Newsbrief

President Mohammed Shahabuddin expressed his profound shock and sorrow at the death of Dilara Hafiz, wife of Jatiya Sangsad (Parliament) Speaker Hafiz Uddin Ahmed, Bir Bikram. The nation will remember with gratitude the outstanding contribution of the late Dilara Hafiz in the field of country's education, the President added. In a condolence message yesterday, the Head of the State prayed for eternal peace of her departed soul and conveyed deep sympathy to the bereaved family.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman issued a set of directives to BNP lawmakers to infuse dynamism in parliamentary activities at a meeting at Jatiya Sangsad yesterday. At the meeting, BNP lawmakers deeply mourned the death of Professor Dilara Hafiz, spouse of Speaker Hafiz Uddin Ahmad, Bir Bikram and offered a special prayer seeking her eternal peace. The meeting also discussed ongoing government activities, current political scenario, legislative activities and future action plans.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman expressed profound shock and sorrow at the death of Dilara Hafiz, spouse of Jatiya Sangsad Speaker Hafiz Uddin Ahmad, Bir Bikram. In a condolence message yesterday the Premier said, late Dilara Hafiz was a distinguished educationist and social worker. She played an important role in the expansion of education in the country during her long career. The Prime Minister prayed for the eternal peace of the departed soul and conveyed deep sympathy to the bereaved family members.

BNP Chairman and Prime Minister Tarique Rahman called upon party leaders and activists to stand by the common people across the country. The Premier made the remarks while addressing party leaders and activists from the balcony of the BNP central office in the city's Nayapaltan area yesterday.

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister and BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhru Islam Alamgir underscored the need for an integrated plan to accelerate development activities of the Local Government Engineering Department (LGED). The Minister said this while addressing a review meeting on ongoing LGED projects in LGED Bhaban at Agargaon in the capital yesterday. The Minister made the remarks while responding to questions from journalists after the training closing parade of the 43rd BCS (Police) batch at the Bangladesh Police Academy in Sardah, Rajshahi yesterday. The Minister said that all amendment processes would be carried out through a consensus-based agreement founded on the 'July National Charter' signed among political parties.

Foreign Minister Dr. Khalilur Rahman said, Bangladesh has embraced multilateralism as a cornerstone of its foreign policy since joining the United Nations, reaffirming its commitment to global peace, security and cooperation. The Minister made the remarks while speaking a reception in New York on Thursday to celebrate the country's 56th Independence and National Day, according to a message received yesterday.

Liberation War Affairs Minister Ahmed Azam Khan said, independence is the nation's greatest achievement in a thousand years, stressing that the spirit of the Liberation War remains the core of Bangladesh's identity. The Minister also said, the fall of autocracy through the 1990 mass uprising and the fall of fascism through the 2024 student-people uprising are significant political achievements. The Minister was addressing a reception titled 'Bir Muktiyoddha Reception 2026,' organized by Dhaka South City Corporation on the occasion of the Great Independence Day and National Day at Nagar Bhaban in the capital yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapan has expressed deep shock and grief at the death of Dilara Hafiz, wife of Speaker of Hafiz Uddin Ahmed, Bir Bikram. In a condolence message yesterday the Minister said, Dilara Hafiz was a dedicated educationist whose contribution to the development of the country's education sector will be remembered forever. The Minister prayed for the eternal peace of the departed soul and conveyed deep sympathy to the bereaved family members.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Sardar Md. Sakhawat Husain called for greater cooperation from physicians to advance the country's medical sector, saying coordinated efforts driven by honesty and dedication are essential to achieve desired goals. The Minister made these remarks while addressing a programme titled 'CME on Medical Ethics', organized by the Society of Surgeons of Bangladesh at the Abu Sayeed International Convention Center in the capital's Shahbagh yesterday. Deputy Speaker Barrister Kayser Kamal vowed to serve impartially to make parliament effective, vibrant and the central forum of Bangladesh's politics. The Deputy Speaker made the remarks during a courtesy visit to former Speaker and Acting President, Muhammad Jamiruddin Sircar, at his Dhanmondi residence in Dhaka yesterday. The Deputy Speaker also wished the former Speaker a long life.

State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Aninda Islam Amit said, the incumbent government is looking for a permanent solution to Bhabadah waterlogging in Jashore. The State Minister made the remarks while speaking at an event organized to inaugurate the re-excavation of Buruli canal in Keshabpur upazila in Jeshore yesterday.

In response to rising global fuel prices triggered by the ongoing crisis in the Middle East, the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) has been deployed across multiple fuel depots in different districts to prevent hoarding, maintain market stability and ensure uninterrupted supply. BGB issued a press release in this regard yesterday.

The Energy and Mineral Resources Division has asked people not to panic and not to buy excess fuel as fuel stock and supply are completely normal in the country. The government is purchasing the necessary fuel from the international market to ensure uninterrupted fuel supply in line with demand. As a result, there is no possibility of a fuel supply shortage in the country, said a press release of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting yesterday.
