Newsbrief

Minister for Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said, there is no such energy crisis in the country but a vested group is creating a energy crisis to take advantage. The Minister also said, the government is trying to resolve the electricity crisis and the farmers are not affected in any way. The Minister said this while distributing cheque of financial assistance and other relief materials among poor and different religious organizations at Mirza Ruhul Amin Municipal Auditorium in Thakurgaon yesterday. The relief was also distributed among the families affected by cyclones and hailstorms from the funds of Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief.

Finance and Planning Minister Amir Khosru Mahmud Chowdhury said, establishing a temple on a university campus reflects the spirit of unity in diversity, adding that tolerance, stability and humanity are vital for national progress. The Minister also highlighted the natural beauty of the CU campus, describing it as serene and distinctive and urged authorities to document its biodiversity and utilize the environment for academic and research advancement. The Minister said this while inaugurating the country's first 'Saraswati Gyan Mondir' and the first central temple on a university campus at Chittagong University yesterday. State Minister for Land and Chittagong Hill Tracts Affairs Barrister Mir Mohammad Helal Uddin addressed the event.

Cultural Affairs Minister Nitai Roy Chowdhury said that the government is planning to supply fertilizers and agricultural inputs at affordable prices to ensure sustainable development in the agricultural sector. The Minister said this while inaugurating a canal re-excavation programme in Boalmari Upazila in Faridpur yesterday as part of a nationwide canal restoration initiative.

Land Minister Mizanur Rahman Minu said, the government is committed to distributing khas land under the Ministry of Land to genuine landless people. The Minister also assured that poor families who have been living in a specific area for 40-45 years will be allotted khas land through the Deputy Commissioner. The Minister made the remarks while speaking to journalists at his residence at Padma Residential Area in Rajshahi yesterday.

Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Minister Abu Zafar Md. Zahid Hossain said, the government is working to ensure that the country's agricultural sector remains unaffected despite global challenge. The Minister also said, the government is working to improve the overall livelihood of farmers. The Minister made the remarks at seeds and fertilizers distribution programme, organized by the local office of Department of Agricultural Extension at Birampur upazila parishad in Dinajpur yesterday. Earlier, at a science fair at the Nabiganj Upazila Parishad auditorium in the same district, the Minister said, criminals have no identity and no one involved in criminal activities should be spared. Drugs must be eradicated through strict enforcement of law and underlined that no one should take the law in their own hands, the Minister added.

Commerce and Industries Minister Khandakar Abdul Muktedir said, the government has adjusted fuel prices cautiously to ensure that the people do not face undue pressure, asserting that the move will not significantly impact overall inflation. The Minister made the remarks while speaking to journalists during visiting Masukganj Market in Sylhet Sadar upazila yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon said, the government has taken an initiative to develop a new framework to ensure a balance between media freedom and journalistic objectivity. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at a programme marking the 35th founding anniversary of The Daily Star in the capital yesterday. The Minister said, the country's media sector is currently facing significant challenges and the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting is actively working to address them. The Minister also expressed hope that all media outlets in the country would move forward through responsible, ethical and objective journalism.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon yesterday expressed profound shock and sorrow at the death of Rizia Khatun, mother of Firoze Ahmed, Political Advisor to the US Embassy in Bangladesh. In a condolence message, the Minister prayed for eternal peace of the departed soul and conveyed deep sympathy to the bereaved family.

Water Resources Minister Md. Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anee said that the upcoming local government elections will be highly challenging in the absence of party symbols. The Minister also stressed the need to ensure that honest, capable and pro-people representatives are elected, adding that vigilance from now on is essential in selecting suitable candidates for public office. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at the prize distribution ceremony of an annual sports competition held on the grounds of Haji Fateh Mohammadia Dakhil Madrasa in Dighli Union under Lakshmipur Sadar Upazila yesterday.

Disaster Management and Relief Minister Asadul Habib Dulu said that the Bangla New Year is a shining symbol of the nation's non-communal secular spirit, heritage and culture. The Minister told these remarks while inaugurating a two-day Baishakhi festival at the field of Shahid Abul Kashem Degree College at Borobari in Lalmonirhat yesterday. The Minister further said that the young generation must be nurtured as the bearers of the nation's traditions and culture and educational institutions can play an important role in this regard.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Md. Asaduzzaman said, the government is determined to remove all the roots of corruption in the judiciary. The Law Minister also said, many are raising questions about the July Charter, the National Human Rights Commission, the independence of the judiciary and the Judiciary Secretariat Act. Each law will be scrutinized and brought to Parliament as a bill, the Minister added. The Law Minister made the remarks while speaking at the inauguration of the newly constructed building of the Jashore District Bar Association in Jashore yesterday. State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Aninda Islam Amit spoke at the meeting.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Md. Asaduzzaman said, the government has taken various programmes to develop the country's south-western region. The State Minister made the remarks while addressing a two-day poetry festival at Tangail Club in Tangail yesterday.
