Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus yesterday said that the nation is ready for the next general election as the country has come to a stable situation after a mass uprising mixed with the killing spree last year. The Chief Adviser said this while addressing the ongoing three-day international conference titled 'Stakeholders' Dialogue: Takeaways to the High-Level Conference on Rohingya Situation' at the Hotel Baywatch in Cox's Bazar that hosts over a million Rohingyas. The conference aims to engage global stakeholders to find solutions to the prolonged Rohingya crisis. The Chief Adviser formally inaugurated the main session of the stakeholders' dialogue. Urging the international community to take stronger action to ensure justice, repatriation and stability for the forcibly displaced Myanmar nationals, the Chief Adviser placed a seven-point proposal to resolve protracted Rohingya crisis.

Chief Justice Syed Refaat Ahmed stressed the need for a strategic partnership of all the stakeholders in justice delivery system to shape the kind of justice. The Chief Justice said this while addressing as the chief guest a 'National Conference on ADR: Role of District Legal Aid Committees in Implementing New Legislations' at a hotel of Dhaka yesterday.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Prof Dr. Asif Nazrul said, the government will continue legal aid services as part of its utmost effort to save the time, labor and money of litigants without depending on grants. The Adviser said this at an event titled 'National Conference on ADR: Role of District Legal Aid Committees in Implementing New Legislations' at a hotel of Dhaka yesterday.

Foreign Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain urged the Muslim Ummah and the international community to take pragmatic steps to stop Israeli military aggression and genocide against Palestine, transforming moral commitments into concrete actions. The Adviser made the call in his intervention at the Extraordinary Meeting of the Council of Foreign Ministers of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation in Jeddah yesterday.

Home Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury announced bounty for providing information leading to the recovery of the looted firearms after August 5 last year aimed at recovering all the looted firearms prior to the 13th parliamentary election slated for February next. The Adviser made the announcement after coming out of the core committee meeting on law and order at his Ministry in Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. The Adviser said, the identity of the informant will be kept strictly secret. The Adviser also said that one will get Tk 50,000 for helping recover one pistol and Tk 50,000 for one shotgun.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser Syeda Rizwana Hasan said that over the past five decades, Bangladesh and China have advanced together-strengthening trade, connectivity and above all, people-to-people bonds. The Adviser made these remarks while inaugurating the 'Radiant Stars: Lingjiatan Culture Photo Exhibition from Anhui, China' at the Bangladesh National Museum in Dhaka yesterday. In her speech, the Adviser described the exhibition as a dialogue between civilizations and a celebration of friendship.

Health Adviser Nurjahan Begum laid emphasis on increasing the rate of breastfeeding to provide infants with essential nutrients for their sound physical and mental development. The Adviser said this while speaking as the chief guest at the inauguration of 'World Breastfeeding Week 2025' at the conference room of the National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery in the capital yesterday.

Fisheries and Livestock Adviser Farida Akhter said, unplanned development is reducing grazing land and putting valuable resources like buffaloes at risk. The Adviser emphasised that livestock rearing is vital for meeting the protein deficit, safeguarding livelihoods and ensuring national food security. The Adviser made the remarks while addressing the National Workshop 2025 on 'Grazing Land and Development: Challenges and Solutions for Buffaloes in Coastal Areas' at Barisal Club in Dhaka yesterday. The workshop was jointly organized by the Bangladesh Buffalo Association, Grameen Jon Unnayan Sangstha and the Coastal Vet Society.

Social Welfare, Women and Children Affairs Adviser Sharmeen S Murshid said that country's economy is now stable thanks to hard and relentless efforts of the interim government for last one year. The Adviser said this while inaugurating 'Citizens Right and Climate Justice' project at the conference room of the Deputy Commissioner office in Bogura yesterday.

Civil Aviation and Tourism Adviser Sheikh Bashir Uddin said, the government has undertaken a set of firm measures to contain the abnormal rise in airfares and stamp out fraudulent practices in the ticketing sector. The Adviser said this at a press briefing at the Commerce Ministry's conference room yesterday. The adviser acknowledged that ticket prices normally fluctuate depending on demand and season. However, the Adviser alleged that some unscrupulous businesses had been creating artificial shortages to extract higher fares from passengers.

Primary and Mass Education Adviser Bidhan Ranjon Ray Podder said, the government would be able to provide new books to primary school students at the beginning of January. The Adviser told media after visiting the Bairaara government primary school at Netrakona sadar upazila yesterday. The Adviser expressed satisfaction over the presence of students at their classrooms and performance of the teachers as well.

High Representative to the Chief Adviser on Rohingya Issues and National Security Adviser Dr Khalilur Rahman said, Rohingyas are ready to go back to their homeland with their due rights. The Adviser said this while briefing journalists on the second day of the three-day international event titled 'Stakeholders' Dialogue: Takeaway to the High-Level Conference on the Rohingya Situation' in Cox's Bazar yesterday.

Land Ministry's Senior Secretary ASM Saleh Ahmed said that the introduction of online land management has significantly reduced opportunities for fake registrations and fraudulent activities. The Senior Secretary made these remarks while presiding over the meeting of the team at the Ministry's conference room, according to a PID press release yesterday.

A nine-member Indian delegation led by Border Security Force (BSF) Director General (DG) Daljit Singh Chaudhary arrived in Dhaka yesterday to attend the 56th border conference. BGB Director Major General Mohammad Ashrafuzzaman Siddiqui welcomed the Indian delegation. The four-day DG-level conference between BGB and BSF of India begins today at the BGB Headquarters, Pilkhana, Dhaka.


