Chief Adviser of the interim government Professor Muhammad Yunus delivered a farewell address to the officials and employees at his office in the city's Tejgaon area. Following the speech, the Chief Adviser participated in a photo session with all those serving at the Chief Adviser's Office (CAO), said the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

Highlighting the interim government's initiatives to ensure democratic rights and values over the last 18 months, Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus has called upon everyone to continue the struggle to build a just, humane and democratic Bangladesh. The Chief Adviser said in his farewell address to the nation yesterday.

Chief of Army Staff General Waker-Uz-Zaman paid a courtesy call on Chief Adviser of the interim government Professor Muhammad Yunus at the Chief Adviser's Office (CAO) in the city's Tejgaon area. During the meeting, they exchanged greetings and briefly discussed various matters related to performing responsibilities during the interim government's tenure, said the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

Home Affairs Adviser Lt Gen (retd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury said the recently concluded 13th national parliament election and referendum would stand as a milestone in Bangladesh's electoral history, crediting law enforcement agencies for their "neutral, responsible and unique" role. Speaking as chief guest at a farewell reception held at the Hall of Integrity at Bangladesh Police Headquarters, the Adviser praised the coordinated efforts of the Army, Police, RAB, Ansar, BGB and Coast Guard for ensuring a peaceful and credible election process. The Home Adviser expressed gratitude to members of various law enforcement bodies under the Ministry of Home Affairs yesterday.

Agriculture Adviser Lieutenant General (Retd) Md. Jahangir Alam Chowdhury has said that the current relief in the country's agricultural sector is the result of the combined efforts of its all stakeholders. The Adviser made the remarks while addressing a farewell reception organized by the departments and organizations under the Ministry of Agriculture at the auditorium of the Bangladesh Agricultural Research Council in Khamarbari, Dhaka yesterday.

National Citizen Party (NCP) has signed the July National Charter, giving it compete shape on the aspects of approval of all stakeholders. The charter was endorsed by most of the stakeholders of the Consensus Commission of the Interim Government but the NCP remained absent from signing the instrument saying signing would be meaningless without clarity on implementation. In the presence of Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus, NCP Convener Nahid Islam and Member Secretary Akhter Hossain signed the charter at State Guest House Jamuna, said the Chief Adviser's Press Wing yesterday.

Maldives President Dr Mohamed Muizzu is scheduled to arrive in Dhaka today to attend the oath-taking ceremony of Bangladesh's newly elected government, reaffirming close bilateral ties between the two South Asian nations. Maldivian Foreign Minister Dr Abdulla Khaleel will accompany the President, a senior official of the foreign ministry told BSS yesterday.


Nepal's Foreign Minister Bala Nanda Sharma is scheduled to arrive in Dhaka to attend the oath-taking ceremony of Bangladesh's newly elected government led by BNP Chairman Tarique Rahman, underscoring Kathmandu's commitment to strengthening bilateral ties with Dhaka yesterday. The Foreign Minister's visit reflects Nepal's commitment to further strengthening bilateral relations and deepening the bonds of cooperation between Nepal and Bangladesh, Nepal's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said in a press release yesterday.

Sri Lanka's Minister of Health and Mass Media Dr Nalinda Jayatissa would represent his country at the oath-taking ceremony of Bangladesh's new cabinet led by BNP Chairman Tarique Rahman. Bangladesh High Commissioner to Sri Lanka Andalib Elias saw off the Sri Lankan minister at Colombo airport morning before his departure for Dhaka, according to a message received.

Bhutanese Prime Minister Dasho Tshering Tobgay would attend the oath-taking ceremony of BNP Chairman Prime Minister-elect Tarique Rahman in Dhaka, reflecting the enduring friendship between the two countries. At the invitation of the Government of Bangladesh, Prime Minister Dasho Tshering Tobga would attend the Oath-Taking Ceremony of Tarique Rahman, the Prime Minister-elect of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh on 17 February, said a press release issued by the Bhutanese embassy here this morning.

The government appointed Dr Nasimul Gani, Senior Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs, as the new Cabinet Secretary on a contractual basis. The Ministry of Public Administration issued a notification announcing the appointment yesterday.

The Home Ministry has directed all concerned particularly the police to ensure maximum security around the swearing-in ceremony of the newly appointed Prime Minister, scheduled to take place at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban. The law enforcement agencies have been asked to take all necessary measures to guarantee the safety of the Prime Minister and cabinet members during the oath-taking ceremony. Authorities have been told to strengthen security at the venue and surrounding areas through close coordination among relevant agencies. Police Headquarters sources confirmed that a comprehensive security plan has already been finalized. Special security arrangements would be centered on the South Plaza, marking an unprecedented shift in venue for the cabinet swearing-in ceremony.
