## Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has underscored the urgent need for Bangladesh to transition towards cleaner, safer and more affordable energy solutions as the country navigates a new path towards sustainable economic development. Speaking during a virtual conference the day before yesterday with Carl Page, Chairman of the Anthropocene Institute and his colleagues, the Chief Adviser said, Bangladesh- one of the world's most densely populated and climate-vulnerable nations- cannot afford prolonged reliance on fossil fuels, according to a press release issued by Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus congratulated the Bangladesh delegation on the country's re-election to the Council of Administration of the Universal Postal Union. The election was held in Dubai the day before yesterday, where Bangladesh secured 97 out of 157 votes, ranking 9th among the 10 elected members. This marks Bangladesh's second consecutive four-year term on the Council of Administration, according to a press release issued by Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

The newly appointed Ambassador of the Netherlands, Boris van Bommel paid a courtesy call on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka the day before yesterday. During the meeting, they discussed a range of issues of mutual interest, including strengthening bilateral relations, upcoming general elections, trade and agriculture and the ongoing Rohingya humanitarian crisis, according to a press release issued by the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

European Parliament Human Rights Subcommittee Chair Mounir Satouri said, Bangladesh must ensure free and fair elections in February 2026, saying acceptance of the results by all parties will be vital for sustaining political stability and consolidating democracy. Satouri told it in an interview during his visit to Dhaka.

Chief Special Assistant on the Ministry of Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology Faiz Ahmad Taiyeb said, the government wants to make technology education accessible to students at all levels across the country. The Special Assistant made the remarks while addressing a certificate distribution ceremony as the chief guest at a training workshop on basic digital skills for Qawmi madrasa students, held at the Bangladesh Academy for Rural Development in Cumilla the before yesterday, according to a Ministry press release yesterday.
