Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the defeated forces are out to halt the election by creating chaos, so all anti-fascist forces must remain united to resist their ill efforts. The Chief Adviser said this at a meeting with top leaders of different political parties at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus held a meeting with Hefazat-e-Islam Bangladesh leaders at the State Guest House Jamuna yesterday. During the meeting, they discussed measures to provide necessary compensation to the victims of the Shapla Chattor carnage and taking steps to collect and preserve all information and data of this brutal incident of 2013. The meeting also discussed taking necessary steps to probe the attack on the Hefazat-e-Islam rally through the United Nations.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) A M M Nasir Uddin voiced cautions against Artificial Intelligence based threat ahead of the upcoming general elections saying election commission (EC) remained alert to face such risk. The CEC said this while exchanging views with the newsmen before the meeting with Khulna divisional election officials at Khulna Regional Election Commissioner's Office yesterday.

Law Adviser Dr Asif Nazrul said, human rights must be nurtured as a culture rather than an issue of enforcement. The Adviser made this remark while speaking at a seminar arranged by Human Rights Support Society at Professor Mozaffar Ahmed Chowdhury auditorium in Dhaka University yesterday.

Commerce and Civil Aviation and Tourism Adviser Sheikh Bashir Uddin said, the historic July Uprising marked the beginning of Bangladesh's journey towards building a just, non-discriminatory and inclusive state, where the people remain at the centre of governance. The Adviser said this while addressing the 'July Renaissance-2025' commemorative event as the chief guest.

Adviser to the Ministries of Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Sharmeen S Murshid administered a mass oath, reaffirming commitment to rebuilding the nation in line with the spirit of July Uprising. The Adviser said this at the ceremony dubbed as Mass Oath for Rebuilding Society in July's Spirit at Osmani Memorial Auditorium yesterday.
