Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Prof. Muhammad Yunus called upon the country's people to remain calm amid the ongoing situation, saying the student-people and all, including the Hindu-Muslim, irrespective of their religions must stay united. The Chief Adviser made the call when a five-member delegation of Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), led by its Secretary General Mirza Fakhru Islam Alamgir, met him at the State Guest House Jamuna yesterday.

Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, Karim A Khan, called on Chief Adviser Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday. During the talks, the Rohingya crisis, the situation in Myanmar, humanitarian efforts for the Rohingyas and the justice and accountability for the atrocities committed during the July-August mass uprising were discussed.

Land Adviser AF Hassan Ariff urged all irrespective of religious belief not to point fingers at any organization, party or group for criminal activities perpetrated by an individual belonging to a particular group or organization. The Adviser made this request while taking part at a discussion as the chief guest at Chattogram Circuit House yesterday. City Mayor Dr. Shahadat Hossain spoke at the function as special guest.

Foreign Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain called upon world leaders for fostering dialogue, leveraging AI responsibly and ensuring justice, equality and sustainability for all civilizations. He made the call when addressed the 10th Global Forum of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC) Group of Friends High-Level Meeting in Cascais, Portugal, a foreign ministry's press release said yesterday.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain reaffirmed Bangladesh's dedication to safeguarding religious sites and fostering interfaith harmony. The Adviser made the commitment while representing Bangladesh at the United Nations Global Conference on Safeguarding Religious Sites: A Multi-stakeholder Approach, held in Cascais, Portugal, according to a Foreign Ministry's press release yesterday.

The Hague-based International Criminal Court (ICC) today (27 November) expressed its readiness to assist Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) in its efforts to address alleged mass killings during the July-August period. The ICC is always available to assist states both in terms of technical support, training, and guidance when requested, said ICC's Senior Trial Lawyer Essa Mbye Faal at a press briefing at a hotel in the capital yesterday.

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia today visited the US Embassy in Dhaka yesterday to give her biometric fingerprint for visa. Upon her arrival at the Embassy, its officials, including Acting Ambassador welcomed the BNP Chairperson.
