## Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the interim government is working to build a broad national consensus around a renewed political system. The Chief Adviser told an event on the July Uprising & Fact-Finding Report, held at Hotel Intercontinental, Dhaka yesterday. The Chief Adviser said, their work is far from finished.

Handa Industries Co, a Hong Kong-based textile and apparel chain, has announced it will invest US\$ 250 million in Bangladesh. Handa Industries Ltd. Chairman Han Chun announced the plan when he met Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna in Dhaka yesterday.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Dr Asif Nazrul said, the government is determined to ensure justice for perpetrators of July massacres and preserve irrefutable evidences so that future governments cannot delay the trial process. The Adviser said this at a discussion and documentary screening titled 'Trial of July Carnage', held at the Judicial Administration Training Institute in the capital yesterday.

Bangladesh and Pakistan have expressed deep concern over the ongoing Israeli aggression and the worsening humanitarian crisis in Palestine, reiterating their unwavering solidarity with the Palestinian people and their just cause. This was reflected during a meeting between Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain and Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar, held on the sidelines of the International Conference on the Two-State Solution at the United Nations in New York yesterday. The two leaders expressed hope for meaningful outcomes from the conference.

Education Adviser Professor Dr Chowdhury Rafiqul Abrar called upon students to express their gratitude by presenting flowers to teacher, as the teachers and parents played vital roles in the successful results of students' SSC and HSC exams. The Adviser made this call while delivering speech as the chief guest at the award-giving ceremony for the best-performing students of the secondary and higher secondary level for the years 2022 and 2023, held at the International Mother Language Institute in Dhaka yesterday.

Food Adviser Ali Imam Majumdar said, Bangladesh has a target to build an equitable, resilient and nutrition-sensitive food system by addressing challenges that are inclusive and consistent with global commitments, according to a Ministry press release yesterday. The Adviser made the remarks while addressing a function as a panel discussant on the sideline of the UN Food System Summit in Addis Ababa, the capital of Ethiopia Yesterday.

Adviser to the Ministries of Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Sharmeen S Murshid laid emphasis on the necessity of giving special attention on human research in coastal areas compared to plain lands due to the geographical nature of Bangladesh. The Adviser said this while speaking as the chief guest at the national research unveiling programme on Bangladesh Neurodevelopmental Disabilities at a hotel in Dhaka, according to a press release yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Adviser Md. Mahfuz Alam yesterday expressed deep shock and sorrow at the death of Peer Shah Muhammad Ahsanuzzaman of Mashurikhola Darbar, one of the oldest Sufi Markazes in Dhaka. In a message of condolence the Adviser said, Peer Shah Muhammad Ahsanuzzaman established 15 madrasahs across the country, including Dhaka. He used to extend helping hands to families affected by natural disasters like floods, tidal waves and landslides in the country, he added. The Adviser also prayed for eternal peace of the departed soul and conveyed deep sympathy to the bereaved family.

Information and Broadcasting Secretary Mahbuba Farjana said that everybody must be vocal so that the families of the martyrs of the July Uprising get justice. Recalling the July uprising martyrs with respect, the Secretary said, the sufferings of the martyr's families and the injured in the uprising should be highlighted. In this regard, the officials of the information service should play a leading role, she added. The Secretary said these at a discussion and prayer meeting organized by Press Information Department (PID) on the occasion of the 1st anniversary of the mass Uprising at PID conference room at the Bangladesh Secretariat yesterday. Principal Information Officer Md. Nizamul Kabir chaired the discussion.

The Election Commission yesterday held a meeting on delimitations of parliamentary constituencies, specification of polling centres and code of conducts of political parties and candidates ahead of the 13th parliamentary polls. The meeting was held at the Nirbachon Bhaban in the capital.

Bangladesh and East African country Djibouti are keen to further strengthen bilateral cooperation between the two nations. The interest was expressed when non-resident Ambassador of Djibouti to Bangladesh Isse Abdillahi Assoweh met Foreign Secretary Asad Alam Siam at the latter's office in Dhaka yesterday.


Chinese Ambassador Yao Wen said that the Communist Party of China seeks to enhance relations with all political parties in Bangladesh. The Envoy made the remark while responding to a question regarding the recent visits of top BNP and Jamaat leaders to China, during a 'DCAB Talk' hosted by the Diplomatic Correspondents Association, Bangladesh at the National Press Club yesterday.

The probe committee yesterday confirmed that no fire incident was taken place at the Foreign Service Academy during Monday's dialogue between the National Consensus Commission and the political parties, according to an official handout referring to the committee.

Bangladesh urged Romania to resume labour recruitment from Bangladesh and proposed to reopen the Romanian Embassy in Dhaka to deepen engagements. The call was made when the Non-resident Ambassador of Romania to Bangladesh Sena Latif, paid a courtesy call on Foreign Secretary Asad Alam Siam at the latter's office in Dhaka yesterday.

The Dhaka University Central Students' Union elections are set to take place on September 9. Chief Returning Officer Professor Jashim Uddin announced the election schedule at a press briefing held at the conference room of the University's Senate Building yesterday. All the representatives of the students welcomed the schedule.

DSEX, the broad index of the Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) declined by 33.6 points or 0.6% to settle at 5,298 points as against 5,332 points yesterday.


