Newsbrief

European aircraft manufacturing company Airbus and British aviation giant Menzies Aviation expressed their eagerness to build a long-term partnership with Bangladesh. The two companies placed their offers as Airbus Executive Vice President Wouter van Wersch and Menzies Aviation Executive Vice President Charles Wyley called on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at his hotel in London yesterday.

Commonwealth Secretary-General Shirley Ayorkor Botchwey said, the organisation was keen to support Bangladesh in political reforms ahead of the planned general election next year. The Commonwealth Secretary-General said this as she called on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at his hotel in London yesterday. Earlier in the day, A group of UK parliamentarian under the banner of All Party Parliamentary Group called on Chief Adviser at his hotel.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus reached London yesterday on a four-day official visit to the United Kingdom (UK) aiming to enhance bilateral relations. Chief Adviser's Deputy Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad Majumder told reporters. Bangladesh High Commissioner to the UK Abida Islam received Chief Adviser at the airport.

Home Adviser Lt Gen. (rtd) Jahanagir Alam Chowdhury said that interrogation rooms made of glass will be set up so that people can see how accused individuals are being treated there during remand. The Adviser said this while talking to the journalists after visiting Gachha Thana under Gazipur Metropolitan Police yesterday.

Commerce Adviser Sk. Bashir Uddin said that rawhides of sacrificial animals during this Holy Eid ul Azha are being sold at the highest rate this time compared to the last 10 years. He also said, it has been possible due to the free distribution of salt and motivating people and thus enhancing the capacity. The Commerce Adviser said this while speaking at a view-exchange meeting with the district rawhides traders group at Chakbaiddyanath in Natore yesterday.

Commerce Adviser Sk. Bashir Uddin said that no government in the past except the incumbent interim government had taken timely steps to protect the rawhides sector of the country. The Commerce Adviser said this while visiting a rawhide Arat at Arafatnagar in Joypurhat yesterday.

Commerce Adviser Sk. Bashir Uddin said, it is not true that the sellers are getting lesser price of rawhides of the sacrificial animals during this Holy Eid ul Azha. He also said that the government had earlier fixed the price of salted rawhides while the price of salted rawhides is expected to become higher even from the fixed price. The Commerce Adviser said this while replying to questions of reporters after visiting the temporary preservation place of rawhides of sacrificial animals at Zamil Madrasah in Bogura yesterday.

A total of 369 pilgrims returned home aboard the first Hajj return flight of 2025, marking the beginning of the month-long repatriation of Bangladeshi pilgrims after the successful completion of the holy pilgrimage. The pilgrims arrived at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport yesterday.
