Newsbrief

Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus extended heartfelt congratulations to the Bangladesh Women's Futsal Team on their historic achievement. In the SAFF Women's Futsal Championship held for the first time, Bangladesh clinched the title in Bangkok by defeating Maldives 14-2 goals on the final day of the tournament yesterday. In a congratulatory message, the Chief Adviser said that winning the title with a brilliant performance in the SAFF Women's Futsal Championship is a matter of pride for the country's sports arena.

Agriculture and Home Affairs Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said the government is planning to provide incentives to potato farmers as they failed to get fair prices due to increased production. The Adviser made the remarks while briefing journalists on overall agricultural issues at the meeting room of the Ministry of Agriculture at the Secretariat yesterday. The Adviser said production of major crops including paddy, potato, onion, vegetables and mustard has increased significantly this year.

Education Adviser Prof. Dr C R Abrar laid emphasis on introducing merit based evaluation system for flourishing the latent talent of students. Ensuring proper evaluation of merit is the core foundation of a modern education system, the Adviser said while addressing at a programme on the premises of Nagbari Hasina Chowdhury High School in Tangail district as the chief guest yesterday. The Adviser urged the students to concentrate on their studies while also fulfilling their responsibilities towards the society.

Planning Adviser Dr Wahiduddin Mahmud said that Bangladesh must avoid falling into a 'debt trap' as it approaches graduation from the Least Developed Country (LDC) category. Speaking to reporters after the day's Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC) meeting, the Adviser said the government no longer wants to accept loan-funded projects unless they are of critical national priority and cannot be financed or implemented with domestic resources or expertise.

Environment, Forest and Climate Change Adviser to the Interim Government, Syeda Rizwana Hasan said that reducing noise pollution is everyone's responsibility. The Adviser said this while addressing a rally organized to raise public awareness against honking at the airport area in the city yesterday. The Department of Environment, Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP), Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA), Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) and Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh jointly organized the rally to implement the 'Discouraging Honking in Declared Silent Zone'. Secretary of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change Dr. Farhina Ahmed was present at the event as special guest yesterday.

Religious Affairs Adviser Dr AFM Khalid Hossain said the referendum will change the trend of the country's politics. To build a bright country, 'Yes' vote must be won in the referendum, the Adviser said while addressing National Imam Conference organised by Islamic Foundation at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Centre at Agargaon yesterday.

Shipping Adviser Brigadier General (R.) Dr. M Sakhawat Hussain inaugurated the long-awaited modern sea-truck service on the Pekua–Kutubdia route yesterday. An advanced sea-truck named “ST Bhasha Shaheed Jabbar” was officially launched on the Pekua–Kutubdia waterway. Speaking at the event, the Adviser said that the introduction of modern sea-trucks on the Pekua–Kutubdia and Cox’s Bazar–Maheshkhali routes has opened a new horizon for transportation for people in the coastal regions.

The government approved a major healthcare infrastructure project worth Taka 2,459.34 crore to establish a 1,000-bed Bangladesh-China Friendship General Hospital in Nilphamari yesterday. The project was approved by the Executive Committee of the National Executive Committee (ECNEC) aimed at ensuring modern and specialized medical services for people in the northern region of the country and thus easing pressure on hospitals in Dhaka and Rangpur. The project, titled "Establishment of a 1,000-bed Bangladesh-China Friendship General Hospital", has an estimated cost of Taka 2,459.34 crore.

European Union (EU) Ambassador to Bangladesh Michael Miller has stressed the need for a level playing field for EU operators and sustained policy stability to further strengthen Bangladesh-EU bilateral relations. The Ambassador also called for the completion of reforms initiated by the interim government. The Ambassador made the remarks while delivering a keynote address titled "The EU Means Business in Bangladesh" at the EuroCham Business Evening 2026 in Dhaka recently, said an EU press release yesterday.

French Ambassador to Bangladesh Jean-Marc Séré-Charlet paid a courtesy call on Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Dr Shafiqur Rahman at the party’s central office yesterday. The meeting took place in a cordial and friendly manner during which both the sides discussed about the upcoming Jatiya Sangsad elections in Bangladesh and matters of mutual interest between the two countries, said a press release yesterday. The Ambassador was accompanied by Deputy Ambassador Frédéric Inja and Economic Adviser Julien Dure.

Interest was expressed in introducing Bangla language courses at Maldives National University (MNU) as Bangladesh and the Maldives discussed expanding cooperation in higher education, research, training and cultural exchange. The discussion took place during a meeting at the university in Malé, the capital city of the Maldives, between Bangladesh High Commissioner to the Maldives Dr. Md. Nazmul Islam and MNU Vice-Chancellor (VC) Dr. Aishath Shehnaz Adam, said a press release yesterday.

Bangladesh Air Force (BAF) is replacing its 62 peacekeepers of the Aviation Transport Unit contingent deployed in the United Nations (UN) Peacekeeping Mission in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). As part of this replacement, 35 members of the Bangladesh Air Force left Dhaka for the Democratic Republic of Congo aboard an UN-Chartered aircraft (Ethiopian Airlines), said a release of the Inter-Services of Public Relations (ISPR) Directorate yesterday.
