Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus pledged to continue collective efforts together with the United Nations so that the Rohingyas can celebrate their Eid next year by returning their home of origin in Myanmar's Rakhine state. The Chief Adviser made the remarks after joining Iftar with one lakh Rohingyas at camp 20 extension of Ukhiya in Cox's Bazar yesterday in the presence of UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus said, the people of Bangladesh are lucky enough as they have a sea, which promotes doing business with different countries. The Chief Adviser said this while exchanging views with local people at BIAM Auditorium in Cox's Bazar yesterday.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus directed the authorities concerned to ensure transparency in implementing the Khurushkul Climate Refugee Rehabilitation Project, Cox's Bazar. The Chief Adviser came up with the directives during his visit to the project site in Cox's Bazar yesterday. The Chief Adviser also instructed for ensuring transparency in making a list of beneficiaries of the project. Project Director Lt. Colonel Mirazul Islam briefed the Chief Adviser about the progress of the climate refugee rehabilitation project.

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus condoled the death of the Rohingya man in Cox's Bazar, according to a statement issued by the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday. The Chief Adviser ordered an immediate investigation into his death.

United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres urged international community to show that solidarity through action and concrete support for the Rohingya people and their Bangladeshi host communities. The United Nations Secretary-General said this while speaking before an iftar party in Rohingya camp in Cox's Bazar yesterday.

Visiting United Nations (UN) Secretary General Antonio Guterres expressed his full support for the reform process initiated by Bangladesh's Interim Government and voiced concern for declining humanitarian aid for more than a million Rohingya refugees living in the country's southeast. The UN Secretary General reaffirmed the UN's commitment to Bangladesh's reform agenda and voiced his concern for "one of the most discriminated peoples" in the world during a meeting with Bangladesh Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus at his Tejgaon office in the capital yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Adviser Mahfuj Alam joined the annual mahfil of Sarsina Darbar Sharif in Pirojpur yesterday. The Adviser attended the munajat after Jum'a prayers, the closing day of the three-day mahfil as the Chief guest.
