who were killed, injured, or reported missing after a fighter jet crashed into its building in the capital's Uttara area on Monday. The committee comprises officers, faculty members, guardians, and students of the college. It has also been tasked with preparing a list of the deceased and missing persons, including their addresses. According to an office order issued on July 22 and signed by the college principal, the committee was asked to submit its report within three working days. Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Dr. Asif Nazrul shared the information via his verified Facebook account yesterday.

Education Adviser CR Abrar has given explanation why they have taken decision to postpone the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examination in late night. The education adviser disclosed this while talking to the Journalists at secretariat yesterday. He said that they had been corresponding with Singapore till late night for providing improved treatment to the injured of the deadly jet crash at Milestone School and College on July 21.

Japanese Foreign Minister Iwaya Takeshi expressed their heartfelt condolences for those who lost in the Bangladesh Air Force (BAF) fighter aircraft crash that occurred in Dhaka's Uttara area on Monday. The Japanese Minister said this in a condolence message sent to Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain yesterday. He also conveyed his heartfelt sympathy to the bereaved families who are grieving the irreparable loss.

Pakistan Home Minister and Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) Chairman Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi met Youth and Sports Adviser Asif Mahmud Sajib Bhuiyan at his office at Secretariat yesterday. The Adviser said that about 63 percent of Bangladesh's citizens are between the ages of 18 and 35. Various training programme are being conducted through the Department of Youth Development to provide employment to this large youth community.

Adviser to the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change Syeda Rizwana Hasan urged global stakeholders to adopt nature-based solutions and ensure that developed nations are held accountable for their climate responsibilities. The Adviser said this while addressing the Meghna Knowledge Forum II (MKF II) in Bangkok, Thailand, virtually from Dhaka. The forum, themed "Building Community and Ecosystem Resilience to Climate Change," resonated with Adviser Rizwana's message of environmental justice, regional cooperation, and ecological rights.

Commerce Adviser Sk. Bashir Uddin urged the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations (UN) to support Bangladesh for bringing back the golden past of jute. The Adviser said this during a meeting with FAO's Director of the South-South and Triangular Cooperation Division Anping Ye at Bangladesh Secretariat in the capital yesterday. In the meeting, they discussed in detail the activities of FAO in Bangladesh, seed production, market diversification of jute products and capacity building strategies.

Shipping Adviser Brig Gen (retd) Dr M Sakhawat Hussain said, the government has been giving all-out support to families affected by the plane crash in Uttara. The Adviser attached utmost importance to ensuring the treatment of the burned patients, while visiting Combined Military Hospital (CMH) to inquire about the latest physical condition of undergoing patients who received burn injuries in the air force training plane crash at Milestone School and College in Uttara.

US Charge d'affaires Tracey Ann Jacobson met Mostofa Sarwar Farooki at his office at the Secretariat yesterday. During the meeting, fruitful discussions were held on cultural cooperation, cultural group exchanges between the two countries, and film training workshops for Bangladeshi youth to strengthen the existing friendly relations between Bangladesh and the United States. The Cultural Adviser highlighted the initiatives and action plans taken by his Ministry to build an inclusive Bangladesh.

Bangladesh and Nepal reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening collaboration on mountain-related issues, climate change and disaster management. The commitment was made when Nepali Ambassador to Bangladesh Ghanashyam Bhandari paid a courtesy call on Adviser for Chittagong Hill Tracts Affairs Supradip Chakma, according to a press release issued by the Nepal embassy in Dhaka. During the meeting they discussed a wide range of matters of mutual interest.

Bangladesh has signed a government-to-government (G2G) agreement with Malaysia to import high-quality fertilizers aimed at boosting productivity and ensuring sustainable development in the agriculture sector. The Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation (BADC) and FELCRA Niaga Sdn Bhd (FNSB) of Malaysia signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) recently at the Mandarin Oriental Hotel in Kuala Lumpur, according to a press release of Bangladesh High Commission in Malaysia yesterday.

The Election Commission (EC) yesterday released the Media Personnel Guidelines-2025 for journalists and media representatives tasked with covering the 13th National Parliamentary Election as well as local government polls. As outlined in the guidelines, accredited journalists possessing valid EC-issued accreditation cards will be granted for direct access to polling stations.

According to the updated information yesterday provided by Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) the death toll in the aircraft crash has risen to 29 from 28 while 57 injured are undergoing treatment at different hospital.
